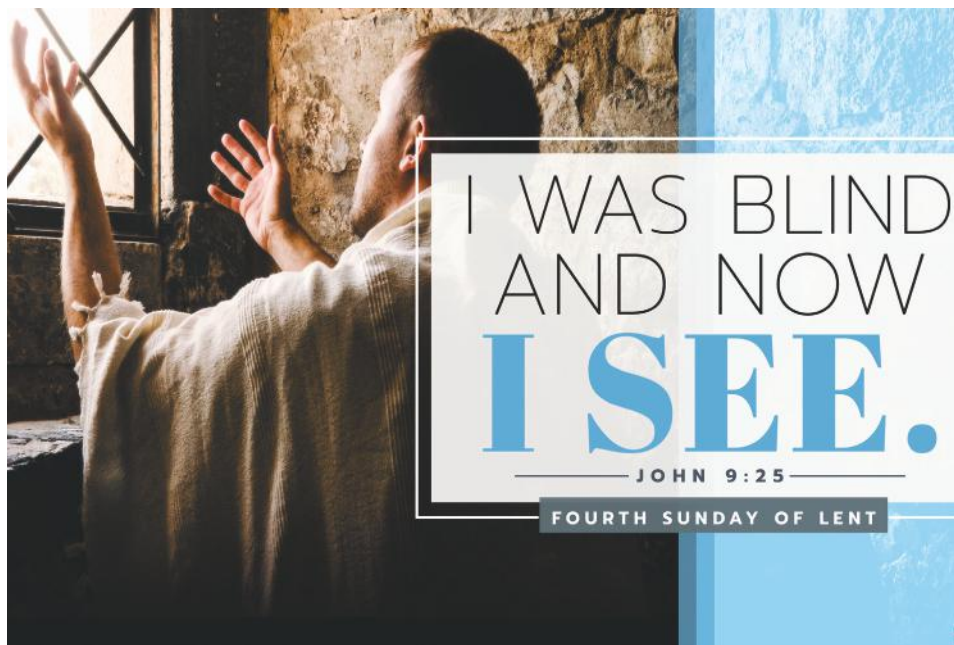

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Eucharistic Prayer: In a particular way, eucharistic spirituality and theological reflection are enriched if we contemplate in the anaphora [Eucharistic Prayer] the profound unity between the invocation of the Holy Spirit and the institution narrative whereby “the sacrifice is carried out which Christ himself instituted at the Last Supper. Indeed, ‘the Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become Christ’s Body and Blood, and that the spotless Victim to be received in communion be for the salvation of those who will partake of it.”

Sacramentum Caritatis 48

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, open our eyes and hearts to appreciate the deep actions and meaning in the Eucharistic Prayer. Reveal to us the “profound unity” between the invoking of the Holy Spirit and the institution narrative from the Last Supper where the bread and wine become, in truth, Christ’s Body and Blood. And these are both part of the same “sacrifice of Christ”. May we all receive this “Spotless Victim” in communion as the salvation of the very ones who partake of it—you and me!! Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **me**? Have I ever considered the strong relationship between the various words of the Eucharistic Prayer? Have I seen, or even know to look for, the “profound unity” of the invocation of the Holy Spirit, and the institution narrative from the Last Supper where the bread and wine become, in actuality, the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ, such that the Holy Spirit will enable us to receive the “spotless Victim” who saves us all? I will listen intently to the words spoken by the priest at this part of the Mass, and ask the Holy Spirit to open my spiritual eyes to see this beautiful relationship, and appreciate its importance for me.

REboot and Repent

Only halfway through Lent and we’ve likely already failed to keep our REsolve to pray more each day, give more generously, and fast conscientiously! But the Lord is kind and abounding in mercy (Psalm 145:8-9). We have every opportunity to REboot, REnew our RESolutions, and begin again with our Lenten disciplines. After all, REstarting is the point of Lent: to RETURN to the Lord with all our heart. We heard this on Ash Wednesday: “Repent and believe in the Gospel.” God is calling earnestly to us: “Return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, weeping, and mourning. Rend your hearts, not your garments, and RETURN to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful” (Joel 2:12-13).

So let’s REconsider our plans for Lent trusting that Our Lord, Jesus Christ, the Light of World, will REveal to us the Way we should go. Maybe we over-committed, promising hours of prayer and Scripture reading each day for the good of the whole world. Rather, let’s REfocus for 15 or even 6 minutes each morning or evening, and pray for one clear intention with sincere gratitude for all our blessings. Let’s REMind ourselves of all the charities we intended to support through our Lenten almsgiving, pick one and actually get a donation sent today. Let’s also REMember how good it felt during the first week of Lent when we carefully avoided sweets and stayed off social media. REcommitting ourselves to fast for the remainder of Lent is a good thing.

Finally, a most compelling way to REboot, not just for Lent but for the whole of our faith lives, is to RETURN to the Sacrament of REconciliation. In the confessional we meet the merciful Jesus who was sent to REScue us from sin and death. REcounting our sins and RECEIVING absolution from Christ through his Church, RESTores us to wholeness as God’s adopted children. A great measure of God’s unfailing love and mercy is that we can REpeatedly RECEIVE these Sacramental graces, conferred from the Cross and through the Holy Spirit, no matter how often we REpeat our sins.

REPentance during Lent is practice for working to get it right all the time so we may be REdeemed and participate fully in the RESurrection which we celebrate each Sunday, and especially on Easter.

SACRED HEART Faith Formation

This week we are reminded to "Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth." As parents and elders, we see the innocence of youth as bright and good. It is a goal to support and encourage strength in the faith of our youth to guard against cultural and social pressures; to avoid evil by frequently recognizing the light within each of them. Every time that we validate the light each youngster emits through actions and difficult choices, we are shining our light.

Also, this week, we see that Samuel tells Jesse to bring his youngest son who is then chosen as the next to lead: It is David who is anointed to lead! It happens that the recent movie "DAVID" was our choice for movie night only 3 weeks ago. Use this viewing to provide excellent conversation about how we can be strong enough in our faith to shine brightly for all to see. We saw David's absolute faithfulness to God providing him with confidence to do good even in the face of danger and without the faith of others in David's ability. David's faith was rewarded by the God he knew through faith even when others did not believe. David was courageous as we saw him accept challenges others feared, because he had faith in God.

And speaking of opportunities to deepen our faith: The Faith Formation teachers and students will be leading the Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 20th at 7 p.m. here at Sacred Heart Church. We ask students and their families to gather in the vestibule, the back of church, at 6:45 p.m. to prepare. We hope to see everyone who has enjoyed a wonderful fish dinner to also enjoy devotion to our faith with Faith Formation in action and prayer.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

If you are like me, it's easy to fixate on our shadows: failures, guilt, shame. Especially when we suffer, it is easy to want to blame ourselves or others. In this week's Gospel, Jesus' disciples ask about the blind man, **"Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents?" (John 9:2)** They, like us, focus on blame. But Jesus sees the entire situation differently: **"Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him."** He does not deny sin, but he sees deeper — through the light of mercy, not the lens of judgment. The scene hinges on Jesus' strange claim: **"I am the light of the world" (John 9:5)**. He sees things differently than everyone. They see shadows and light. He is the light.

Thought experiment: imagine you are the sun looking at everything on the earth. What do you see? Everything. What do you *not* see? Shadows. Everything is illuminated. If you see it, it is illuminated. For the light, nothing is dark.

Because he is the light, Jesus sees us in the glow of his redemptive love. Even our sin becomes a place where his glory can shine. The man's healing is not just about sight — it is about seeing as Christ sees. Lent is not a season of staring into darkness. It is a time to step into the light — to let Christ's gaze reframe how we see ourselves and one another.

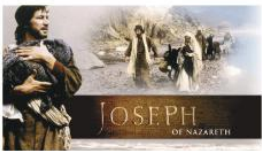

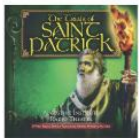

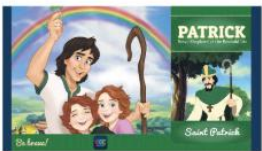
Joseph of Nazareth

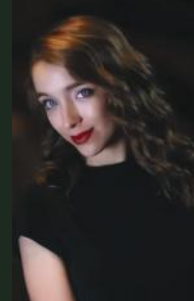
