LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Sign of Peace: By its nature the Eucharist is the sacrament of peace. At Mass this dimension of the eucharistic mystery finds specific expression in the Sign of Peace. Certainly this sign has great value. In our times, fraught with fear and conflict, this gesture has become particularly eloquent, as the Church has become increasingly conscious of her responsibility to pray insistently for the gift of peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family. Certainly there is an irrepressible desire for peace present in every heart

PRAY: Throughout the week ... Lord Jesus, enkindle in us the "irrepressible desire" for Your peace in our world that is so divided and conflicted. Bring us into union with You as we participate in the Eucharistic mystery at Mass, the sacrament of peace. Give us the Grace to understand our responsibility to "pray insistently" for the gift of peace and unity for "the whole human family." Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I feel "an irrepressible desire for peace" in **MY** heart? Can I see how important the gesture of the "Sign of Peace" is, especially in this very divided and often violent age? Can I see how it is **MY** responsibility to "pray insistently" for the gift of peace and unity for our Parish, our Archdiocese (especially during its restructuring), our Church, our country, and our world? I will ask for the Grace to pray daily, and especially at the Sign of Peace at Mass, for such Peace.

"...if someone should rise from the dead."

Today's Gospel (John 11:1-45) tells perhaps the second-most poignant episode in the Bible behind only the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ. The death of Jesus' dear friend Lazarus was profoundly painful to the sisters, Martha and Mary, and caused such great heartache for Jesus that he wept with all the others. Neither the sisters nor the Apostles understood why Jesus delayed coming to Bethany when he might have saved Lazarus. Nor do we understand when loved ones suffer and die when we may have been praying so very hard for healing. "Jesus wept" because, fully human, he felt the pain of loss that comes with death. He felt the sister's pain, confusion and disappointment when they thought their Lord, Jesus, had failed them.

Ten days ago in the daily Gospel (Luke 16:19-31), Jesus told a parable about another 'Lazarus.' Choosing this name for his story was no coincidence. This Lazarus was a poor man lying at the door of "a rich man dressed in purple ... who dined sumptuously each day." Lazarus "would gladly have eaten scraps ... from the rich man's table," but received none before he died and went to heaven. Then the rich man died and realized, in torment and flames, his error. He begged Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers for "if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent." But "Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

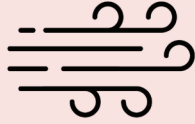
The irony is too thick. The promise of salvation through the Covenant revealed throughout the Old Testament was sufficient for Abraham, Moses, Isaac, Jacob, *et alia* to have faith, and should be for us. But we have so much more! We have the witness of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Today Jesus explains he waited before going to Bethany because "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." By calling Lazarus out of the grave Jesus revealed his power over death, declaring "I AM the resurrection and the life." In glorifying God by raising Lazarus, and the widow's son (Luke 7:11-17), and Jarius' daughter (Luke 8:40-42), Jesus prepares us to believe the fulfillment of the Covenant in his own Resurrection. Someone has indeed risen from the dead. And our lives are not meant to end in death. "Whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live..." Jesus asks each of us: "Do you believe this?"

THE PROMISE

Our Lord Jesus said, "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates throughout which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."

WHY IS THIS PROMISE FROM JESUS SO WONDERFUL AND MERCIFUL?

TEMPORAL PUNISHMENT AND SUFFERING: The Catholic Church teaches that sin has two consequences, or punishments, (CCC 1472). The first is eternal punishment in which the soul loses Heaven and is confined to an eternity in Hell. This punishment is remitted through the forgiveness of sins. The second is temporal punishment, in which a person must expiate, or make reparation for his sins. This temporal punishment remains even after sin is forgiven. This temporal punishment is known as Purgatory.

So, Jesus's amazing promise to St. Faustina amounts to offering all mankind the graces of a COMPLETE PARDON; an opportunity to have all temporal punishment, time in Purgatory, that which would be necessary before entrance into Heaven, completely removed!

THE DIVINE MERCY FEAST DAY
"I desire that there be a feast of mercy. I want this image, which you will paint with a brush to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be known as the Feast of Mercy."

JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU.

THE IMAGE

"I desire that this image be venerated throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I promise victory over its enemies, already here on earth, and especially at the hour of death... I Myself will defend it as My own glory."

THE CHAPLET

"Pray unceasingly the Chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation."

THE CONVERSION PRAYER

"If you say this prayer, with a contrite heart and with faith, on behalf of some sinner, I will give that soul the grace of conversion:

'O Blood and Water that gushed forth from the heart of Jesus, as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.'

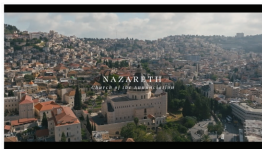

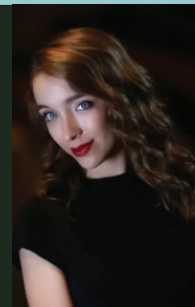
