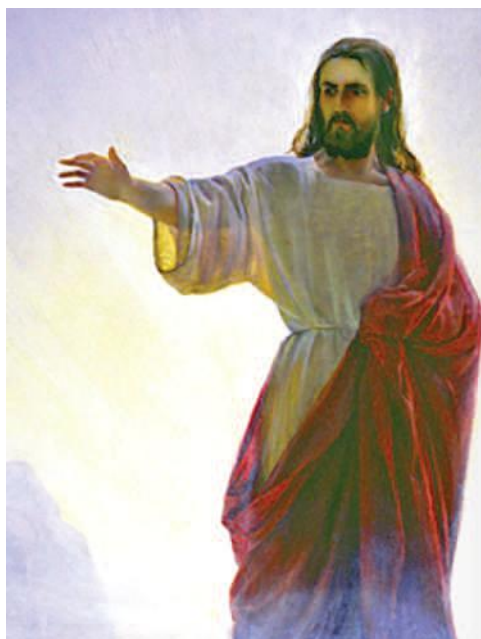

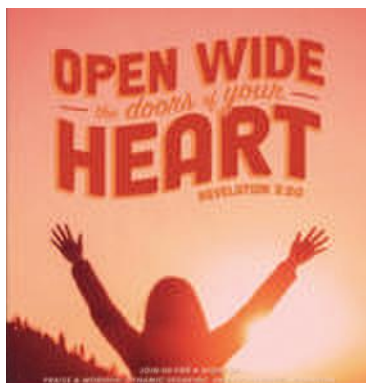

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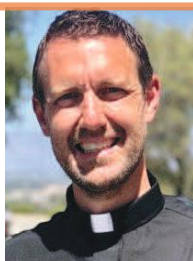

A Eucharistic MISSION: At the heart of discipleship there is a tension and a discomfort. To follow Jesus is to respond to his command to love one another, to love our neighbors and even our enemies. Love is uncomfortable. When we truly love someone, we no longer get to live life on our own terms; we give up some measure of control because the demands of love stretch us. This stretching is at the heart of Eucharistic Mission.

Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist, by Pope Benedict XVI

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Respect for the liturgical books and the richness of signs: The simplicity of its gestures and the sobriety of its orderly sequence of signs communicate and inspire more than any contrived and inappropriate additions. Attentiveness and fidelity to the specific structure of the rite express both a recognition of the nature of the Eucharist as a gift and, on the part of the minister, a docile openness to receiving this ineffable gift.

Sacramentum Caritatis 40

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, Open our eyes and hearts to see the "simplicity of the gestures" of the liturgy and the "signs and inspirations" it communicates. Make us attentive and faithful to the structure of the rite so that the "nature of the Eucharist as a gift" is revealed. And give the minister a "docile openness" to receiving this inexpressible gift. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **me**? How often do I pay close attention to the "simplicity of gestures" and the "sobriety of the orderly sequence" of the liturgy of the Mass? Have I been "attentive to the structure" of the rite? Can I see how these things help me recognize the nature of the Eucharist as a gift? I will look and listen more attentively at Mass to notice how the liturgical rite inspires recognition of the true nature of the Eucharist as a gift of God that it is. Come Holy Spirit, open my eyes of faith.

A Powerful Example of Forgiveness

The assassination of Charlie Kirk was a tragedy. Aside from politics and "culture wars," the impact of what his widow did at the memorial service is profound. Erika Kirk spoke tearfully of "that young man" who shot her husband: "Our Savior said, 'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.' ... That young man. I forgive him."

Her words were very moving and inspiring. How could she set aside a righteous demand for justice? How could she reconcile with the murderer of the father of her children, someone who hasn't even said he is sorry? How could she forget the pain and loss? True forgiveness is none of those things.

Forgiveness is not forgetting, even if it were possible. Forgiveness is not being reconciled, nor does it require the one forgiven to be sorry. It does not make one feel better. It is a sacrifice. Saying those words was obviously painful for Mrs. Kirk and she knew the pain and grief will endure. More than her words, Mrs. Kirk's act of forgiveness moved and inspired others. A few days later actor Tim Allen publicly forgave the man who had killed his father in a car accident many years ago.

Our forgiving releases another person from a debt owed to us. "I forgive you" means "you don't owe **me** anything." Society may, and the Divine Judge in due time will, account responsibility and mete out justice tempered by mercy. But our forgiveness of others does not depend on that. It is a gift that can be very hard to hand over. It is a free gift of what we feel we are owed and that actually frees us. Generosity in forgiveness, even years later, benefits us by releasing us from anger and a desire to punish. Not forgiving holds onto a hope for revenge and exacerbates the pain. It is said that not forgiving is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die.

We must forgive for the good of others and ourselves. In the *Our Father* we pray at Mass, our petition to "forgive us our trespasses" (or our "debts") is conditional: "as we forgive those who trespass against us." We simply won't be forgiven by God if we do not forgive others as Jesus did on the Cross (Luke 23:34). Mrs. Kirk knew this which is why she repeated Christ's words and then said "I forgive him because it was what Christ did." 55

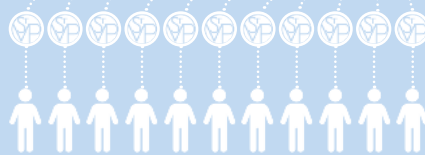

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

The Church dedicates November to remembering all her faithful who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. November 2nd is designated as All Souls day, a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. We are all called to pray for the dead and perform Works of Mercy. Praying for the dead is one of the Spiritual

Works of Mercy. You can sign the names of your beloved who passed away in our **Book of Remembrance** located near Baptismal Font. We will remember and pray for them on All Souls Day and throughout the month of November.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A woman in my parish has an adult son who has rejected his faith. She prays for him every day. She lights candles, says rosaries, and asks God again and again to bring him back. But nothing changes. Is God listening? Is He delaying? She told me once that she feels like the widow in Jesus' strange parable — crying out for justice, but hearing only silence. And yet, she said, she is at peace. I asked why. She responded, "God is already answering. I just can't see it yet."

She embodies something of the mystery in Jesus' parable this week in Luke 18. A powerless widow demands justice from a corrupt judge. This isn't about wearing God down until He gives in. It's about faith in the justice that is already coming. The widow isn't just persistent; she believes that justice is inevitable. And when Jesus

points to the judge's words — his fear of being "struck" — He hints at something deeper: God's justice does not creep in gradually. It strikes. It comes like lightning.

Blessed Mary is, of course, the ultimate widow demanding justice. At the foot of the cross she stands before what looks like the ultimate injustice — the brutal execution of her son. But she did not despair. She did not beg for a last-minute rescue. She knew that justice was not delayed. In fact, it was happening. The power of the cross was already unleashing justice upon the world — suddenly, decisively, like a blow that would topple every corrupt power, making even the most corrupt fear her strike.

This parable asks us: will the Son of Man find faith on earth? Or will we mistake God's silence for absence? The cross proves that justice is not slow. It is only hidden. The lightning has already struck. In the cross, justice is speedily being done.

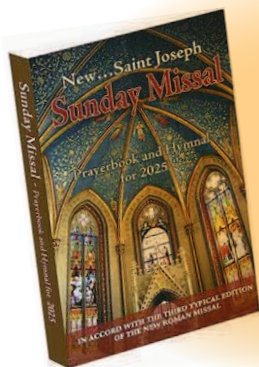

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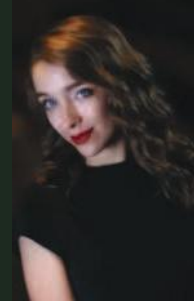
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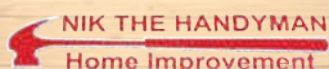
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
