## HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST, Marker 1.3—SIGNS & WONDERS:** Jesus proclaimed the Gospel not only in words but in healings, miracles, signs and wonders that visibly demonstrated the message: in Him the kingdom of God had truly become present (Lk 9:1-2; 11; Acts 2:22). When he commissioned his disciples to continue his mission, he commanded them to preach the Gospel both in words and in deeds of power (Lk 9:1-2; 10:8-9; Jn 14:12)... Often it was these signs that moved the hearers to believe the Gospel. So today we look for the proclamation of the good news to be accompanied by signs and wonders that visibly demonstrate God's love and convince people that Jesus Christ is truly alive... Signs, small and great, are a normal part of the Christian life. Our focus is not on the signs themselves, but on the risen Lord Jesus to whom they point. "By the power at work within us [he] is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or imagine" (Eph 3:20). **UNLEASH THE GOSPEL**, pg 20

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church, and open our eyes and ears to see and hear the "signs and wonders" you provide to move us to faith. Help us to recognize them, small and great, in our everyday Christian lives. Then open our hearts and minds to see these as "visible demonstrations of God's love for us," all pointing to "the risen Lord Jesus." Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** Can you recall a "healing, miracle, sign or wonder" that happened in your life—small or great? Maybe all the traffic lights turned green for you when you were late. How about the day you were feeling overwhelmed by life and your child brought you a dandelion bouquet? Remember when you were feeling sad, or angry, or frustrated—then you saw a beautiful sunset? Watch for them this week. Write them down on a "Signs of God's love" list. Be sure to thank God for them.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION – ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 15, 2018 | 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two."

This Sunday we read the first sending of the Apostles to preach, teach, and heal. For many of us, it can be easy to think we "just don't have enough" to be disciples and evangelists ourselves. We don't have enough education and training. We don't have enough experience talking to people about Jesus. We don't pray enough. We don't have enough faith.

If you look at the Apostles in today's Gospel reading, they didn't have much either. "No food, no sack, no money in their belts." They didn't plan out their itinerary or book their lodging in advance. From what we know of the Apostles, they were not the religiously trained and educated ones. They were fisherman, tax collectors, and political activists. But what does being a fisherman require? Someone like Peter needed a strong work ethic to rise at strange hours. He needed patient calm to wait for the catch. Once ashore, he needed a savvy mind to fetch a good price for his labors.

As Peter became a fisher of men, he would need diligence to persevere through the hard journeys, long days, and persecution that awaited him. He would need patient calm with those who disagreed with him. As the leader of the Apostles, he would need a savvy mind to navigate challenges facing the early Church. From one perspective, Peter has nothing to offer the mission of Jesus. Thinking more creatively, one can see that -- joined with faith and love -- perhaps Peter had everything he needed.

Jesus sends you as well. As you take stock of your own talents, consider how they might be offered as a gift to others. Maybe you already have more than enough.


