

# Saint OF THE WEEK


NOVEMBER 6 | SAINT LEONARD OF LIMOGES

November 6 is the feast day of St. Leonard of Limoges. Leonard of Noblac or of Limoges, was a Frankish noble in the court of Clovis I. He was converted to Christianity along with the king by Saint Remigius (“Saint Rémy”), Bishop of Reims. Leonard secured the release of several prisoners, for whom he has become a patron saint, then, declining the offer of a bishopric, he entered a monastery at Micy near Orléans, under the direction of Saint Mesmin and Saint Lie. Then, according to his legend, Leonard became a recluse in the forest of Limousin, where he gathered several followers. Through his prayers the queen of the Franks was safely delivered of a male child, and in recompense Leonard was given royal lands at Noblac, 13 miles from Limoges, where he founded the abbey of Noblac, around which a village grew, named in his honor Saint-Leonard de Noblac.

In the eleventh century his cult rapidly spread, at first through Frankish lands, following the release of Bohemond I of Antioch in 1103 from a Danishmend prison. Bohemond, a charismatic leader of the First Crusade, subsequently visited the Abbey of Noblac, where he made an offering in gratitude for his release. Bohemund’s example inspired many similar gifts, enabling the Romanesque church and its visible landmark bell tower to be constructed. About the same time Noblac was becoming a stage in the pilgrimage route that led towards Santiago de Compostela. Leonard’s cult spread through all Western Europe: in England with its cultural connections to the region, no fewer than 177 churches are dedicated to him. Leonard was venerated in the Low Countries, Spain, Italy, Switzerland, Germany, particularly in Bavaria, and in Bohemia, Poland, and elsewhere. Pilgrims and patronage flowed to Saint-Leonard de Noblac. Leonard became one of the most venerated saints of the late Middle Ages. His intercession was credited with miracles for the release of prisoners, women in labor and the diseases of cattle. His feast day is 6th November, when he is honored with a festival at Bad Tölz, Bavaria. He is the patron saint against robberies and of blacksmiths, grocers, miners, and prisoners of war.

## LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Especially with regard to living the Gospel, we are not alone. A great cloud of witnesses journey with us offering us inspiration, wisdom, intercession, and support. We look to them for the example of perseverance we desperately need in order to be faithful, and for what it means to “walk the talk!” The Beatitudes are indeed a blessed vision that people hunger to hear and embrace. But, they also clearly remind us that following Jesus is difficult. Poverty of spirit, meekness, mercy, and peace making are not virtues readily accepted by the world. Pursuing a purity of heart and acknowledging the hunger of our souls require not only a courageous stance, but a single-minded devotion to God. And, after going against the grain of the world and meeting resistance along the way, the true disciple may find themselves persecuted and paying a high price. Look to all the saints for the secret to happiness and the example of fidelity. Their lives speak volumes of how God can use even the weakest and most humble among us in tremendous ways. Saints are not even close to being perfect. They are just ordinary folks like us trying to give honor to God with their lives.






## St. Vincent De Paul THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE




## SENIOR LEAF RAKING DAY



We are cautioned to be especially careful during the Coronavirus outbreak. Here are some simple ways to keep sickness away.




**WASH YOUR HANDS**
