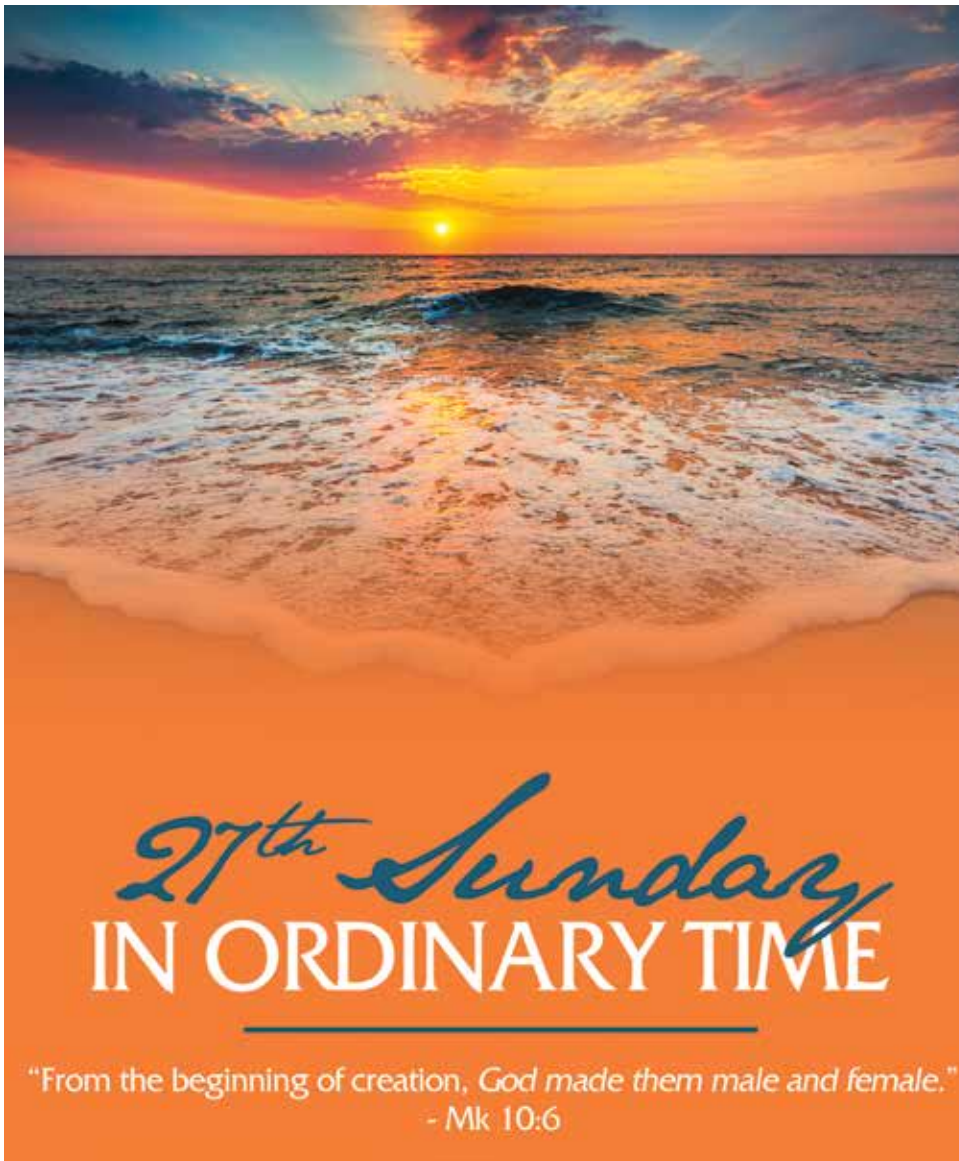

HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how
I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 3 —
THE WORD MADE FLESH; MARKER 3.1: The Communion of the Church (cont): As St. Augustine taught, when we say "amen" before receiving Holy Communion, we are saying "amen" not only to Christ the head, but to all the members of his body. So profound is this communion that it endures beyond death: we have fellowship not only with the members of the Church on earth but with saints in heaven, who are cheering us on and helping us draw closer to Christ (cf. Heb 12:1).

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church. With St. Augustine, we pray that our "Amen" is a confident affirmation of our belief and unity with "not only Christ the head," but also to all the "members of his body," not only those with whom we worship which we can see, but also the saints in heaven. Open our ears and hearts to hear them "cheering us on and drawing us closer to Christ." Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen

ACT: What is this letter saying to you? Pay attention the next time you go to Mass to how many times we say or sing "Amen." 5 times? 10? 20? Does it come out of our mouths automatically or is it heartfelt? Each time, we are saying "yes, I agree" with what came just before. Consider what you are affirming with each "Amen." Then listen in your mind for those around you and all the saints in heaven saying "Amen" with you. Does this change how you will respond from now on with an "Amen?"

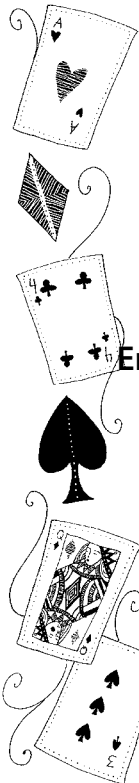

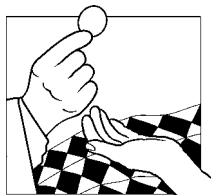
