A EUCHARISTIC LIFE: One meaning of ONE signifies unity. Receiving the Eucharist can be described as a communal act. As we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, it's not merely a personal act—it can never be! For Communion to fulfill what Jesus desired, we must embrace all who receive it—the entire Body of Christ.

Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist, by Pope Benedict XVI

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Eucharist and the Risen Christ: Sunday, the day Christ rose from the dead, is also the first day of the week, the day which the Old Testament tradition saw as the beginning of God's work of creation. The day of creation has now become the day of the "new creation," the day of our liberation, when we commemorate Christ who died and rose again.

PRAY: Throughout the week... LORD God of Creation, our hearts are so full of gratitude for Your "work of creation." And then for your sending your Son, our Lord Jesus, to make a "new creation," liberating us from our sinful selves by dying and rising again—for US. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **me**? Have I ever made the connection between the "first day of the week," Sunday—the day we celebrate the Eucharist and Christ's "new creation" in our liberation from sin—and the Old Testament "first day of the week" in which tradition sees the "beginning of God's [original] work of creation?" How could I not have made that connection before?! And how beautiful is it now to see the original Creation fulfilled in the "New Creation" of Christ? Lord fill my heart with gratitude and joy at having, by Your Grace, been led to this discovery!

An Invitation to OCIA:

What is it and Who is it for?

OCIA, the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**, is a welcoming way of formation and preparation for people thinking about entering the Catholic Church. It is for people who are wondering and inquiring about Christ's Church, who may be seeking more meaning in their lives, or a deeper understanding of Creation, human nature and Truth.

OCIA is for adults from all backgrounds, at any stage in their faith lives, people with no specific faith tradition or who've practiced another religion, one of the Protestant sects, an Eastern faith, or Islam. OCIA is also for adult Catholics who were baptized but have not received other *Sacraments of Initiation*, First Communion and/or Confirmation. OCIA also appeals to Catholics who have been away from the Church, and to practicing Catholics who wish to learn more about their faith or want to accompany others on their journey into the Church.

In cooperation with Deacon Michael Stach, Administrator at Sacred Heart, and Curtis Scheulke, Director of Religious Education at St. Thomas More, I will again be coordinating OCIA jointly for both parishes this year. Topics are wide-ranging, rooted in Scripture, focus on Jesus, cover much of Church teachings and practices, especially the Sacraments. Sessions are guided by the participants' interests and questions. The format for most sessions uses a beautifully produced video followed by open discussion. OCIA is a prayerful guide for inquiry, self-examination and growth. When a participant is prepared, the program culminates with entrance into full communion with the Church and reception of the Sacraments at the Great Easter Vigil in April.

Everyone is encouraged to invite people they think could benefit from and enjoy OCIA to consider participating this year. Some of you might consider joining OCIA with friends and family as a sponsor. Please encourage potential "seekers" to find out more. Ask them to reach out to anyone on our OCIA team, or their priests or deacons, to learn more. Weekly sessions will be held Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00 beginning September 30th.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

Do you know someone searching for deeper meaning in life, someone who keeps asking the "BIG QUESTIONS"?

Why am I here?

Why is there something rather than nothing?

Who is God, and what does He want with me?

Or maybe you are the one asking these questions and seeking more. Are you considering becoming Catholic, or just curious to learn what the Catholic Church believes?

The *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults* (OCIA), formerly called RCIA, is a journey of discovery. It is designed for people who are searching for faith, truth, and purpose, and for those who want to explore a relationship with Jesus Christ.

OCIA is not just a class or program, but a process of conversion, prayer, and discernment. It helps seekers encounter God in His Word, in the sacraments, and in the life of the Church.

While there is no set timetable, preparation often takes about nine months, there is no rigid timetable. For many, the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist are celebrated at the



Easter Vigil—the most joyful liturgy of the Church year.

If you are already Catholic, chances are you know someone who has never received this invitation. Please consider sharing it

with them. You may be the bridge God uses to help a loved one, friend, or neighbor discover the peace, joy, and truth they have been seeking. Extending a kind invitation to OCIA is a powerful way of witnessing to your faith and sharing the Gospel.

Who is OCIA for?

People who have never been baptized in any Christian faith.

Baptized Catholics who never completed their sacraments.

Baptized Christians of another faith tradition who wish to become Catholic.

Anyone seeking to enter fully into the Catholic Church.

Classes for Grades 1–8 will begin **Monday, September 22, 2025, from 6:00–7:15 PM.**

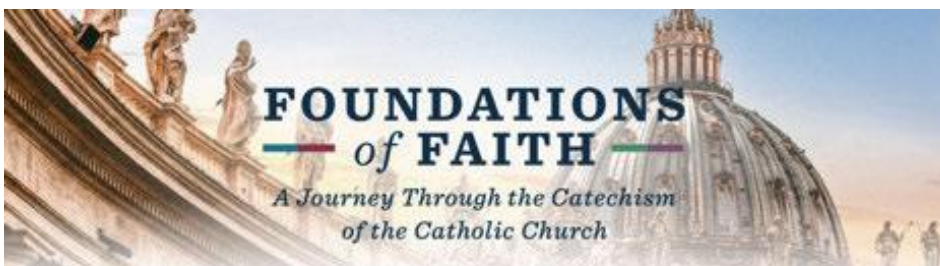

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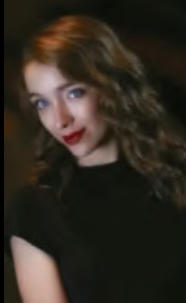
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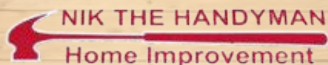
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
