HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how
I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16,
ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST, Marker 1.2—
REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL:** Just as
when Jesus himself began the work of evangelization, so
today the good news involves both a call to repent and a
call to believe: "This is the time of fulfillment. The king-
dom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel"
(Mk 1:14-15). To **repent** means to "change one's mind"—
to make a life-altering decision to turn away from sin and
toward God. There is no true offer of the good news that
does not also call for repentance. And calling people to
repentance requires that we speak of sin and its conse-
quences, including the ultimate consequence of eternal
separation from God. . . . To speak of repentance is not
fashionable today in a world that prefers to ignore sin, yet
we who belong to Christ can testify that repentance is the
way to forgiveness and freedom. It is the key that unlocks
the mercy of God! The call to repentance is always ad-
dressed to ourselves first, since all of us are continually in
need of deeper conversion. **UNLEASH THE GOSPEL**, pg 19

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll
remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church, and lead us
into true repentance that is "a life-altering decision to turn
away from sin and toward God." Give each of us courage
and strength to address ourselves first, asking for a "deeper
conversion" before speaking of sin and its consequences to
anyone else. Give us the graces of wisdom and understand-
ing that this repentance is truly "the way to forgiveness and
freedom," and is "the key that unlocks the mercy of God!"
Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle
in them the fire of your love. Amen*

ACT: "What is the Holy Spirit saying to *you*" in this letter?
One of the greatest gifts of the Catholic Church is the Sac-
rament of Reconciliation, yet many avoid it except when
it is "required" during Lent. How could understanding it
as "the key that unlocks the mercy of God" change your
attitude toward this sacrament? Pray to receive this un-
derstanding and consider receiving the sacrament soon.
Does this lead you to "act" differently in the service of the
Church? It's not too late to prayerfully consider the oppor-
tunities presented at the "Ministry Fair" a few weeks ago.

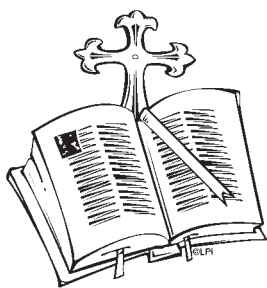

GOSPEL MEDITATION – ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

June 10, 2018
10th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Have you ever felt judged by your family? St. John Paul II noted that the family "is the cradle of life and love" (*On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful*, 40). Yet unmet expectations and divergent priorities can cause tension in even the most loving family situations. This is true for us, and it was true for Jesus!

In today's Gospel, Jesus has returned home to Nazareth. A large crowd gathered, and Jesus finds himself facing stiff opposition from his family. This was likely Jesus' large, extended family. The Semitic language has no specific words for extended relatives, so everyone is "brother" or "sister." The entire clan has gotten wind of Jesus' preaching, and they are not amused. *"They set out to seize him, for they said, 'He is out of his mind.'"* To make matters worse, the religious authorities even accuse Jesus of being possessed by a demon. It's a mess by any standards.

The family's perspective is perhaps understandable. In Jewish culture, teachers and scribes underwent intensive schooling and apprenticeships, none of which Jesus had done. The family knew Jesus the carpenter, not Jesus the rabbi. For them, Jesus' bold preaching threatened the reputation of their family!

Jesus' words to his family can seem controversial. *"Who are my mother and my brothers?"* Yet Jesus knows what he is about. He has always known he would be about the business of his Heavenly Father. And what is that business? It is the business of the new covenant and the Kingdom of God. In this Kingdom, we are all adopted sons and daughters of the King. Jesus begins, even now, to expand the perspective of his listeners. Being welcomed into this family does not depend on our families of birth or ethnic origin, but a wholehearted commitment to "do the will of God."

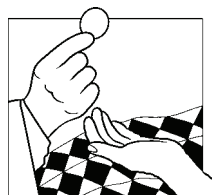

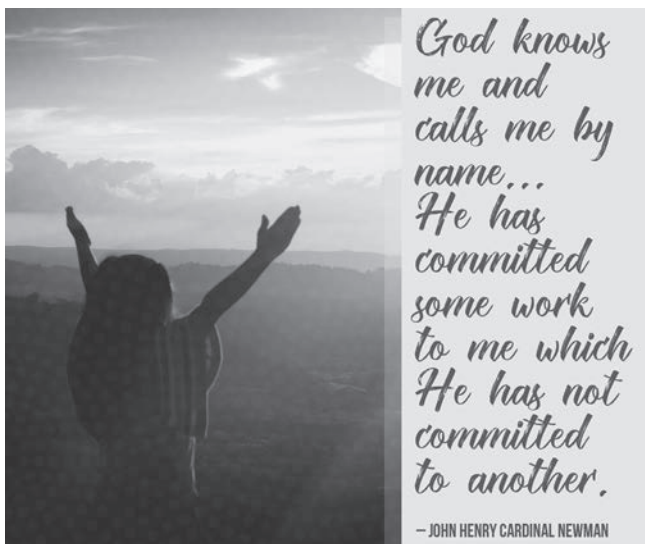
