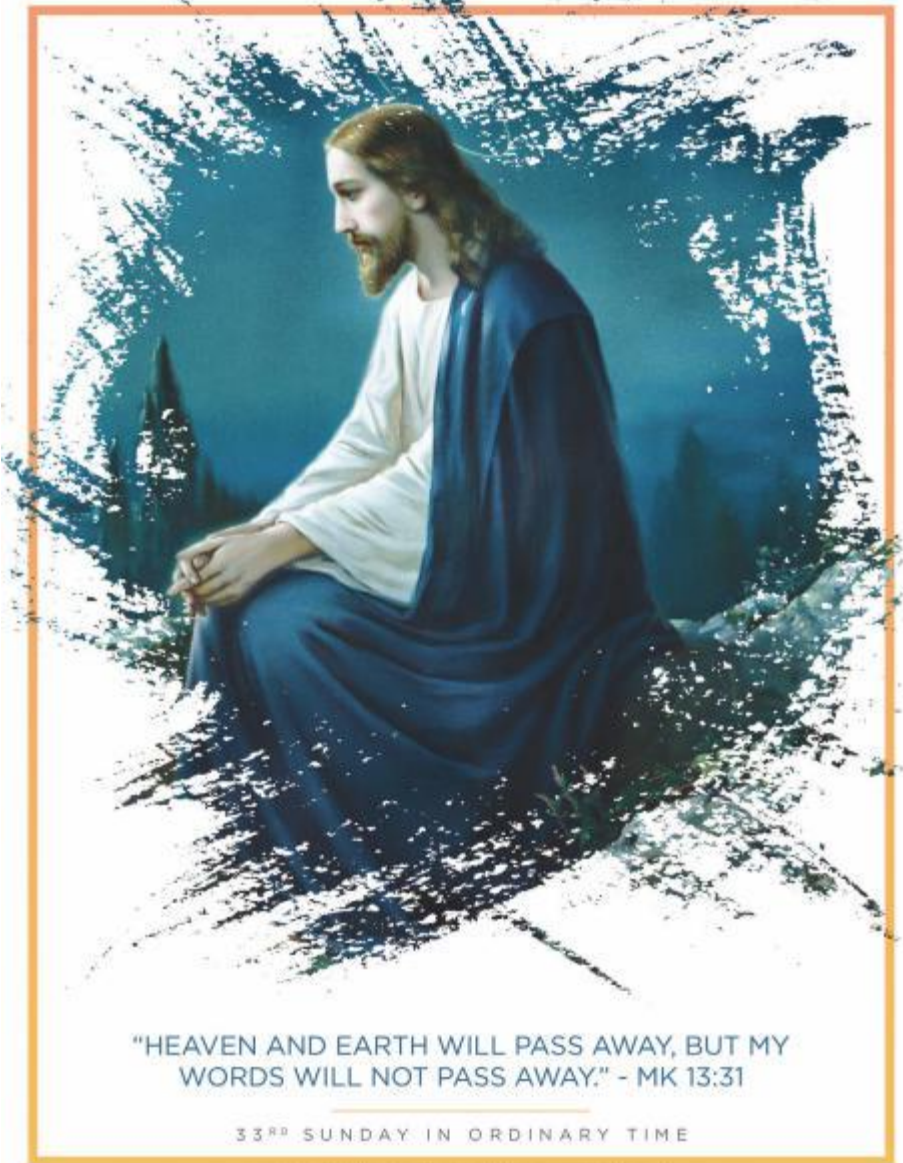

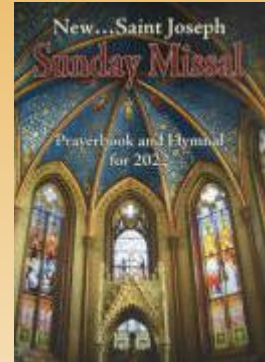

LISTEN to Fruitful Discipleship—LISTEN to Fruitful Discipleship—The **Charism of PROPHECY** empowers a Christian to be a channel of **divine truth and wisdom by communicating a word or call of God to individuals or a group through inspired words or actions**....God still speaks to His Church (CCC 79)....Does not mean that any given private prophecy is infallibly true, or its meaning obvious, or concerned with predicting the future....May take many forms: exhortation that calls people to an action; a "word of knowledge" or "word of wisdom" through which God reveals what he is doing in the life of an individual or community; an interior vision (not apparition)....Will not be in opposition to, and must always be discerned in light of, Scripture, Tradition, and the Magisterium...Requires ongoing discernment and oversight.

(Fruitful Discipleship, by Sherry Weddell, pg 133-137)

PRAY: *Tear or cut off this prayer and keep it where you'll remember to pray it throughout the week*

*Come, Holy Spirit, Lord of the Gifts, to Sacred Heart Church and to our Family's Parishes; Open our minds and hearts to hear your voice. Reveal to each of us the special and particular gifts (Charisms) You have given to us to use for others. Provide opportunities to test and discern whether one might have the **Charism of PROPHECY**. Reveal to us how You want us to use any of the Charisms you've given, and give us the desire and will to do it. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in each of us the fire of Your love. Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What is this note saying to **me**? Do I know that it is vitally important that disciples respond to God's call today with their whole hearts—and I try to make this clear to other Christians? Have I known what God wanted to say to certain people in specific situations? Do I feel that God seems to use me in a similar way to the Old Testament prophets—to spark an action in someone? Have others told me that they were encouraged or moved or challenged because I shared the message I had been given? I will **pray** over these questions, asking God to lead me in discernment of whether (or not) He has given me the **Charism of PROPHECY**, and ask for the desire and will to know how I might use any of my charism group in our parish or my community. Remember: "No Bystanders!"



Saint OF THE WEEK

NOVEMBER 15 | SAINT ALBERT THE GREAT

November 15 is the feast day of St. Albert the Great. Albert, the "light of Germany," called the Great because of his encyclopedic knowledge, was born in 1193 at Lauingen, Donau. He studied at Padua, where under the influence of the second Dominican general, he joined the newly founded Order of Preachers (1223). Soon he was sent to Germany, taught in various cities, particularly Cologne; Thomas Aquinas was his student. In 1248 he received the honor of master's in sacred theology at Paris. Throgs attended his lectures.

In 1254 Albert was chosen provincial of his Order in Germany. For a time, he lived at the court of Pope Alexander II, who in 1260 made him bishop of Regensburg; two years later, however, he returned to his community at Cologne. There he acted as counselor, peacemaker, and shepherd of souls with great success. He died at the age of eighty-seven. Pope Pius XI numbered him among the ranks of the saints on December 16, 1931 and declared him a doctor of the Church. Much of his life was given to writing. His twenty-one folio volumes are devoted to commentaries on Aristotle (whose works were just then becoming known in the West) and the Bible. Legend credits him with drawing the ground plans for the cathedral at Cologne. Albert, the greatest German scholar of the Middle Ages, was outstanding in the fields of natural science, theology, and philosophy. Albert is named "Doctor Universalis" because of his vast knowledge and writings. He is the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, Ohio, medical technicians, natural sciences, scientists, and students of theology.

We try to include breakfast items (pancake mix, syrup, and cereal), lunch items (peanut butter, jelly, crackers, tuna fish, and fruit), dinner items (macaroni and cheese, pasta, spaghetti sauce, canned meats, sloppy joes, chili, soup, vegetables, and rice), and of course Thanksgiving dinner trimmings (gravy, stuffing, boxed or can potatoes, cranberry sauce, jello, pickles, and vegetables). We also try to include paper products (toilet paper, napkins, facial tissues, and paper towels). Please return the blue bags you have taken with food by November 21st. Thank You for not only helping us feed those in need, but allowing us to bring hope and pass on the good news that God is alive and is working through his people to help those less fortunate. 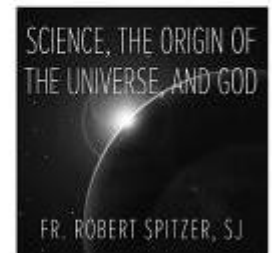
