Be with Jesus throughout His Passion

Today begins Holy Week. The two readings from Matthew's Gospel today [the Entry into Jerusalem (21:1-11) and the Passion (26:14 - 27:66)], as well as the reading of the Passion from John's Gospel that we will hear Good Friday (18:1 - 19:42), are opportunities to reflect deeply on the suffering and death of close to Jesus during the trials and sufferings we will recall in these readings. St. Ignatius Loyola encouraged a form of *Lectio Divina* where readers (or hearers) of Scripture imagine themselves within the scenes, an exercise he found enhanced understand what the Lord wants us to know about him. As an “up-close witness” to his Passion, you might consider more clearly what your sins cost Our Lord. Here are a few examples of this type of personal, meditative reflection.

Imagine seeing Jesus during his joyful entry into Jerusalem. A woman next to you waves a palm branch and shouts “Hosanna!” As Christ passes, he turns to look at you and smiles. You yell, “Hosanna in the highest!” How will you remember this at the end of the week, when the crowds all around you are yelling “Crucify him!?” Imagine now you're outside the upper room late on Passover night. You see Jesus lead his disciples out of the city to a garden. You follow closely. How do you feel when, spying on him from behind a gnarled olive tree, you hear him call “Father” with desperation and see him pray with such anguish that he sweats blood?

Imagine watching Jesus led away by guards and surrounded by a jeering mob. But left behind with you is, Malchus, a man you just saw had his ear cut off. But now, after Jesus touched him so gently, he is healed. Stunned to silence, what could you say?

Imagine the next day you're watching Jesus struggle with the crushing weight of his Cross. You hardly recognize him he is now so beaten, bruised and bloody. You are near when he falls, again facing you. You expect pain or fury in his face. But no. How do you possibly comprehend the fact that he is looking at you with indescribable tenderness?

We may place ourselves meditatively with Jesus all along the *Via Dolorosa* and on Calvary hill, be sorry that our sins nailed him to the Cross, but always ever thankful that he freely choose to sacrifice everything for the forgiveness of our sins and our eternal salvation. That's not imaginary.

THE PROMISE

Our Lord Jesus said, "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates throughout which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy."

— Saint Faustina, Diary, 699

WHY IS THIS PROMISE FROM JESUS SO WONDERFUL AND MERCIFUL?

TEMPORAL PUNISHMENT AND SUFFERING:

The Catholic Church teaches that sin has two consequences, or punishments. (CCC 1472). The first is eternal punishment in which the soul loses Heaven and is confined to an eternity in Hell. This punishment is remitted through the forgiveness of sins. The second is temporal punishment, in which a person must expiate, or make reparation for his sins. This temporal punishment remains even after sin is forgiven. This temporal punishment is known as Purgatory.

So, Jesus's amazing promise to St. Faustina amounts to offering all mankind the graces of a COMPLETE PARDON; an opportunity to have all temporal punishment, time in Purgatory, that which would be necessary before entrance into Heaven, completely removed!

THE DIVINE MERCY FEAST DAY

"I desire that there be a feast of mercy. I want this image, which you will paint

with a brush to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be known as the Feast of Mercy."

THE IMAGE

"I desire that this image be venerated throughout the world. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I promise victory over its enemies, already here on earth, and especially at the hour of death... I Myself will defend it as My own glory."

THE CHAPLET

"Pray unceasingly the Chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation."

THE CONVERSION PRAYER

"If you say this prayer, with a contrite heart and with faith, on behalf of some sinner, I will give that soul the grace of conversion:

'O Blood and Water that gushed forth from the heart of Jesus, as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.'

SPREAD OF THE DEVOTION

"Do whatever is within your power to spread devotion to My mercy. I will make up for what you lack."



In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

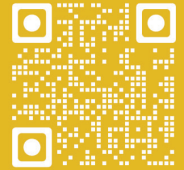

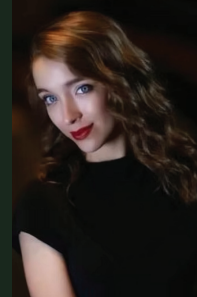

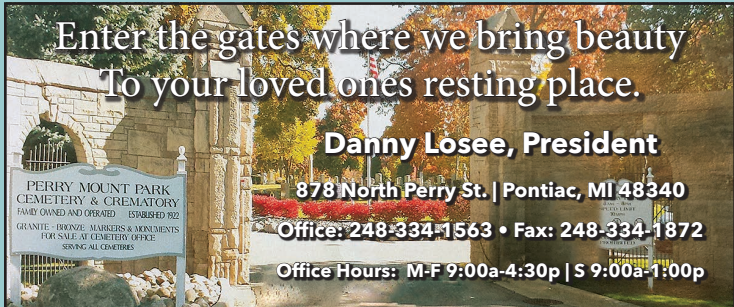
