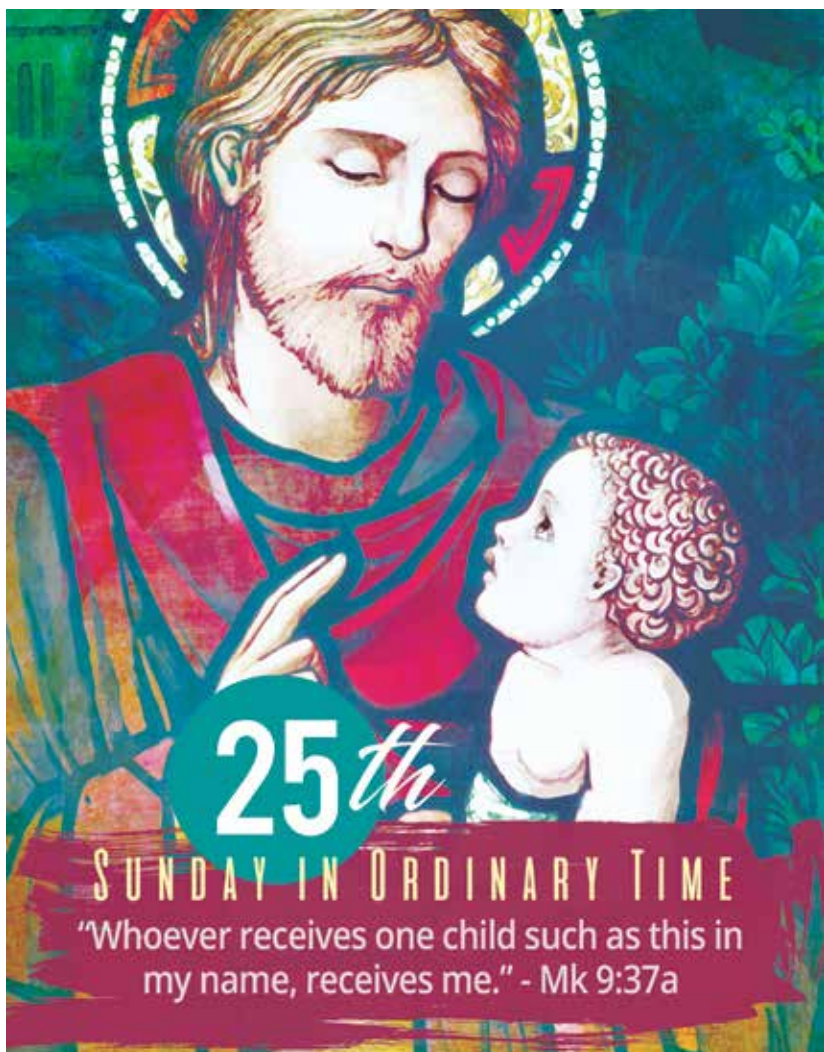

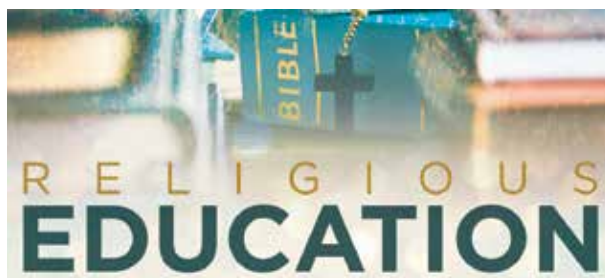

HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 3 — THE WORD MADE FLESH: By the Holy Spirit's descent upon the Blessed Virgin Mary, the eternal Word has taken on flesh: the invisible God is now able to be seen with our eyes, heard with our ears, even touched with our hands (cf. 1 Jn 1:1). So in this age of the new covenant the Creator communicates himself to us through the created means he himself has chosen. In our efforts to unleash the Gospel, we proceed with the firm conviction that the Holy Spirit brings about life-changing encounters with the Lord Jesus in his Mystical Body the Church, particularly in fellowship with one another, in Sacred Scripture, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and most especially in the Holy Eucharist.

Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church. Lead us into the wonder of your incarnation—that You, the God of the Universe, would descend to us and become like us so that we may come to know you better and more intimately. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen

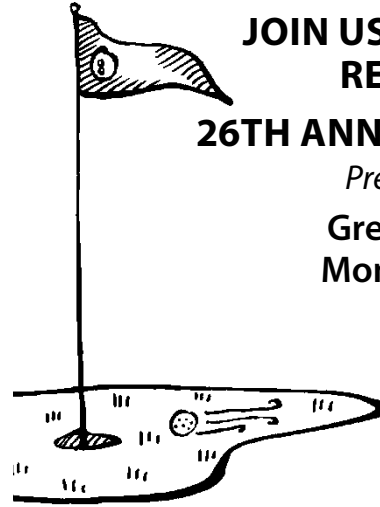

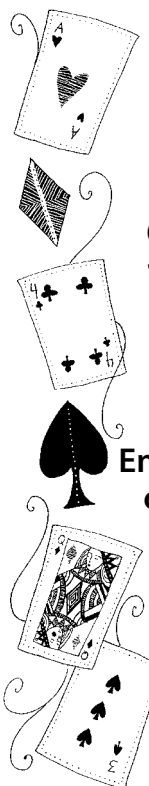
DADDY TAUGHT ME

The following is an excerpt from Father Peter Girard from the Magnificat about his niece. 'I can clearly recall the winter afternoon when my then six-year-old niece told me how she loved to pray the rosary. When I asked her why she loved this prayer, she answered: "Daddy taught me how to pray it." Here out of mouth of babes came the truth of how Christian families are meant to be the "domestic church," a spiritual edifice "being built into a dwelling place of God in the spirit." For my niece did not love the rosary because of the wooden beads that I had given her, but rather it was the experience of having her father teach her how to be close to Jesus and Mary.'

Fathers, Grandfathers, how are we doing sharing the great gift of faith and

love of the Lord in our families, our domestic churches? Are we building up our family by sharing the Good News with each other and then by living a family life characterized by warmth, mutual respect and affection, honor, forgiveness and peace. Can others recognize a difference in your family by the way we live, pray, share, love and forgive each other? Can we say as the prophet Joshua says "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord?"

As men we need help in this journey. On Saturday mornings between 7:30 and 8:30 am in the multipurpose room we meet to share the readings for the upcoming Sunday. We reflect on these readings on what they are changing and challenging our lives. 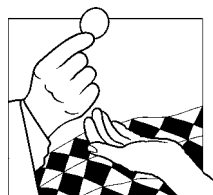
