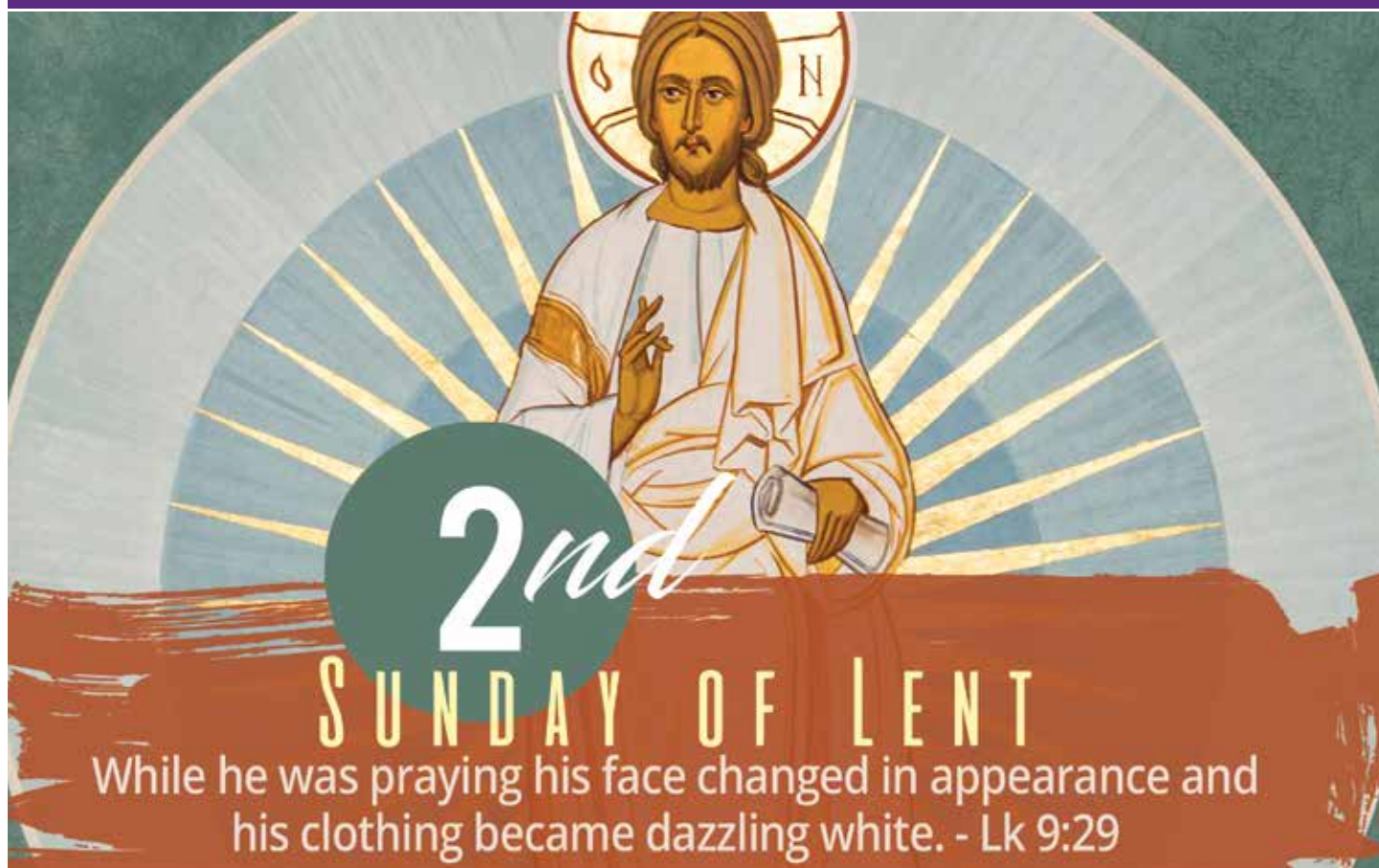

HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

As you read the Archbishop’s letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, “What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?”

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 4—EQUIPPING FOR THE SERVICE OF THE GOSPEL; Marker 4.3 Charisms—[Christ has endowed his bride with an abundance of supernatural charisms, gifts of the Holy spirit that equip every member of the body of Christ to bear witness.] As Vatican Council II stated: The Holy Spirit Who sanctifies the people of God through ministry and the sacraments gives the faithful special gifts also (cf.1 Cor. 12:7), “allotting them to everyone according as He wills” (1 Cor. 12:11) in order that individuals administering grace to others just as they have received it, may also be “good stewards of the manifold grace of God” (1 Peter 4:10), to build up the whole body of charity (cf. Eph. 4:16). From the acceptance of these charisms, including those which are more elementary, there arise for each believer the right and duty to use them in the Church and in the world for the good of men and the building up of the Church, in the freedom of the Holy spirit who “breathes where He wills” (John 3:8).

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, to us at Sacred Heart Church. Give us peace and courage in knowing that it is not up to us alone to “Unleash the Gospel,” but it is the work of the Holy Spirit “Who gives the faithful special gifts with which to build up the whole body of charity.” Make us good stewards of this “manifold grace of God” as we administer freely this grace to others, just as we have received it freely. En-lighten in each of us a recognition of the right and duty of each of us to use these charisms as the Holy Spirit “breathes where He wills.” Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen

ACT: What is this letter saying to you? Were you aware that you have been given charisms by the Holy Spirit—not just priests or saints, and that you have a “right and duty to use them in the Church”? What are your spiritual gifts? Are you being a good steward of the “manifold grace of God” given freely to you? How are you using your gifts to build up the body of Christ? Lent is a perfect time to consider how, when, and to whom you will apply your charisms. Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal them to you. Then commit to take a step toward using them.

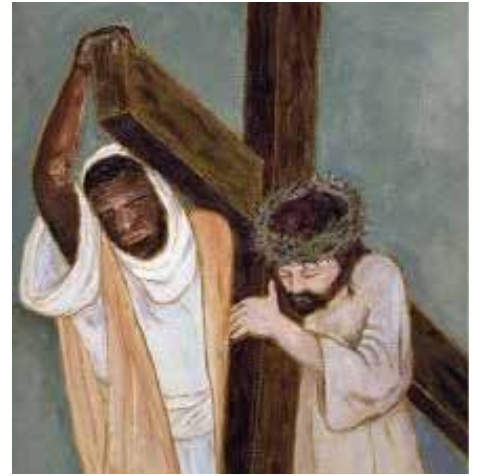

We know when two or more our present, Jesus is with us. So let us bring our needs to the Lord and make this a blessed Lent

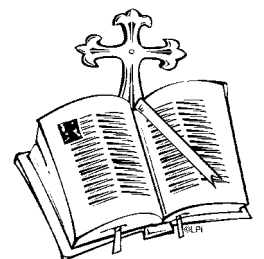
LIVE THE LITURGY
