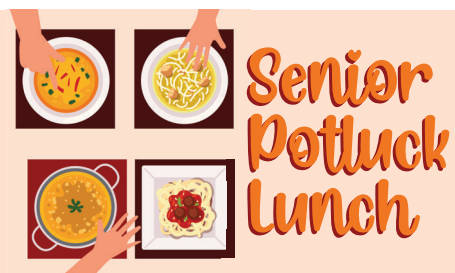

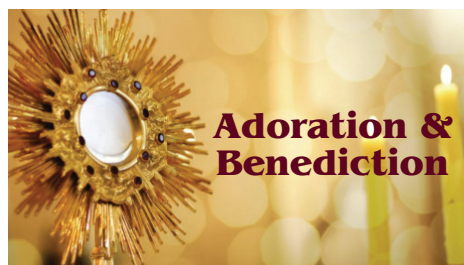

Manna, Distraction, and the Daily Bread We Need: We have been looking at distraction and if/how that affects our spiritual life. How to we recognize distraction when it crosses the line into spiritual warfare? **When it keeps us from prayer; ** When it leaves us too exhausted for worship; **When it fills our thoughts, so we no longer notice the poor, the lonely, or our own family; **When it steals the silence where God speaks. That is, in fact spiritual warfare! So What's the remedy?

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Easter (It is STILL Easter!) is an opportune time to walk with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Which STEP are you on with that ONE? Time to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE .

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Sign of Peace: [Even with such an irrepressible desire for peace], during the Synod of Bishops there was a discussion about the appropriateness of greater restraint in this gesture, which can be exaggerated and cause a certain distraction in the assembly just before the reception of Communion. It should be kept in mind that nothing is lost when the sign of peace is marked by a sobriety which preserves the proper spirit of the celebration, as, for example, when it is restricted to one's immediate neighbors.

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, enkindle in us the "irrepressible desire" for Your peace in our world that is so divided and conflicted. Help us to follow the direction of the Church as it leads us towards the One who "is our peace," and help us to keep this expression of peace appropriate and not exaggerated, so as to "preserve the proper spirit" and prevent distraction from the Eucharistic celebration to come. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to ME? Can I see how the Church, in this Sign of Peace in the liturgy, is leading us towards the One who "is our peace" and who is the only one who can bring us true peace? And can I see how exaggerating or expanding the gestures in the Sign of Peace might detract from the appropriateness of it, and especially detract from the Holy Communion with our Lord which follows in the order of the liturgy? I will be sure to "restrain" my gestures in this Sign of Peace so as to keep the "sobriety which preserves the proper spirit of the celebration."

Alleluia! Jesus is risen from the dead!

"Aslan is on the move!" In C.S. Lewis' first novel in the *Chronicles of Narnia*, **The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe**, this is how the children, Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy, first hear (figuratively) about Jesus. Lewis intended to present children delightful stories about good and evil in such a way that they would recognize as familiar a terrifyingly good Jesus when they later learn about him directly. Aslan is a Christ-figure, though it can be missed in Hollywood's version. Lewis hoped young readers might come to understand that Narnia, forever winter and never Christmas, ruled by the White Witch, represents the real, fallen world under the influence of Satan. Indeed, Edmund on his first encounter with the White Witch reacts as Adam and Eve had, taking food she offered, believing her lies, and turning from good. When the children hear the name "Aslan" and that "Aslan is on the move," they react intuitively as if "Alleluia! Jesus Christ is risen from the dead!" had just been proclaimed. Each is moved differently, as in a dream, feeling some enormous meaning "too lovely to put into words . . . so beautiful you remember it all your life." Although Edmund felt a sensation of mysterious horror, Peter felt brave and adventurous, Susan felt a delightful strain of music float over her, and Lucy felt as if she had just woken on the first day of Spring. The children were also excited to learn they would meet Aslan at the "Stone Table."

This is how we, even as adults who know the story maybe too well, should feel at Easter hearing that Our Lord is risen. We should always allow ourselves to be amazed, to revel in Easter Joy, to feel deeply the mystery of Mercy granted to us by Jesus out of sheer love. Today, the 8th day of Easter, is also Divine Mercy Sunday, acknowledging the image of Mercy flowing from the Sacred Heart of Jesus as revealed to St. Faustina. Today is not a memorial of St. Faustina but a celebration of Divine Mercy made possible by and from Jesus through his Passion, Death and Resurrection. That is "Aslan is on the move," inviting us to be awakened to a new Spring, to be attuned with thanksgiving to all the beauty of Creation, to go to Confession for Christ's merciful forgiveness of our sins, to approach the Altar Table and receive him in the Eucharist, and be blessed with Grace enough to be brave, eager to be on the move ourselves, as joyful missionary disciples.

Alleluia, Jesus is Risen from the dead!
