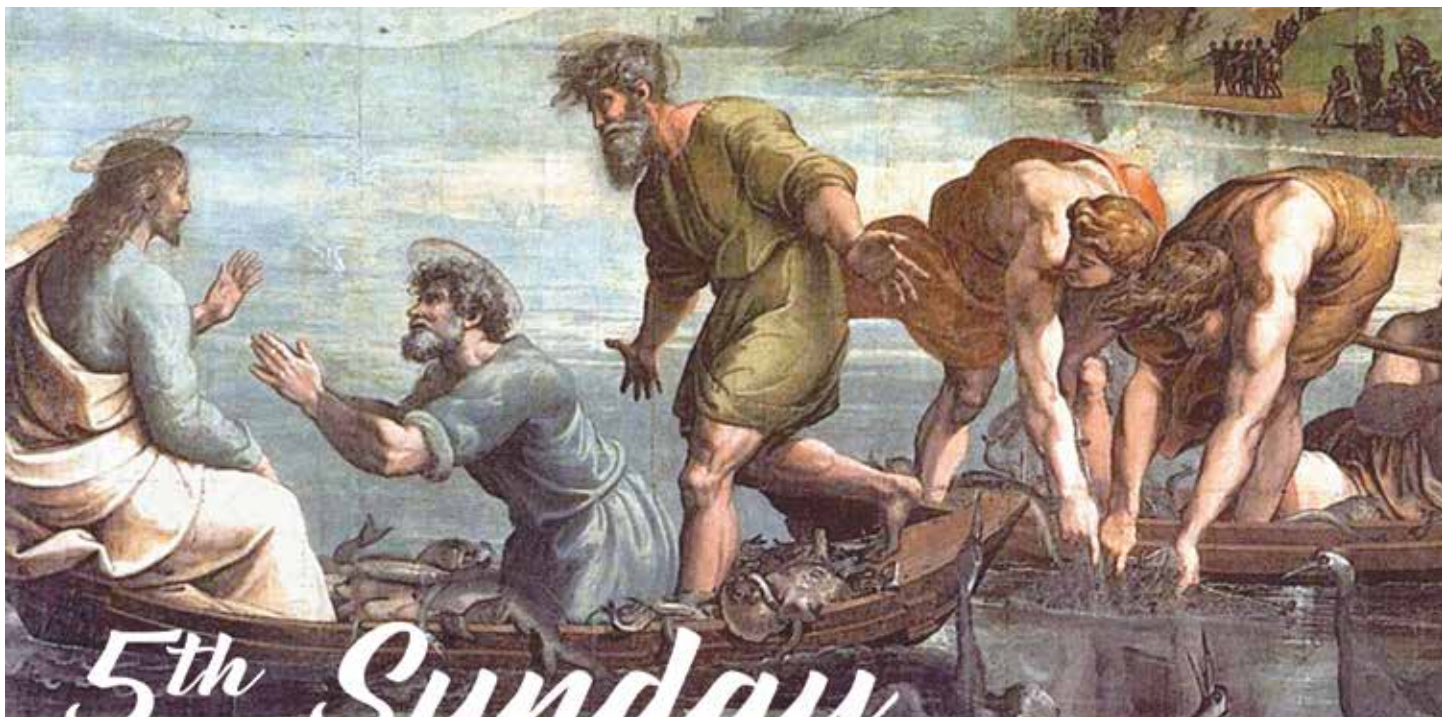

# HEARTS ON FIRE

## at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop’s letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, “What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?”

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 4—EQUIPPING FOR THE SERVICE OF THE GOSPEL; Marker 4.2 Equipping the Evangelizers —**

Since evangelizing does not come naturally for most people, being effective evangelizers also usually requires the development of some practical skills. A parish that is a community of missionary disciples is one that provides regular opportunities for parishioners to learn and practice skills such as the following:  
1. Discernment of the “seeds of the Word”—recognition of grace at work...2. Ability to explain the kerygma, the core message of the Gospel (see Marker 2.2)...3. Ability to offer personal testimony...4. Basic apologetics on common topics...5. Growth in virtue... [These skills will be considered in future bulletins].

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL, pg 31

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church and lead us to provide opportunities for our parishioners to become equipped with the practical skills needed for the service of the Gospel. Teach us discernment of grace, and how to explain the kerygma and our personal testimonies; and to answer common questions about our faith. Draw us each into growth in virtue so we will be credible witnesses for You. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** What is this letter saying to you? Consider what our parish would look like if we all learned those practical skills mentioned above in order to take the Gospel message to all we touch in our day-to-day lives. What is your reaction to this imperative from the Holy Spirit? Fear? Excitement? Resistance? Paralysis? Eagerness? Whatever it is, PRAY for the Holy Spirit to guide you into what-ever He wants from you for His service, and for the parish to provide you the opportunities that will equip you for that.

The new AOD policy does not allow a check written to Sacred Heart to be cashed and given to St. Vincent DePaul. Thank you for your understanding in this new policy.

This ministry is organized so you only have to participate ONCE a month, everything is provided for you (no prep work) and you always are teamed with a partner (when at full volunteering capacity). 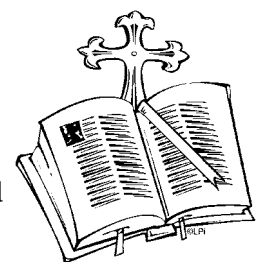
