# HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

## Where Faith is Known, Lived, & Shared

*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

As you read the Archbishop’s letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, “What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?”

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 5 – NO BYSTANDERS: Marker 5.3: Consecrated Life and Movements (cont)**— The ecclesial movements, many of which have sprung up since Vatican Council II, kindle fervor in lay people and bring fresh creativity and dynamism to evangelization. As John Paul II noted, “There is so much need today for mature Christian personalities, conscious of their baptismal identity, of their vocation and mission in the world!... And here are the movements and the new ecclesial communities: they are the response, given by the Holy Spirit, to this critical challenge.” I invite each of the movements to reflect on how they can contribute, in accord with their specific charisms, to our archdiocesan effort to unleash the Gospel.

**PRAY:** *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, to those involved in ecclesial movements in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Raise up more men and women with “mature Christian personalities” and open their spiritual ears to hear your call. Enkindle in them a fervor in “fresh creativity and dynamism” that they will then apply to their work in evangelization. Open their hearts to receive and respond to the challenge of their calling to consider and reflect on how to apply their specific charisms to unleashing the Gospel. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Amen*

**ACT:** What is this letter saying to you? Give some thought, and especially prayer, to how you can use your specific gifts (charisms from the Holy Spirit) to build the church. Is there something going on in the parish or the archdiocese that attracts or inspires you? How about Awaken? A Bible study? Singing in the choir? Finding a way to be involved with Catholic youth or young adults? Street ministry? Hospitality? Christian Service? Pastoral Associate Mike Merlo might be able to direct you.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

“So that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me.” Does technology bring us together, or does it remind us of distance and differences and keep us apart? Most days, I'm not so sure. With the constant inundation of news from across the world, it can be easier to tune out the sufferings and the joys of people we'll never meet, in places we'll never visit. But is this the invitation of Jesus?

Over the centuries, our Church has become truly universal across the globe. There are Christians across nations and cultures, across lines of rich and poor. There are Christians who live behind white picket fences, and Christians dying in conflict zones. “That they may all be one,” Jesus prays. One in what? Love. “That the love with which you loved me may be in them.” This is easier said than done, of course. The world is far too vast for us to individually love every human being. I can

hardly remember the names of half the regulars at my Sunday Mass! But that doesn't mean we can't try.

“I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word.” Jesus had this religious popular explosion in mind. The mission and message of Christ was not meant to stop in the Apostle's generation or stay cordoned off in the geographic confines of Israel. Jesus' words at the Last Supper are a prayer, a plea to the Father for the spread and unity of the Church across time and space. This week, look up organizations supporting the persecuted Church and make a donation. Next week, visit a struggling parish within your own diocese. When you meet someone new at hospitality Sunday, invite them over for dinner to get to know them better. Whether far off or close to home, let's allow Jesus' prayer to live in us, to be drawn together in love.



## THE DAY OF THE LORD

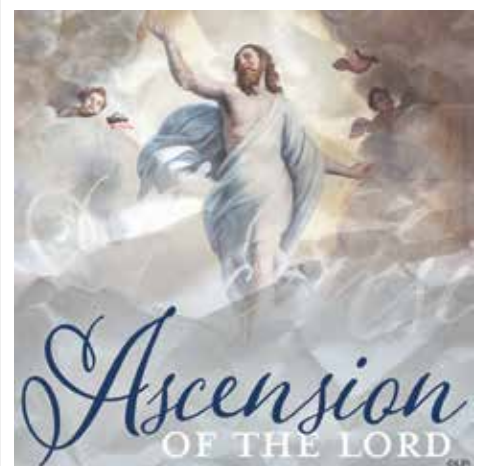
An Unleash the Gospel Pastoral Note from Archbishop Vigneron

In his latest pastoral note to the faithful, entitled *The Day of the Lord*, Archbishop Vigneron encourages the faithful to “reclaim Sunday as a day set apart for the Lord, the family and for works of mercy” in recognition of Christ's resurrection, the pouring out of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost Sunday and the first “rest” of God after the work of creation.

In the pastoral note, Archbishop Vigneron also announced a new policy to cease youth sporting activities on Sundays. This re-commitment to honoring Sunday is rooted in Synod 16 when the faithful of the archdiocese expressed their desire to rededicate Sunday to worship, rest and family time.
