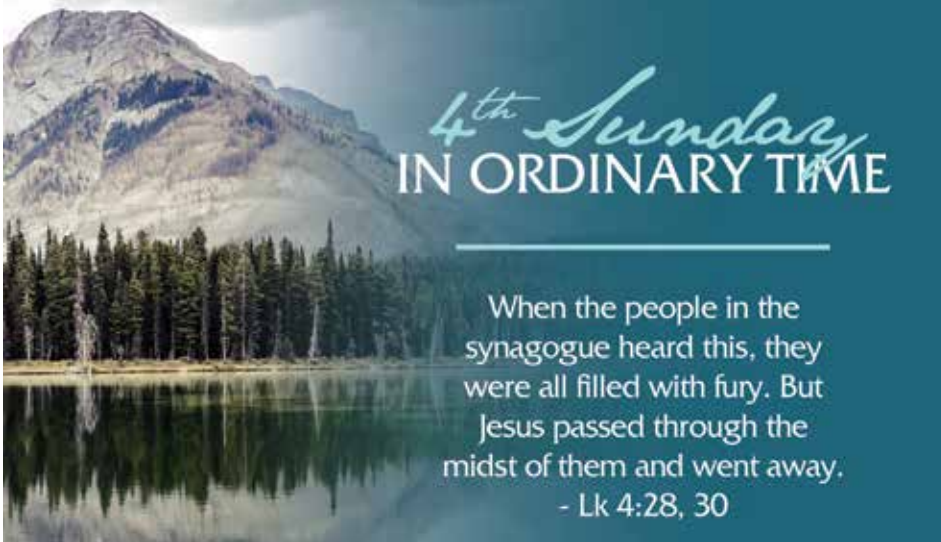

## HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 4—EQUIPPING FOR THE SERVICE OF THE GOSPEL;**

**Marker 4.1 Evangelizing the Evangelizers (cont)**— There is a tendency to think "once converted, always converted." But in fact we are all in constant need of evangelization, because we are in need of deeper conversion. Being a disciple of Christ is never static; it is always dynamic, always a process of growth and of "following him on the way" (Mk 10:52). All members of the local Church should examine themselves to ensure that they have not stalled in their discipleship and thus become unable to give credible witness to the power of the Gospel. The Lord always has more for us than what we have yet received. Every one of us is called to, and capable of, sainthood.

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church and lead us into "deeper conversion." Open our spiritual eyes to see our "constant need of evangelization," and to examine ourselves to discern if we have "stalled in our discipleship." Make of us "credible witnesses to the power of the Gospel." Teach us to expect more from You than we have already received! Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** What is this letter saying to you? Consider if you have "stalled" in your discipleship, in your following Christ. Have you grown closer to Him this last year? Last month? Remember that list of signs Archbishop Vigneron gave last week: receive Sacraments regularly; engaging in daily prayer and Scripture reading; learning about and living your faith; regular service to others. What could you do to grow closer to Him now?
