

HAVE FAITH. END HUNGER.

Next weekend, our parish will, once again, have the opportunity to address hunger issues in our country and beyond.

The annual BREAD for the WORLD Offering of Letters will take place **Saturday, May 25 and Sunday, May 26** before and after all the masses in the gathering area.

One in four children in the world suffers from stunting caused by severe malnutrition. Bread for the World's 2019 Offering of Letters is urging Congress to pass legislation and increase funding for global nutrition. One in six children in the United States lives in a family that struggles to put food on the table.

In 2019 BFW will continue to seek funding and improvements in our nation's child nutrition programs, including making school breakfasts and summer meals available to more children.

For the third year in a row, global hunger has INCREASED, according to a United Nations report. Getting Congress to pass a resolution to make maternal and child nutrition a priority, and then boosting funding for programs that have been proven effective are long-term solutions to this crisis of hunger.

Please take a few minutes of your time, next week, before or after Mass to sign THREE letters – one each to our two U.S. Senators and U. S. Representative.

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week*



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"I give you a new commandment: love one another." With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you'd think we'd have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake "love" for mere "common decency." Perhaps we've been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn't leave us without a guide.

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus "emptied Himself." In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the Godhead. Not only does he become human, but he takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of his life in relative poverty - especially by our standards - as a common laborer. When he began gaining popularity as a preacher, he still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people's homes or outdoors.

Jesus' love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in his disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. *"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."*

This past year, our Religious Education program successfully shared the Good News of the Gospel to about 45 of our children. This upcoming year we losing several of our teachers. We need your help to continue the Religious Education Program at Sacred Heart Parish. We need people to share their faith as catechist for our youth. Don't worry about if you can do this. The Holy Spirit will provide you with the grace to spread his Good News. Remember, Jesus and the Holy Spirit used fisherman to spread his Gospel to the whole world. He certainly can use you and me to do the same.

Religious Education is on Monday evening from 6:00 to 7:30pm from the end of September through April. We provide the teachers books, and online training if desired from Franciscan University. The Archdiocese also has provided us a new curriculum that focuses on Unleashing the Gospel so that the children learn about Jesus and hopefully develop a relationship with our Lord and Savior. The Archdiocese curriculum is adaptable and has several great ideas of bringing the Scriptures to life for the children. We have a lot of tools and ideas, but we just need some people to share their faith. We do teach in pairs (like Jesus sent the Apostles in pairs) which allows one teacher to teach and the other to assist.
