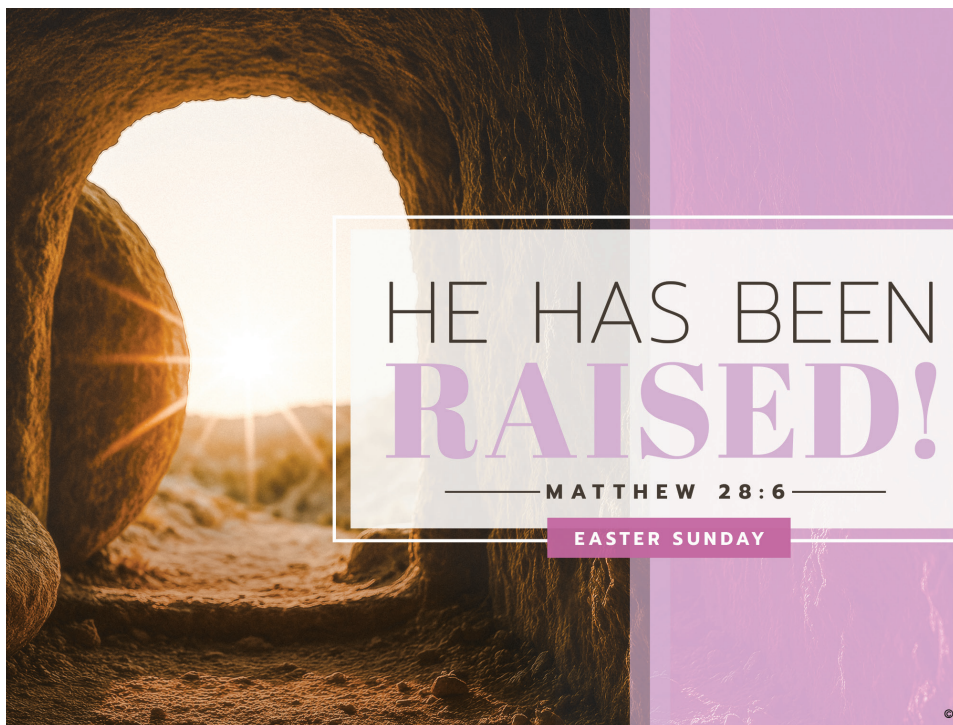

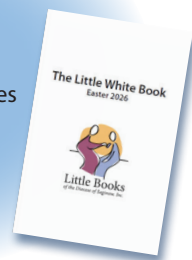

WALK WITH ONE

An ongoing initiative of the Eucharistic Revival invites each ONE of us to consider walking with another to bring them to, or back to, the Catholic Church and her sacraments. SomeONE in YOUR life is waiting (even if they don't know it yet) for a moment that will change everything, and God is ready to deliver through YOU! You might be asking yourself: Where do I start with inviting someONE to take a step closer to Jesus? How might I invite them forward in their faith?

WALK WITH ONE is a journey in which you are encouraged to pray with the Eucharist. What does that look like, exactly? When Jesus gives (and we receive) the Eucharist, there are four main actions—**TAKE, BLESS, BREAK, and GIVE**. So when you are at Mass, remember your ONE as you watch the priest, in persona Christi, consecrate the Eucharist—as he TAKES, BLESSes, BREAKs, and GIVES. Then pray with and begin the journey.

Any “walk” begins with one “step”. Take one!

STEP 1

TAKE: Identify someone in a spirit of humility:

ALWAYS begin with prayer and let God lead you to the ONE. TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word, and especially in the Eucharist. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct your prayer to your ONE and TAKE him or her into your heart, praying for your ONE by name.

STEP 2

BLESS: Intercede for your ONE in communion with the Holy Spirit:

Ask God to BLESS your ONE and YOU, to shower His love on your ONE and send him or her a sense of openness and peace, curiosity and excitement, removing any fear or other obstacle to receiving His love. And ask God to BLESS YOU with courage and direction.

STEP 3

BREAK: Connect in Eucharistic friendship:

Pray for God to BREAK open an opportunity to connect with your ONE; to BREAK open your ONE's heart to let Him in, and to BREAK open YOUR heart to step out of your “comfort zone”. Pray for a BREAK-through in your ONE so that God can work in him or her to attract and pour in His love and mercy.

STEP 4

GIVE: Invite that ONE on a path most suitable for him or her:

Lastly, be sure to GIVE of yourself—your time, a listening ear, an invitation. Ask the Holy Spirit what it is He wants you to GIVE to your ONE. GIVE attention by listening to where your ONE is on his or her faith journey—that is where you will start. Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you to an appropriate next step for your ONE, so you can GIVE an invitation to it. GIVE the gift of accompaniment, whatever that looks like. Just BE with your ONE—be a gift of yourself.

It only takes ONE to contact—Go Connect!

It only takes ONE hear—Go Listen!

It only takes ONE to see the need—Go Reach Out!

It only takes ONE to encounter—Go Invite!

ALLELUIA! HAPPY EASTER!

Today we celebrate the most wonderful fact: **Jesus Christ IS Risen from the Dead!** Our response to a traditional Paschal Greeting expresses our sure affirmation of this truth. To the declaration “**Christ is Risen,**” we respond “**Indeed, He is Risen!**” We know the Resurrection is true based on historical fact. You might read Carl Olson's book, “*Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead?*” for a logical analysis of objective evidence for, and well-reasoned dismissals of arguments against, the Resurrection.

First, Jesus truly died, as witnessed by soldiers, Pharisees and the women at the Cross (e.g., Matt 27:55). Christ gave up his Spirit (Matt 27: 50) and was completely drained of blood (John 19:33-34). Also, people back then knew rising from the dead *is* possible. They saw Jarius' daughter (Luke 8:40-42) and Lazarus raised (John 11:1-45). Even though Jesus said repeatedly he would rise in three days (e.g., Matt 16:21; Mark 9:31; Luke 9:22), the disciples struggled with doubt after the trauma of the Crucifixion, even given the evidence of the empty tomb (John 20:2-8). Yet credible eyewitness testimonies portray disciples encountering the Risen Christ. Jesus, his body glorified, walked through a locked door (John 20:19) and looked so different that the Apostles (John 21:4), Mary Magdalene (John 20:15) and the disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:16) did not recognize him at first. Paul, too, unsure at first who he met on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:5), later testified confidently, “*we know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him*” (Rom 6:9). A glorified body is no ghost. Doubting Thomas touched Jesus' real body, put his hand into his wounded side. Jesus ate fish (Luke 24:39-43)! Finally, the witness of the martyrs is powerful evidence against any notion that people made all this “stuff” up. Nobody chooses death for something they know to be false.

As we celebrate the Resurrection, the thousands in the Archdiocese who were baptized into Christ's Body, the Church, and the renewal of our baptismal vows, we hear Paul ask: “*Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead ... we too might live in newness of life. For if we have grown into union with [Jesus] through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection*” (Rom 6:3-5). **Alleluia!**

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE



Zander Price was the fastest kid at my grade school. He won every race on Field Day. To me, his swiftness meant he was the greatest. Zander was the best.

It's the same with the speediest Apostle on Easter morning. John tells us he "ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." (John 20:4) But only after Peter entered did John go in, see the burial cloths, and believe. Here is a symbol of two dimensions of the Church. John, the beloved disciple, represents the contemplative, mystical life: affection, prayer, intimacy. Peter, the rock, represents the Church's institutional life: steady, authoritative, structured...but slower.

Of course, John runs faster! Love is the heartbeat of Christian faith, so love will always arrive first. Peter's role is, in a sense, secondary. He arrives later, but is still very much needed. John waits for him. The Church must be built, balanced, protected, and led. Love without structure can vanish; structure without love becomes lifeless.

This dynamic is not just historical — it is personal. In you, there is a John who longs to run to the tomb in love. Let him run! Pray, sing, love Jesus. There is also a Peter, who eventually gets to the tomb and takes charge. The Risen Christ wants both. Remember: if you want to get to the mystery of Jesus' resurrection fast...love him, for love is best.

WHY DO CATHOLIC BLESS THEMSELVES AND THEIR HOMES WITH HOLY WATER?

During Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday celebration blessing of water takes place. Holy Water is one of the Church's many sacramentals. It reminds us of our Baptism, by which we are cleansed of sin, and made members of the Body of Christ.

Holy water is used also for the blessing of homes and family. Catholics bless themselves and their homes with holy water to recall their baptism, renew their baptismal promises, and signify a transition from the secular world into awareness of sacred presence of the Lord. This sacramental act, accompanied by the Sign of the Cross, serves as a

nurification, a reminder of being a child of God, and protection against evil.

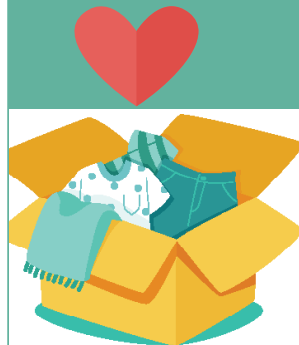

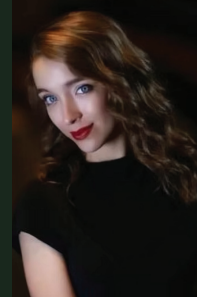

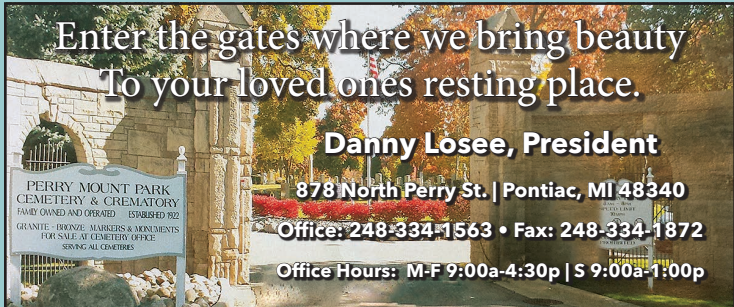
