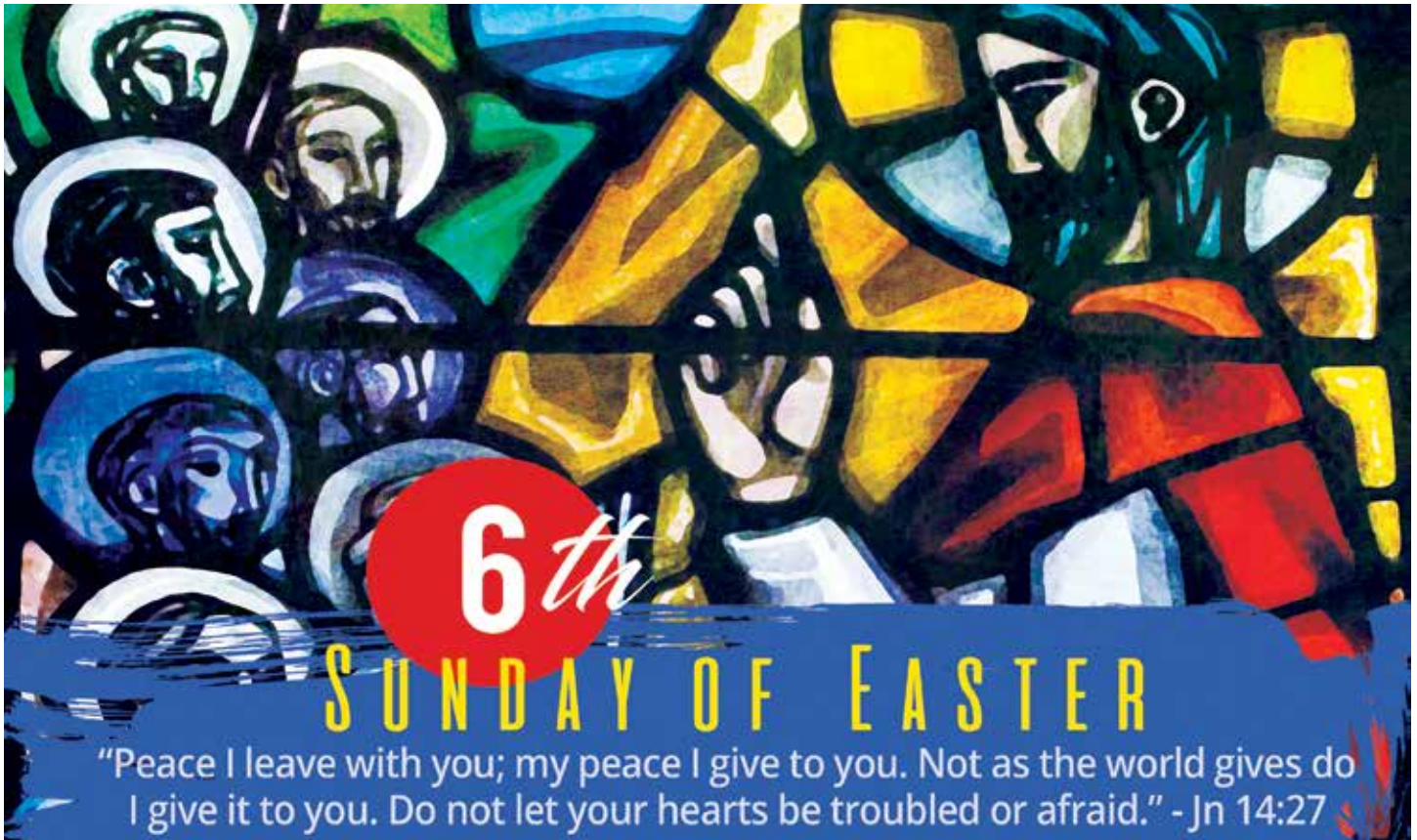

## HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 5 - NO BYSTANDERS: Marker 5.3: Consecrated Life and Movements (cont)**—Consecrated men and women bear witness by their lives to the priceless treasure of Christ—"the pearl of great price" that is worth selling everything to attain (Mt 13:46). Their lives of prayer, service and self-sacrifice cause the fragrance of Christ to fill the atmosphere, so that others are drawn to Him (cf. Jn 12:3; 2 Cor 2:14-15). Those in contemplative life are particularly in-dispensable to our local Church. If our mission is fruitful, it is largely because of their hidden prayers and sacrifices. Those in active apostolates make the good news of Christ visible and tangible to those they serve. I entreat all those in consecrated life to pray fervently and frequently for the success of our efforts to unleash the Gospel.

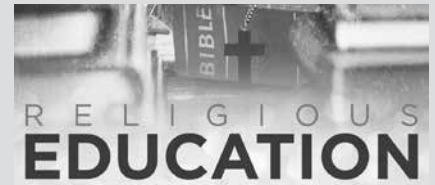

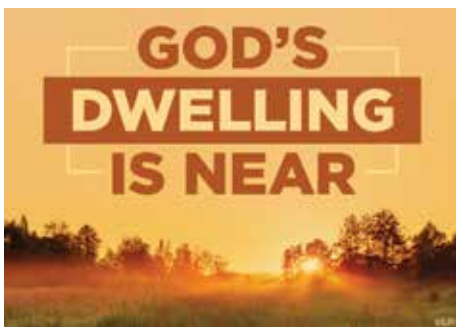
## WE NEED YOU... TO UNLEASH THE GOSPEL TO OUR YOUTH!



This past year, our Religious Education program successfully shared the Good News of the Gospel to about 45 of our children. This upcoming year we are losing several of our teachers. We need your help to continue the Religious Education Program at Sacred Heart Parish. We need people to share their faith as catechist for our youth. Don't worry about if you can do this. The Holy Spirit will provide you with the grace to spread his Good News. Remember, Jesus and the Holy Spirit used fisherman to spread his Gospel to the whole world. He certainly can use you and me to do the same.

Religious Education is on Monday evening from 6:00 to 7:30pm from the end of September through April. We provide the teachers books, and online training if desired from Franciscan University. ### GOSPEL MEDITATION

## ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Theology has two words to describe the space between God and us – transcendent and immanent. When we say God is transcendent, we speak of the One whose ways are not our ways, the placer of stars and maker of mountains. This is God who

transcends our understanding, whose being goes beyond what we can know. When we say God is immanent, we mean His nearness to us. This is the way Jesus speaks of himself in today's Gospel. "Whoever loves me keeps my word...and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him."

The Hebrews saw God as intimately involved with the fate of their people. But for all His care, God was still distant to most. He spoke through prophets and was represented in blazes of fire and pillars of cloud. Priests offered animal sacrifice to atone for the nation's sins. While we still know that God is transcendent - any morning's resplendent sunrise confirms this – Jesus introduces us to himself in a new way. Not only does Jesus walk among

us, but the Holy Spirit dwells within us. "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit... will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you!"

How do you tend to view God? For many of us, the transcendent sense of a distant God might fill our perception. Today's Gospel reminds us of something altogether different, something more intimate. Our God remains with us. He overcomes the confusion of the world and speaks peace to our troubled hearts. Our God is not far from us. The more we remain connected to Him and love as He loved, the more we will experience His nearness. We can have confidence in His presence and rest in His encouragement: "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."



### THE DAY OF THE LORD: AN UNLEASH THE GOSPEL PASTORAL NOTE FROM ARCHBISHOP VIGNERON

In his latest pastoral note to the faithful, entitled *The Day of the Lord*, Archbishop Vigneron encourages the faithful to “reclaim Sunday as a day set apart for the Lord, the family and for works of mercy” in recognition of Christ’s resurrection, the pouring out of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost Sunday and the first “rest” of God after the work of creation.

In the pastoral note, Archbishop Vigneron also announced a new policy to cease youth sporting activities on Sundays. This re-commitment to honoring Sunday is rooted in Synod 16 when the faithful of the archdiocese expressed their desire to rededicate Sunday to worship, rest and family time.
