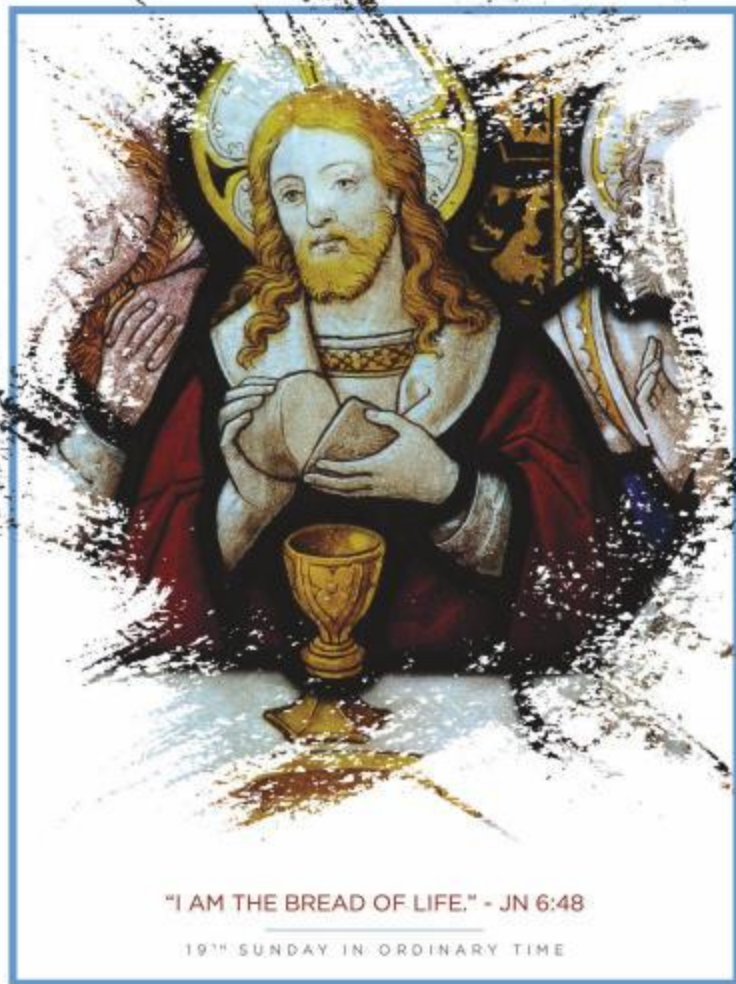


# SACRED HEART CATHOLIC CHURCH

Dear Friends,

## HEARTS ON FIRE

at Sacred Heart  
Where Faith is Known,  
Lived, & Shared

*"Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire!" St. Catherine of Siena*

**LISTEN** to "Charisms 101" Again—[Over the last few weeks we've looked at some charisms you might possibly have been given. Let's review what and why they are important:] You and I received the Holy Spirit in our baptism....But the public manifestation of the Holy Spirit—fruit-bearing—requires intentional cooperation on our part. We must choose in faith to do what God has called and anointed us to do.... **Charisms are supernaturally empowered graces given to apostles who have a mission to bring the presence and love of Jesus Christ to a specific setting or situation.** Charisms are whole life gifts that apostles take with them everywhere they go....are always [used] for others....are distinct from natural talents....cannot be used for evil....might be given as a single charism, but typically are given 2-5.

**PRAY:** Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week

*Come, Holy Spirit, Lord of the Gifts, to Sacred Heart Church and to our Sister Parishes; Enkindle the fire in our hearts to "intentionally cooperate" with the special Charisms you gave us at our baptism. Open our minds to "choose" mission—that particular calling you anointed us to do in order to "bring the love of Jesus Christ" to a specific place or person in our world. Guide us into discernment of these Charisms, so that we may use them for Your glory. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in each of us the fire of your love as we discern and use the Charisms you have given. Amen!*

**ASK & ACT:** What is this note saying to **me**? Remember, there are "No Bystanders!" This week I'll look back on my life to see if there were certain times or situations where I felt I was doing God's work or He was working through me. If so, did I get any feedback that others thought so too? If not, I will ask God to reveal to me a situation this week where He could use me and watch for opportunities to say "Yes." And I will also think back on the Charisms presented these last few weeks—**Encouragement, Helps, Hospitality, Administration**—to discern if I might have any of them that I could offer to our parish or Family to build it up.

# Saint OF THE WEEK

AUGUST 9 | SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS



On August 9, it is the feast day of St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. A brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was fourteen, Edith Stein was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her Baptism in 1922. Twelve years later she imitated Teresa by becoming a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau (now Wroclaw, Poland), Edith abandoned Judaism in her teens. As a student at the University of Gottingen, she became fascinated by phenomenology, an approach to philosophy. Excelling as a protegee of Edmund Husserl, one of the leading phenomenologists, Edith earned a doctorate in philosophy in 1916. She continued as a university teacher until 1922 when she moved to a Dominican school in Speyer; her appointment as lecturer at the Educational Institute of Munich ended under pressure from the Nazis.

After living in the Cologne Carmel (1934-1938), she moved to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands. The Nazis occupied that country in 1940. In retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians. Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa, also a Catholic, died in a gas chamber in Auschwitz on August 9, 1942. Pope John Paul II beatified Teresa Benedicta in 1987 and canonized her in 1998. She is the patron saint of Europe, loss of parents, and martyrs.

## Reflect AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and

begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves



to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have? ©LPI

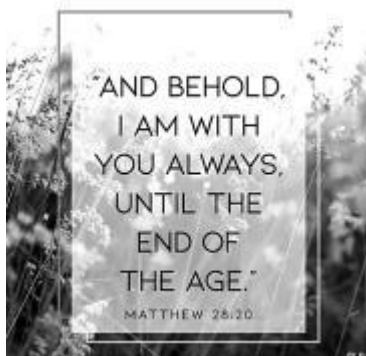
