HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 5 - NO BYSTANDERS: Marker 5.2: Priests & Deacons (cont)—"The priest is first of all a minister of the word of God. He is consecrated and sent forth to proclaim the good news of the kingdom to all, calling every person to the obedience of faith..." Although a priest's highest role is the celebration of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, it is preaching the Gospel that draws people to Christ in the first place and enables them to receive the full saving benefit of the sacraments. Priests and deacons need to be bold in proclaiming all the elements of the Gospel, not only those parts that people want to hear. Preachers need ongoing formation in how to do so with compassion, conviction and clarity.

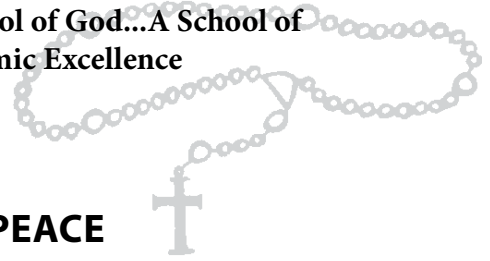

Our parish will, once again, have the opportunity to address hunger issues in our country and beyond.

The annual BREAD for the WORLD Offering of Letters will take place **Saturday, May 25 and Sunday, May 26** before and after all the masses in the gathering area.

One in four children in the world suffers from stunting caused by severe malnutrition. Bread for the World's 2019 Offering of Letters is urging Congress to pass legislation and increase funding for global nutrition. One in six children in the United States lives in a family that struggles to put food on the table.

In 2019 BFW will continue to seek funding and improvements in our nation's child nutrition programs, including making school breakfasts and summer meals available to more children.

For the third year in a row, global hunger has INCREASED, according to a United Nations report. Getting Congress to pass a resolution to make maternal and child nutrition a priority, and then boosting funding for programs that have been proven effective are long-term solutions to this crisis of hunger.

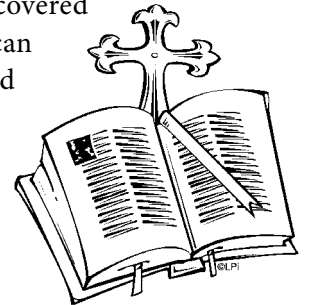

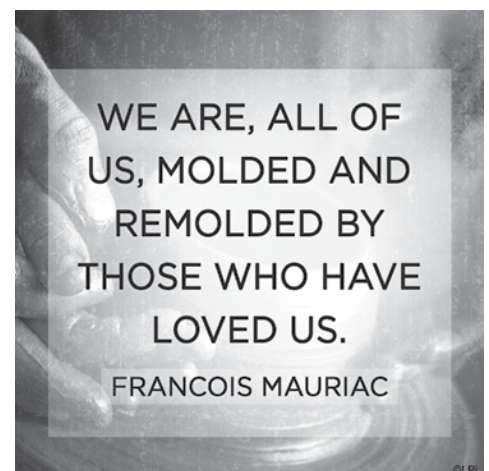
