*I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing. (Luke 12:49)*

**LISTEN to the Archbishop: GUIDEPOST 10—CALLING UPON THE ADVOCATE: Marker 10.3: Victory Over Spiritual Opposition**—The faithful need help in understanding how to resist the evil one, exercising the authority they have in Christ. We must use all the weapons the Church has given us: prayer, especially the rosary, Scripture, the sacraments, and sacramentals such as holy water. *“Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you”* (James 4:7-8).

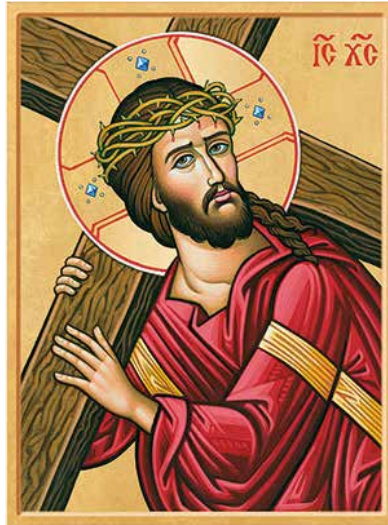
UNLEASH THE GOSPEL, pg 49

**PRAY: Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you’ll remember to pray it throughout the week**

*Come, Holy Spirit, to your people at Sacred Heart Church. Help us to “resist the evil one.” Show us how to “exercise the authority we have in Christ.” Guide us to choose the “weapons” the Church has given us in prayer, Scripture, all the sacraments, and sacramentals. Then strengthen us to have the will and persistence to use those weapons in resisting the devil”so that he will “flee from us.” Draw us near to God so “He will draw near to us.” Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love to understand how to resist the evil one. Amen!*

**ACT:** What is this letter saying to **you**? Pick one of the “weapons” suggested by Archbishop Vigneron above and use it this week, intending to “exercise the authority you have in Christ” against the evil one: e.g. pray the above prayer every day; pray a Rosary an extra time this week; meditate on the above Scripture from James or another for protection; receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation; attend Mass an extra time this week; pray before the Blessed Sacrament; or pray any prayer that commands the devil to leave.

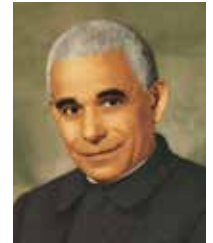

## Saint OF THE WEEK

**St. Luigi Orione**  
**March 12**

On March 12, it is the feast day of Luigi Orione was born in



Pontecurone, Italy, on 23 June 1872. At thirteen years of age he entered the Franciscan Friary of Voghera, but he left after one year owing to poor health. From 1886 to 1889 he was a pupil of Saint John Bosco at the Valdocco Oratory in Turin. On 16 October 1889, he joined the diocesan seminary of Tortona. As a young seminarian he devoted himself to the care of others by becoming a member of both the San Marziano Society for Mutual Help and the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul. On 15 October 1893, Luigi Orione, then a seminarian of twenty-one, started a boarding school for poor boys, in the Saint Bernardine estate. On 13 April 1895, Luigi Orione was ordained priest, and, on that occasion, the Bishop gave the clerical habit to six pupils of the boarding school.

Inspired by a profound love for the Church and for the salvation of Souls, he was actively interested in the new problems of his time, such as the freedom and unity of the Church, the Roman question, modernism, socialism and the Christian evangelization of industrial workers. He rushed to assist the victims of the earthquakes of Reggio and Messina (1908) and the Marsica region (1915). By appointment of Saint Pius X, he was made Vicar General of the diocese of Messina for three years.

On 29 June 1915, twenty years after the foundation of the Sons of Divine Providence, he added to the "single tree of many branches" the Congregation of the Little Missionary Sisters of Charity who are inspired by the same founding charism. Alongside them, he placed the Blind Sisters, Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament. For lay people he set up the associations of the "Ladies of Divine Providence," the "Former Pupils," and the "Friends."

Following the First World War (1914-1918), he set up the "Little Cottolengos," for the care of the suffering and abandoned, which were usually built in the outskirts of large cities to act as "new pulpits" from which to speak of Christ and of the Church - "true beacons of faith and of civilization." He was canonized on 16 May 2004.

## THE THREE BASIC LENTEN DISCIPLINES

**Fasting** expresses our desire to find happiness in God rather than in the satisfaction of our physical needs. The control we gain over our appetites helps us recognize more deeply that all true and lasting pleasure comes from God. Knowing this we are freed to gratefully accept food and savor it, or to avoid or limit foods that we know are unhealthy for us. Through fasting, our relationship to ourselves is reoriented toward God.

**Almsgiving** provides assistance to the poor among us and helps us recognize God as the true source of our security. Property and wealth exercise less control over us when we give away or share our wealth out of love for God and for others. Almsgiving is a way of bringing our relationship to others into the orbit of Christ’s love.

**Prayer** changes our relationship to God. Through prayer, we admit our need for a power that is greater than ourselves. We acknowledge our limitations and let go of the drive to control everything. In the process, we open ourselves to all that God has to offer us.
