HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how
I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16,
ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 2 —
WITH EYES FIXED ON JESUS; Marker 2.1:**
"Encounter With Jesus: Evangelizing aims to lead
others to life-changing encounters with Jesus, with
the result that he becomes the Lord of one's life. An
encounter is a person-centered form of contempla-
tion; it is two people being present to each other with
no utilitarian purpose. For some people the encoun-
ter with Christ is a cataclysmic "Damascus road" kind
of experience; for others it is more gradual. In either
case, encountering Jesus is like meeting the person
you are going to marry: you are overwhelmed by this
encounter and cannot imagine going forward in life
without that person. The Christian life becomes not
just one but a series of encounters with Jesus, espe-
cially through prayer and the liturgy, which continu-
ally deepens our relationship with him.

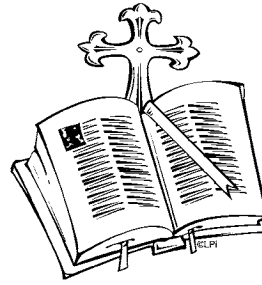

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll
remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church. Lead
us all into a "life-changing encounter with Jesus" such
that he becomes the "Lord of one's life." Whether it is
cataclysmic or gradual, bring each of us to the place
where we "cannot imagine going forward in life with-
out Jesus." Open our minds and hearts to encounter
him particularly in prayer and the liturgy so that we
will grow continually deeper in our relationship with
him. Prepare us to lead others to this life-changing en-
counter with Jesus too. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts
of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.
Amen*

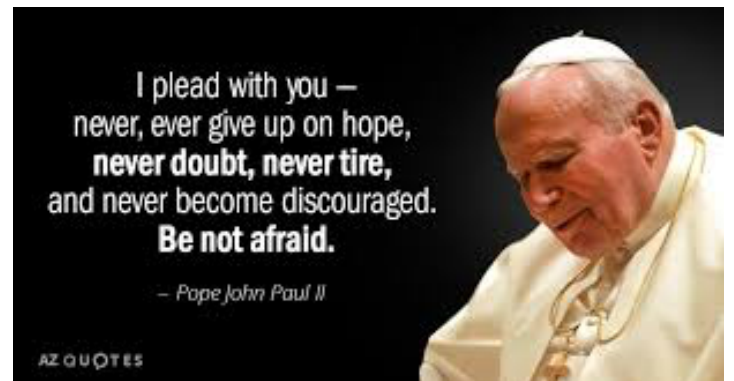
ACT: Have you had a life-changing encounter with
Christ? If not, ask God now to provide one. Watch
for it. If you have, was it "cataclysmic" like Paul's or
more gradual? What should your life look like if Jesus
is Lord of it? Pick one area where Jesus could be more
of a Lord of your life, and entrust it to him now. (e.g.
time; entertainment; food/drink; speech; electronic
use; relationships, etc.). Practice.

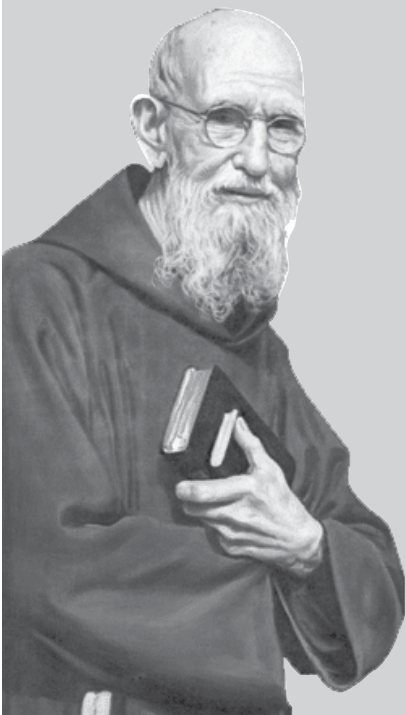

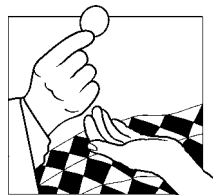
