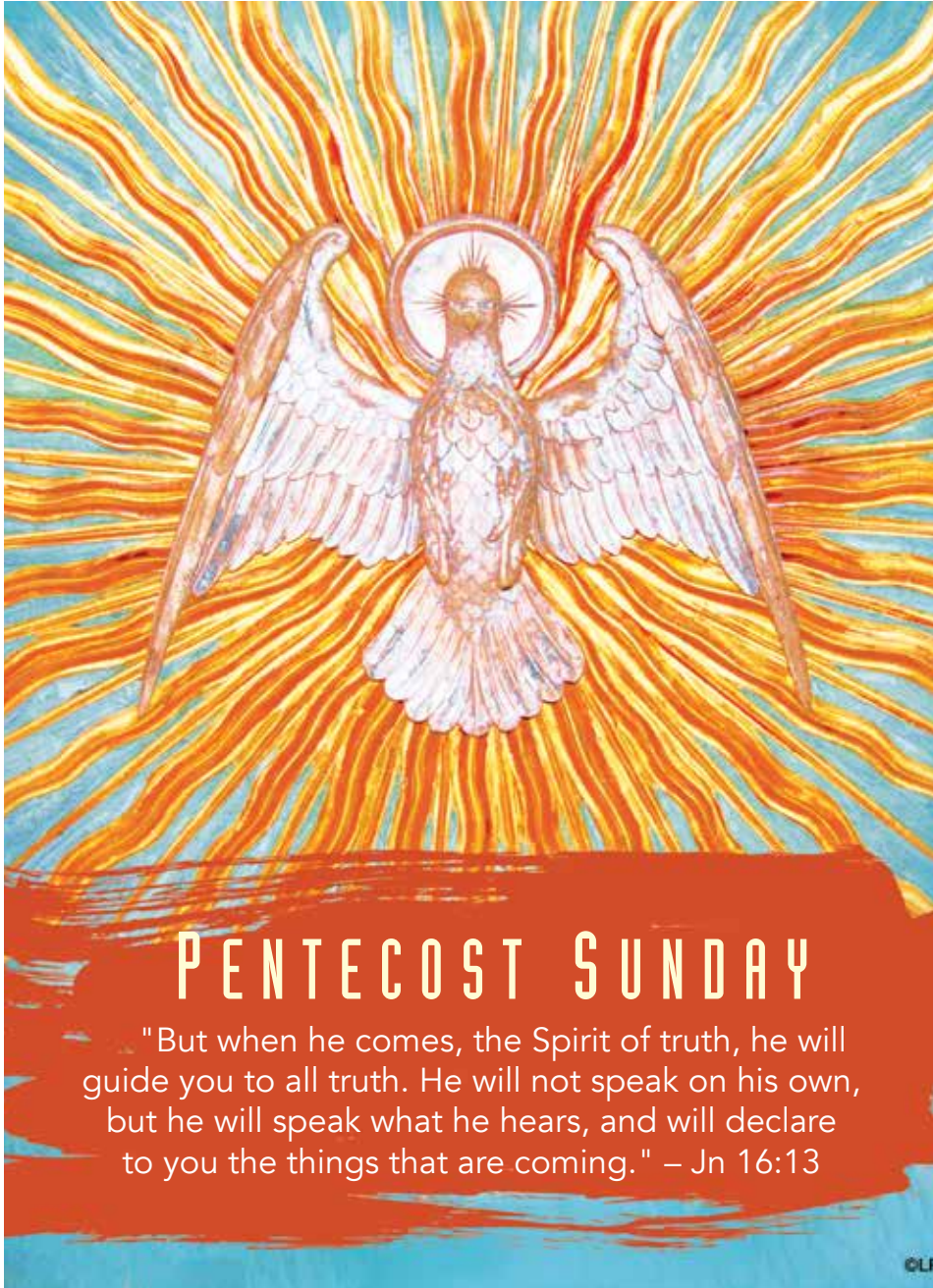

As we celebrate Pentecost and the birthday of the Church, let us remember what Pentecost represents. It is more than just the Holy Spirit coming upon and within the Disciples of Jesus. When they accepted the gifts of the Spirit they converted and baptized over 3000 people in just a single day.

HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how
I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16,
ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 1—THE NEW PENTECOST (cont.) — After giving his disciples the Great Commission, Jesus told them to "stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high" (Lk 24:49). As the first evangelization could not have taken place without the coming of the Spirit at Pentecost, so the new evangelization cannot be accomplished without a new Pentecost. The Holy Spirit is God's love poured into our hearts (cf. Rom 5:5), revealing to us the Lordship of Jesus and our own exalted identity as beloved sons and daughters of God. The Holy Spirit is the "new wine" of divine life (cf. Lk 5:38; Acts 2:13). It is [this same Spirit] who fills Christ's disciples, then and now, with a compelling zeal to go forth and announce the good news of salvation.

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, the "new wine" of divine life, to us at Sacred Heart Church. Clothe us on this New Pentecost with your "power from on high" as you did the disciples at the first Pentecost. Fill us with God's "love poured into our hearts." Reveal to us the "Lordship of Jesus" and show each of us his own "exalted identity as God's beloved son or daughter." Fill us, as on the first Pentecost, with a "compelling zeal" to announce the good news of salvation to our friends and family, and to the whole world, as your joyful missionary disciples. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen

Pray right now for the Holy Spirit to open your mind and your heart to receive and hear what God is calling you to do as part of the new evangelization on this New Pentecost. **Check out the "Ministry Fair" this week, looking at all the opportunities for service to our parish.** Prayerfully consider joining one that the Spirit has gifted you to help. . . . Then DO it.

NEW PROGRAM!

Spiritual and Practical Tools for Families Impacted by Mental Illness

Presented by Ron and Jilia Teachworth, this four-week program is intended for family members who have a loved one who suffers from mental illness. Each of the four-week sessions is divided into two parts. The first hour addresses how God's grace, our faith, and continued spiritual growth empowers us to deal with the unique stresses families encounter when dealing with an illness that is life-long, has no 'cure' and is highly stigmatized. The second half offers information about community resources and services that are available for those suffering from mental illness, and their families; communication techniques; and legal rights.

This four-session workshop is open to parents, spouses, adult children, teenagers and involved extended family members, as all are uniquely impacted by their loved one's illness.

Please note, this program is not intended for the person suffering from the illness.

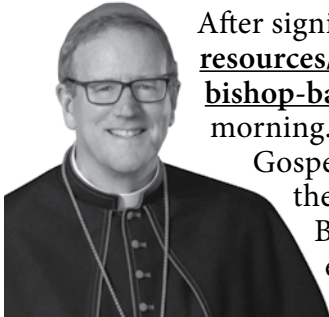

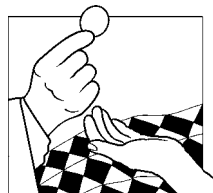
