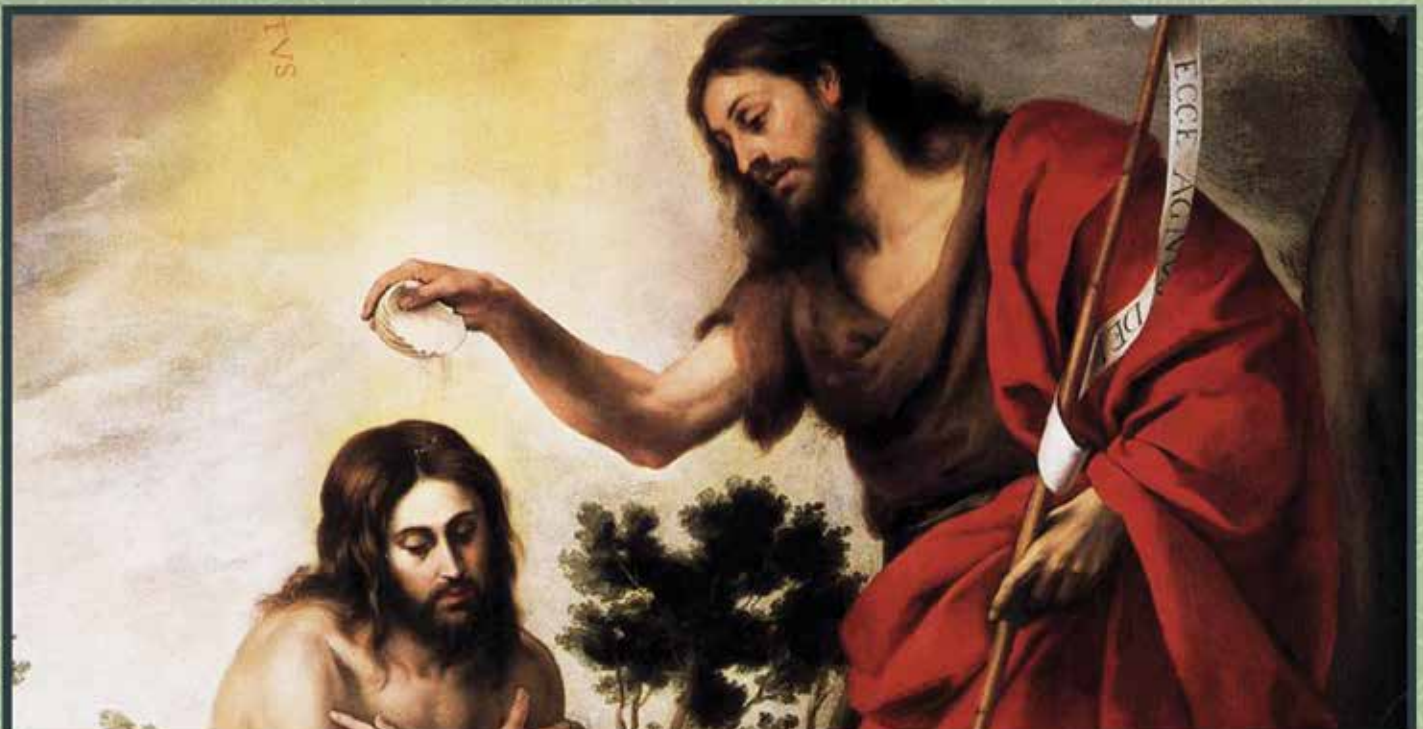

THE BAPTISM *of the Lord*

"I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." - Lk 3:16bc



HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 3—THE WORD MADE FLESH; Marker 3.4: The Holy Eucharist (cont): Parishes must also focus sustained attention on the quality of the Sunday liturgy experience, especially from the perspective of newcomers and newly returning Catholics. Do people who show up for Mass enter into a friendly, hospitable environment where mutual love is evident? Does the music help them to lift up their minds and hearts in worship of God? Does the preaching break open the word of God and help them apply it to their lives? Is there an atmosphere of faith in which people's attention is truly focused on the Lord? These qualities are not the responsibility of the pastor alone, but of the entire congregation. If improvement is needed, let us strive for it with patience and perseverance.

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church—pour out your power upon us to focus "sustained attention on the quality of the Sunday liturgy experience." Open our hearts and minds to especially consider this from the perspective of newcomers and returning Catholics: make our parish "friendly and welcoming, and loving"; open our lips and voices to worshipfully participate in the music and liturgy, "lifting our hearts and minds"; guide our attention during Mass to be "truly focused on the Lord". Give us "patience and perseverance" as we strive to improve in these areas. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen

ACT: What is this letter saying to you? Rate yourself on a scale of 1-5 on the above points—friendly and welcoming to new and unfamiliar faces; worshipful participation in the music and liturgical responses; focus during the Mass on our Lord. Where could you improve? Pick one area and start today. . . then next Mass. . . then the next one. Add the above prayer to your daily prayers (you do pray every day, don't you?). Patience. . . Perseverance!
