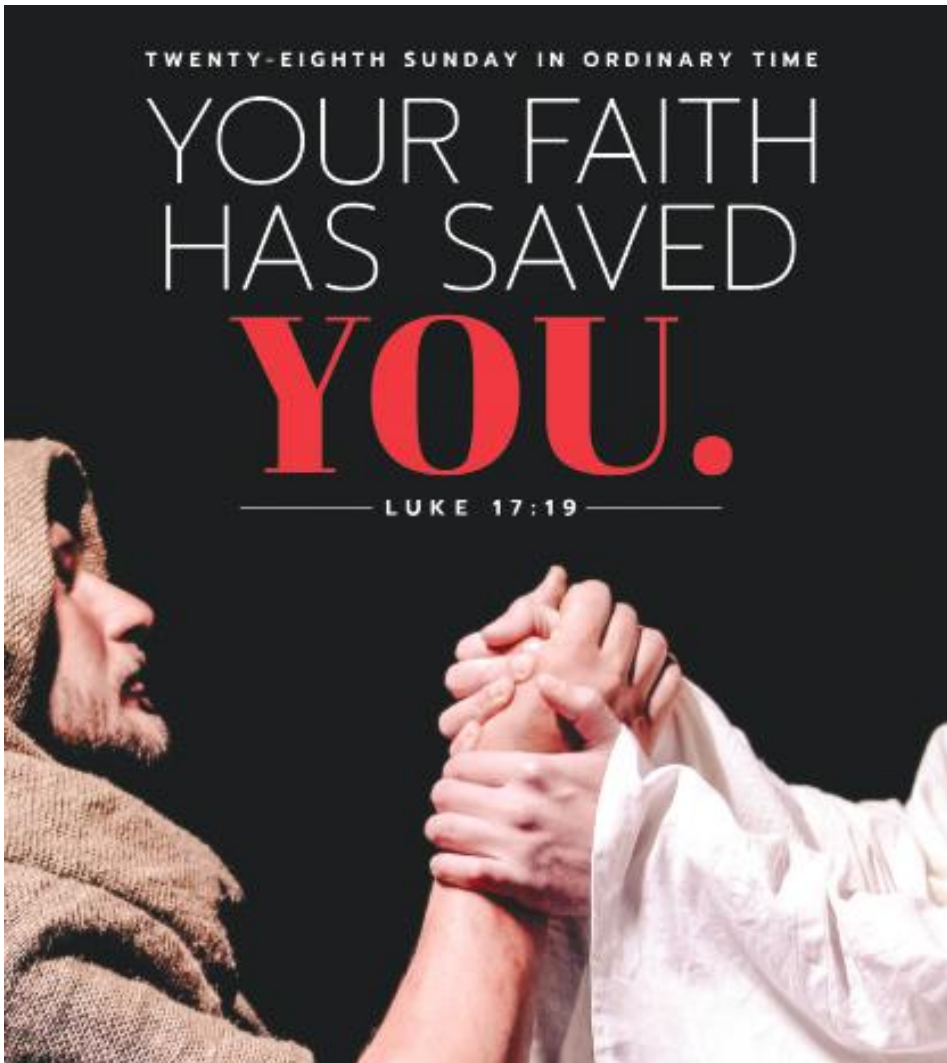

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

A Eucharistic MISSION: Love makes me do things that I may not want to do (like do things that my child loves, even when I don't). On my own, I would not consider it, but it's not about me anymore. Love is compelling me to something more—something uncomfortable, something I do when I don't want to that is a response to the demands of love. That is a picture of "discipleship."

Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist, by Pope Benedict XVI

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Bishop: Respect for the liturgical books and the richness of signs: Equally important [as liturgical books] for a correct ars celebrandi [art of proper celebration] is an attentiveness to the various kinds of language that the liturgy employs: words and music, gestures and silence, movement, the liturgical colors of the vestments. By its very nature the liturgy operates on different levels of communication which enable it to engage the whole human person.

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, come to reveal yourself in all the "various kinds of language" that the liturgy employs. You are the Word, but you also are in all that is beautiful and true! Open the ears of our hearts and minds to see and hear you in all the "languages" that you employ to speak to us, your children. Amen

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **me**? Have I ever thought of "music [with or without words], gestures, silence, the colors of the vestments, and even movement as "various kinds of language?" How do they speak to us—me? What do they say about Jesus and His love for us—for me? Which "language" do I hear most easily? I will look and listen more attentively at Mass to notice these "languages" and try to "hear" what Jesus is saying to me through them. Come Holy Spirit—be my guide to the "language" of Jesus' love.

An Attitude of Gratitude

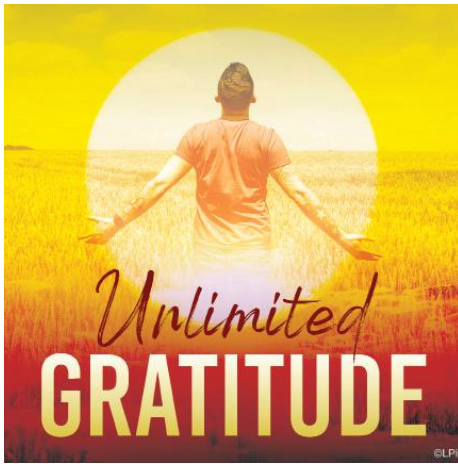
Unleash the Gospel teaches that an attitude of gratitude is one of those "good habits ... dispositions of mind and heart we must take on to become a radically mission-oriented Church ... Gratitude puts us in a right posture before God and opens us to his further work in our lives."

In today's Gospel, only one of the ten lepers, "realizing he had been healed returned ... fell at the feet of Jesus, and thanked him" (Luke 17:11-19). It is significant that he thanked Jesus by "glorifying God in a loud voice." Perhaps the other lepers were grateful, but they did not say so to Jesus. Jesus sought all of them ("Where are the other nine?"), and us, too. He acknowledges that the one who went back to him was not only healed bodily by his faith, but also that in giving thanks to God he had also been saved (Luke 17:19). Pope Benedict XVI reflecting on this Gospel wrote: "It is faith that saves human beings, re-establishing them in their profound relationship with God, themselves and others; **and faith is expressed in gratitude.**" The Catechism teaches that our faith in God "means living in thanksgiving" (CCC¶224).

By faith then gratitude is our proper posture; kneeling at Christ's feet the right relationship. We thank Jesus in silent prayer but, like the leper, also aloud in praise and worship, glorifying God. In faith, we go to Jesus in gratitude for all the gifts we receive from him, earthly treasures like food and shelter, and also our very being and the promise of salvation. There are many grateful postures by which we can give glory to God: going to his Son in gratitude for choosing his Passion and Death for our benefit by choosing to go to him at Mass every Sunday, kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration, meeting the Divine Physician in Confession and giving thanks as his Mercy heals us of our sins and cleanses us for eternal life.

Blessed Solanus Casey said we should thank God ahead of time, especially when facing illness, discouragement or other difficulties, struggling to live rightly, or trying to be active in our mission-oriented Church. Unleash the Gospel says that "the best antidote to discouragement is to praise God continually ... thanking him for what he has done."

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Dorothy Day, the great Catholic activist, doubted God's existence. At least in her early adult years. But something changed when after giving birth to her daughter, she experienced an overwhelming gratitude. She later described how, as she held her daughter, the only appropriate response was a kind of unlimited gratitude. She had done nothing to deserve such a gift — this tiny, miraculous life — but there she was, flooded with gratitude, completely undone by the love of such a Giver.

Something similar occurs in Luke 17:19 when Jesus tells a healed leper, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." This man had already received physical healing through his faith. But the moment of an even deeper transformation came when he turned back, fell at Jesus' feet, and gave thanks. Like Dorothy, this man's gratitude led him to encounter the Giver.

Isn't that what we want, too? Gratitude to God has the power to break our chains of sadness, bitterness, and disenchantment. It empowers us to step out of the prison of self-pity and into the reality of God's abundant love. It shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have received, from what wounds us to what heals us.

Where do we learn this? The Mass. The priest prays: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks." Always. Everywhere. Not just when life is easy. Not just when prayers are answered as we expect. Gratitude is not a passive feeling; it is an act of faith. In the eucharist, we remember that Christ himself has given everything for us. And in this act of gratitude, we are healed.
