As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 1—THE NEW PENTECOST**—Synod 16 has definitively set the Church in Detroit on the path of the new evangelization; we are living in our own time the Gospel mysteries of the Great Commission\* and Pentecost<sup>^</sup>. What Scripture reveals about the Holy Spirit's activity in the evangelizing Church is not only a challenge and a guide, it is what the Lord is continuing to do in our midst.

*\*[Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.] Mt 28:19-20]*

*^[You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth.]*

## NEW PROGRAM!

### Spiritual and Practical Tools for Families Impacted by Mental Illness

Presented by Ron and Jilia Teachworth, this four-week program is intended for family members who have a loved one who suffers from mental illness. Each of the four-week sessions is divided into two parts. The first hour addresses how God's grace, our faith, and continued spiritual growth empowers us to deal with the unique stresses families encounter when dealing with an illness that is life-long, has no 'cure' and is highly stigmatized. The second half offers information about community resources and services that are available for those suffering from mental illness, and their families; communication techniques; and legal rights.

This four-session workshop is open to parents, spouses, adult children, teenagers and involved extended family members, as all are uniquely impacted by their loved one's illness.

*Please note, this program is not intended for the person suffering from the illness.*

**Register For CYO Sports**

Registration is open for all eligible parish students that will be in grades 4-8 who are interested in participating in football, cheerleading, volleyball, soccer or cross country this fall. Fourth grade students are only eligible for football, cheer and cross country. To register, visit the Holy Family website [www.holyfam.org](http://www.holyfam.org), click on the 'FALL SPORTS' tab. Registration runs through Friday May 25th. Football practice begins the week of August 6, 2018. All other sports begin practice or assessments August 13, 2018. The fall season runs through the 3rd week in October. To participate in CYO, a student must be part of a registered and active parish family as of August 1, 2018, be enrolled in and maintaining acceptable attendance and participation in religious education at their parish or attend Holy Family Regional School. Physical Forms will need to be printed from the Holy Family website, completed by a doctor and submitted to the Athletic Department by the first practice or assessments.

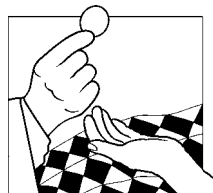
