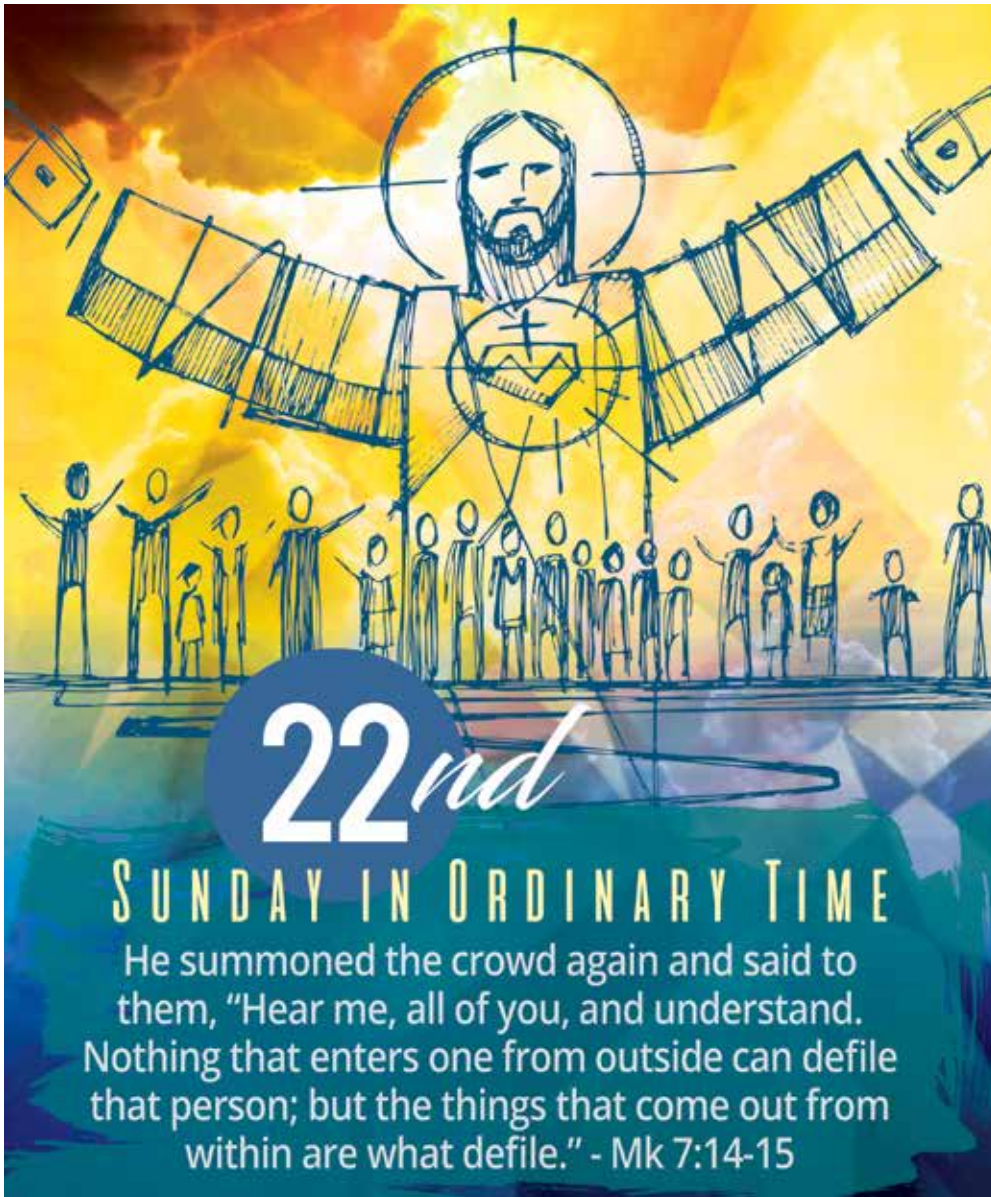

## HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

### LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 2 — WITH EYES FIXED ON JESUS; Marker 2.2:

The Kerygma (cont): The kerygma is often described in terms of four essential elements: (1) the loving plan of God for human beings; (2) sin and its devastating consequences, especially separation from God; (3) God's answer to our predicament in the sending of his Son for our salvation; and (4) the response this gift calls for from every person: to repent of our sins, believe in Jesus and be baptized, so we can be filled with his Holy Spirit and live a new life in his family, the Church. **UNLEASH THE GOSPEL**, pg 21

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church. Open our minds and hearts to first hear, then receive the kerygma, and to understand it; then to respond to it: "repent of our sins and believe in Jesus." Bring those who have not been baptized to seek it from the Church, and those who were baptized in the past to look for the action of the Holy Spirit they received then to be manifest in new ways now among "his family, the Church." We give thanks to our loving God for providing an "answer to our predicament," our separation from God by sin, in the sending of his Son for our salvation. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** What is the Holy Spirit saying to you in this letter? Have you heard the "kerygma" before, even if it wasn't called that? Consider it now in its four parts: God's great love for you in the way he created you and knows you; how you've turned from Him and are separated from him by sin; how God is faithful even when you are not, pursuing you, wooing you like a lover, seeking you, thirsting for you, calling you to return to him, and finally sending his son to pay the ultimate price with his life to save yours. Now the 4th step is up to you.

## REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE

To inform the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding the sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel and/or to speak to the Victim Assistance Coordinator contact: **(866) 343-8055**. A caller will be requested to provide his or her name and telephone number. All calls regarding complaints of sexual abuse will be returned in a timely manner. This toll-free number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with such complaints are also encouraged to directly contact law enforcement authorities.



Nightfever are beautiful events that take place around the Archdiocese of Detroit at a church located next to foot traffic during local festivals. During these events, the church is open and people are invited to come in to light a candle and say a prayer. The atmo-

sphere in the church is one of beautiful music, prayer, and candlelight, and the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. Priests are available for conversation and confession. Jesus pours out his graces during these events as there are people coming who might have been away from church for a long time, or never have been at all. Stop by one of these Nightfever events. You're also welcome to use your gifts to bring others to meet Jesus. During the event volunteers will either praying the church for everyone passing through, or they welcome people at the doors, or they can go out in pairs inviting people passing by to come in to light a candle. 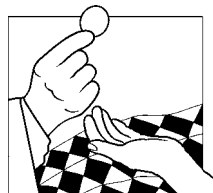
