HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

As you read the Archbishop's letter, based on Synod 16, ask yourselves, "What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?"

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 6 – PERSON-TO-PERSON ENGAGEMENT: Marker 6.4: Media (cont.): I encourage all Catholics who use social media to recognize it as a powerful platform to engage others in conversation about the faith. At the same time, we must studiously avoid the temptation to lower our standards of charity when using social media. When people see our posts, let them see not only good content but a tone that is respectful, charitable, joyful, peaceful, and hopeful. Every member of the Church is an ambassador of Christ, and some people may form their views of Catholicism based on our conduct. "Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for edifying, as fits the occasion, that it may impart grace to those who hear" (Eph 4:29). Our goal is not to win arguments but to win souls.

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

Come, Holy Spirit, to Sacred Heart Church. Transform us into worthy "ambassadors of Christ!" Lead us each into engagement with others on social media in a tone that is "respectful, charitable, joyful, peaceful, and hopeful." Give us the words that You want them to hear; words that are "edifying and that impart grace to those who hear." We ask for the strength, courage and will to speak boldly of You—not to win arguments, but "to win souls for Christ!" Come Holy Spirit, set our hearts on fire to share the Good News of Jesus with all those who stumble in darkness, who hunger for hope, and who thirst for eternal life. Amen.

ACT: What is this letter saying to you? Consider how you might contribute to the use of social media and information technology to bring the Gospel to the world. Think of the last time you saw a post on social media on a topic to which Catholicism could offer a word that would be "edifying" and "impart grace." How might you have engaged them in a tone that would be "respectful, charitable, joyful, peaceful, and hopeful"? This week when you see another such post, pray first (always), then practice this skill—in your head, on paper, or online.

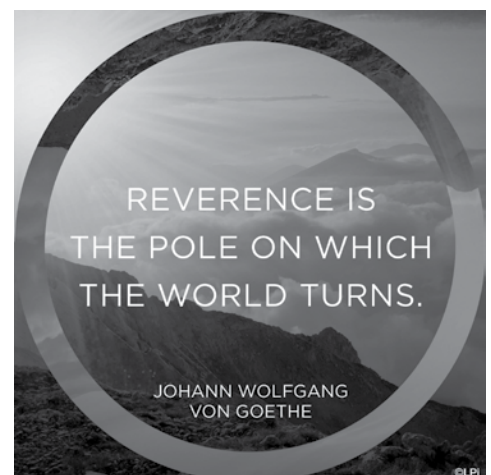
