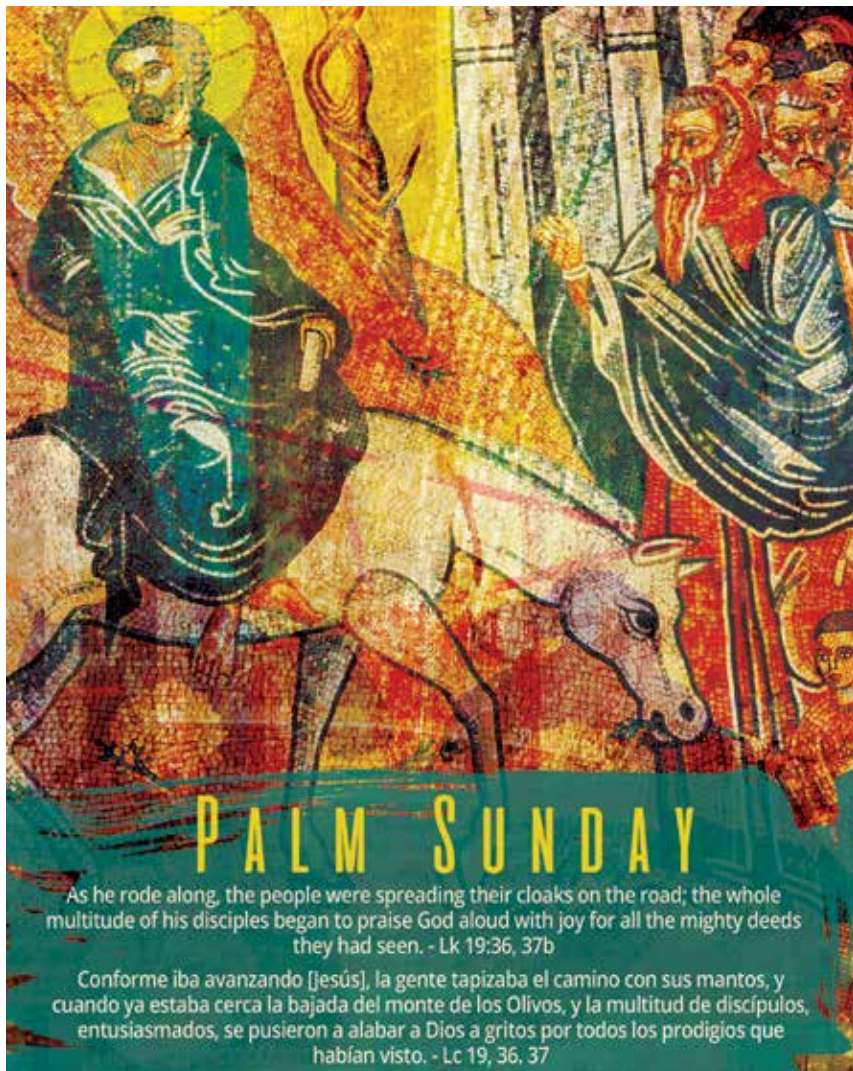

# HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 5 - NO BYSTANDERS: Marker 5.1: The Laity**— The special calling and privilege of the lay faithful is to bring Christ into the secular world. "Since the laity, in accordance with their state of life, live in the midst of the world and its concerns, they are called by God to exercise their apostolate in the world like leaven, with the ardor of the spirit of Christ." Their role is to transform every aspect of the culture through the Gospel—family life, education, government, business, the media, entertainment, sports, science, the arts. They do so both by "engaging in temporal affairs and ordering them according to the plan of God" and by "revealing Christ by word to those around them.

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to the lay faithful at Sacred Heart Church. Give us strength and courage to "bring Christ into the secular world." Lead us into transforming through the Gospel every aspect of our particular sphere of influence in our culture. Reveal to us how to engage and order these temporal affairs "according to the plan of God" and to "reveal Christ by word" to those around us. "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** What is this letter saying to you? Do you hear God's "special calling" to YOU? Consider what are your primary spheres of influence in your life—family, work, sports, etc. How might you "engage" them and "order" them to the plan of God? Try using "Jesus" or "God" in a conversation this week.
