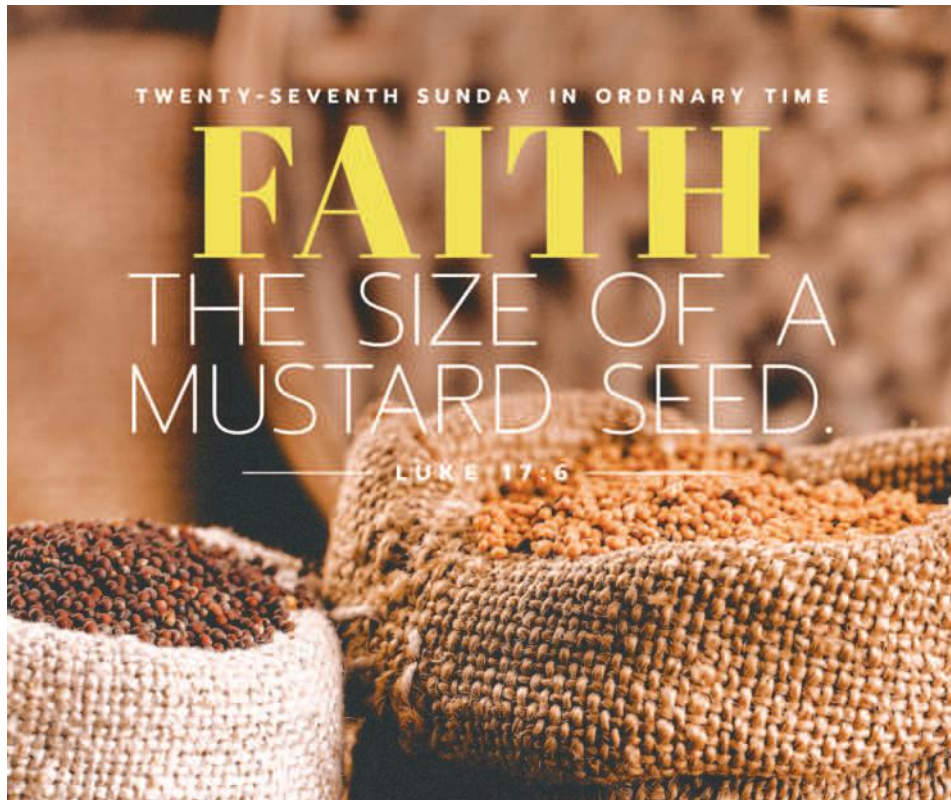

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

A EUCHARISTIC LIFE: This year we're being called to go "further up and farther in" to the mystery of God's Eucharistic life. How will we do that? We need to pray and fast. We need to commit to spending time with Jesus in His Eucharistic Presence so that we might become His living Body in the world. Even if it is only 5-10 minutes a day, we must gain our life from Him, our personality from Him, our everything from Him.

TAKEBLESSBREAKGIVE

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in and especially in the Eucharist.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, for your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities, and let God BREAK through to YOU and your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention.

Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist, by Pope Benedict XVI

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Bishop: [As unity and harmony in Eucharistic celebrations are his responsibility], the Bishop must be "determined that the priest, the deacons, and the lay Christian faithful grasp ever more deeply the genuine meaning of the rites and liturgical texts, and thereby be led to an active and fruitful celebration of the Eucharist." I would ask that every effort be made to ensure that the liturgies which the Bishop celebrates in his Cathedral are carried out with complete respect for the *ars celebrandi* [art of proper celebration], so that they can be considered an example for the entire Diocese.

PRAY: Throughout the week... LORD, give our Archbishop Weisenburger, and all the bishops and deacons in Detroit, as well as all of the lay faithful, the desire and ability to "grasp ever more deeply the genuine meaning of the rites and liturgical texts" of the Mass. Lead us to a more "active and fruitful celebration of the Eucharist." And give all bishops your Grace to celebrate the *ars celebrandi* with "complete respect" so as to be an example for all you place in their path. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **me**? How often have I considered the importance and the responsibility of Archbishop Weisenburger, other bishops, and the lay faithful (including me!) to celebrate the liturgy well? Do I "grasp ever more deeply" the meaning of the rites in the liturgy, or do I just "DO" them by rote? Do I participate "actively and fruitfully" in the celebration of the Eucharist? I will pray for the desire and the grace to pay closer attention and pray at the Mass with my whole heart, mind, and strength. Lord, hear my prayer.

"Offer it Up" for the Souls in Purgatory

When friends and family "of a certain age" gather, it is no surprise that conversations migrate to our health, issues great and small that preoccupy our thoughts, lead us to worry, and cause pain and suffering. It is human nature that we slow down, our organs begin to sputter, and our bones creak. In recent exchanges with friends, we lightheartedly shared the aches and illnesses we've endured. I mentioned advice my mother was quick to hurl at us kids when we complained about some tragic suffering, real or imagined: "**Offer it up for the souls in Purgatory**," she'd say. That surprised my friends. One said, "You can DO that?! In all those years of pain I could have been helping get people to heaven?!" Yes, indeed.

In any suffering we face, whether physical, emotional, or spiritual, we can give it purpose by uniting it to Christ's suffering in his Passion and death. Our pains gain meaning when we direct them to the good of others. Blogger Nicola wrote: "Jesus - fully God and fully man - chose to suffer out of love for us. His suffering was not meaningless; it was redemptive. When we unite our own trials to his Cross, our suffering also becomes redemptive. That doesn't mean it becomes easy - but it does become powerful" (novenaprayer.com).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches we should offer our prayers "in suffrage for" and "commends almsgiving, indulgences and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead" (¶1032). This sacrifice of prayer and suffering is a practice rooted in Scripture (2Macc 12:42-46) and expressed generously in the Church's Morning Offering:

*O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, **for the salvation of souls**, the reparation of sins, the reunion of all Christians, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father this month.*

Each Sacrifice of the Mass is an opportunity to unite our pain to Christ's, place our sufferings on the altar when the gifts are brought forward. "Offer it up!" gives meaning to our suffering and helps souls in Purgatory on toward heaven.

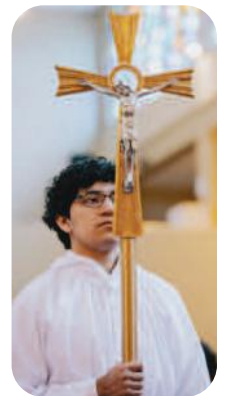
Children, teens, and adults are invited to become part of the Altar Server Ministry at Sacred Heart!

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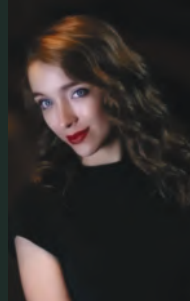
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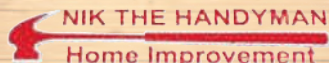
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
