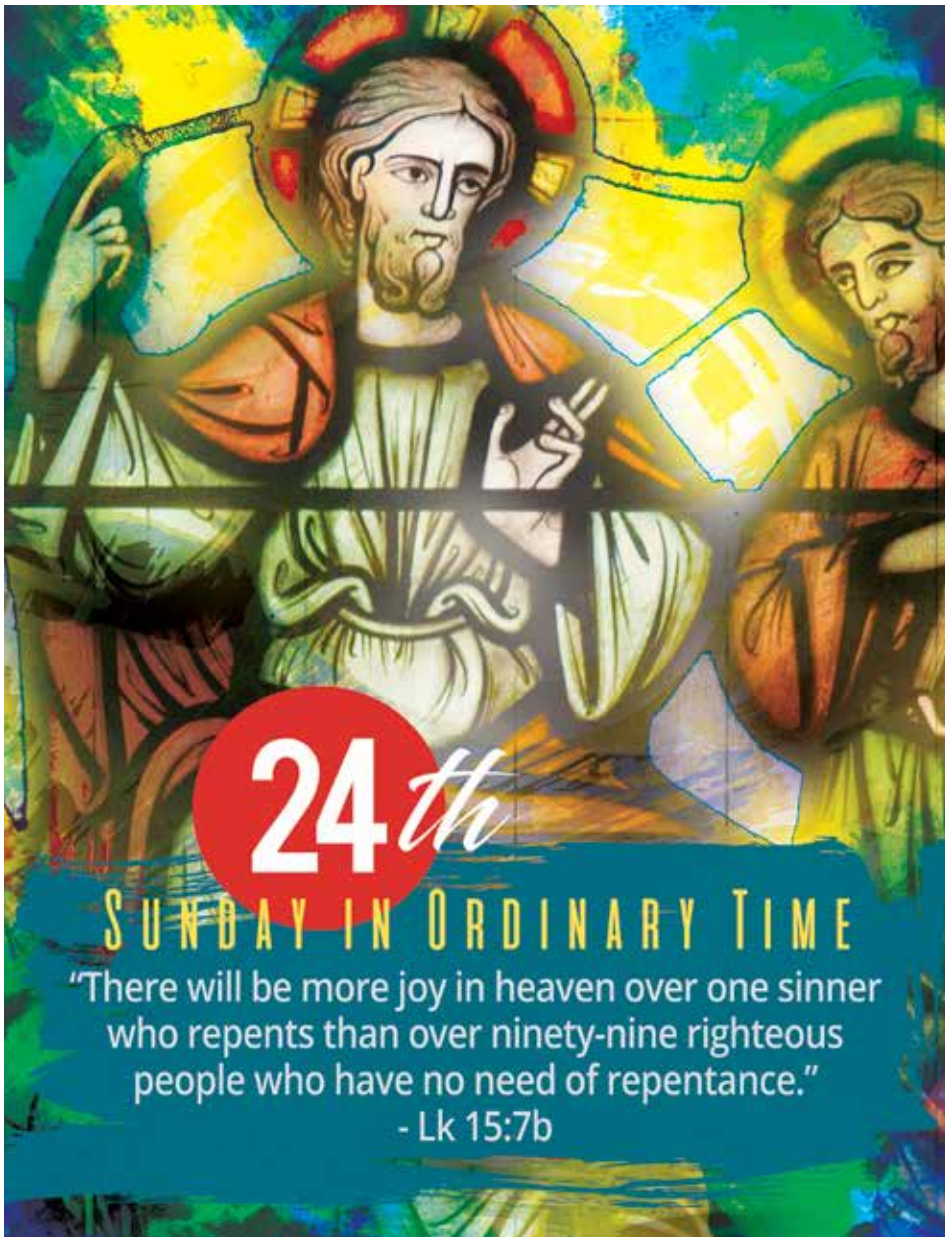

HEARTS ON FIRE at Sacred Heart

Where Faith is Known,
Lived, & Shared

I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)

LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 7 - FAMILIES; Marker 7.1: Ministry to Families—

Among the many ministries entrusted to our parishes, the first priority is to assist families to live as domestic churches. Many parents have not been evangelized or well catechized themselves. Just as airline safety videos tell us to put on our own oxygen mask before assisting others—since otherwise we may not be able to help them at all—so parents need to have a living relationship with Jesus and to learn the faith themselves in order to hand it on effectively to their children.

PRAY: Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week

Come, Holy Spirit, to Sacred Heart Church. Open our hearts and minds to understand and commit to the priority of ministry to our families, assisting them to live as "domestic churches." Open our minds to the very idea that we, ourselves, might not have been evangelized or well catechized in our youth, and to recognize where we are therefore in need of developing a deeper "relationship with Jesus," and learning more about our faith. Knowing one cannot give away what one does not have, strengthen all parents to commit to growing in their own faith and cultivating their relationship with Jesus so they can hand it on effectively to their children. And we ask that You move us all to pray for these parents and to work in some way to support this essential ministry. Come Holy Spirit, set our hearts on fire to become joyful missionary disciples! Amen.

ACT: What is this letter saying to **you**? Make an honest assessment of the relationship **you** have with Jesus Christ, and your knowledge of the faith. 1) Pray that the Holy Spirit will help you to discern this and lead you to grow in some way over the coming months (and years!). 2) Then commit to praying regularly for our parish's ministry to families and the part you may be called to play in it. 3) Also pray for the parents in our parish to develop their own relationship with Jesus and to grow in their faith (put on their own oxygen masks) so they will be able to pass it on to their children.

This fall Sacred Heart will be offering several programs to enhance the most important part of our lives – our faith. On Sept. 21st you will have an opportunity to sign up for the fall faith growing events listed below.

- **SUNDAY MORNING FROM 10:00 - 10:50AM – “DAVID THE KING” BY BISHOP BARRON:** Explore the compelling stories of King David and understand his foreshadowing of Jesus Christ, the King of Kings. Then address thought provoking questions such as: are you a king? What kind of a King are you? As a son or daughter of God, how do you live out this Kingship?
- **MONDAY AFTERNOON FROM 1:00 - 2:30PM – “THE GOSPEL OF ST. MARK”:** Why does Mark’s Gospel seem to be so short and lacking details of the other synoptic Gospels? Why does Mark always having things occur “immediately” (Mark uses the word immediate over 40 times)? Why is Mark’s Gospel so focused on the death of Jesus? Come learn more about Mark’s message of hope in Jesus in this study of the follower of both Peter and Paul!
- **WEDNESDAY EVENING WOMEN’S BIBLE STUDY FROM 7:00 - 8:30PM. – “ROMANS, THE GOSPEL OF SALVATION”:** Romans: The Gospel of Salvation explores the ways in which Jesus is the fulfillment of Israel’s prophecies. We will learn; the Catholic teaching on salvation, how to explain salvation to non-Christians, what is required for salvation—faith or works, what Paul really means by “works” not leading to salvation, how Christ’s death changed our relationship with God, and how we can enter more deeply into Christ.
- **SATURDAY MORNING MEN’S SCRIPTURE REFLECTION FROM 7:30-8:30AM.:** Come share an hour with the Lord and your brothers in Christ as we prepare for Sunday’s Scripture readings by discerning how they apply to us, our lives, our problems, our needs and our hope.

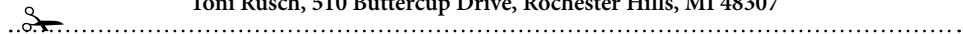

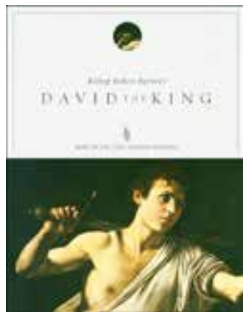
