CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2026 (CSA)

The annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2026 is underway. This year's CSA theme comes from the Matthew Gospel 6:21: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be"

These words from our Lord are both tender and challenging, reminding us that our mission flows from our love for Christ. What we treasure, we share. Rooted in Him, we are called to proclaim the Gospel, accompany those who suffer, form disciples, and bring His light to southeast Michigan.

Each of us has been blessed with time, talents, and resources meant to be shared generously so others may encounter Christ's mercy, hope, and healing. Through faithful stewardship and the Catholic Services Appeal, more than one hundred ministries and programs continue to bring faith, charity, and support to countless individuals and families throughout southeast Michigan.

Our parish's CSA target assigned by Archdiocese of Detroit for 2026 is \$79,353. It is almost \$5000 more than last year. If we exceed our target, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parish tax free. This makes CSA a great opportunity to give additional gifts to support our parish.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Authentic Participation—The conciliar Constitution, Sacrosanct Concilium encouraged the faithful to take part in the eucharistic liturgy not "as strangers or silent spectators," but as participants "in the sacred action, conscious of what they are doing, actively and devoutly". This exhortation has lost none of its force.

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME** on this Day of Pentecost? Do I "participate" in the Mass? Do I ever feel like a "stranger" or am I a "silent spectator"? How can I better "participate in the sacred action"? Are my heart and mind "active" and "devout" as I pray? Sing? Listen? Come Holy Spirit as on the first Day of Pentecost, and make it so in me and all around me to give You the glory and honor You deserve!

Pentecost: Receiving the "Spirit of Truth"

Today we celebrate Pentecost, a great solemnity of the Church. Like the Incarnation at Christmas and the Resurrection at Easter, the Descent of the Holy Spirit is a pivotal event in Salvation History, a capstone to the Paschal Mystery. Pentecost is viewed as the 'birthday' of the Church because it was the first day the disciples, who'd been hiding in fear in the Upper Room, went out boldly to spread the Gospel, which is the mission of the Church. They fulfilled, and the Church continues to fulfill Jesus' Great Commission to "Go, make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:16-20) because they were "baptized with the Holy Spirit" and received the gifts of the Spirit Jesus promised.

Though earnestly anticipated, the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost was sudden and could hardly have been more dramatic: "There came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind [that] filled the entire house . . . there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them" (Acts 2:1-11). The gifts from the Father were effective immediately. The disciples "began to speak in different tongues," enabling them to proclaim the Truth of the Gospel in ways all could understand.

The Holy Spirit is a bit enigmatic, described in Scripture many ways besides wind and fire. When Jesus breathed on the Apostles to grant the authority to forgive sins, he said "receive the Holy Spirit" (John 20:22), using the same breath that had animated Adam (Gen 2:7). At his baptism, Jesus "saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove" (Matt 3:16). We know him as the Spirit of life, love and revelation. He is also called the Spirit of the promise and of adoption (CCC¶693). Jesus referred to him as Consoler and Advocate, but in calling him the **Spirit of Truth** (John 14:17; 15:26; 16:13; 1 John 4:6), Jesus describes power and gifts we certainly need in abundance today.

It is by the Spirit of Truth that we are guided to all Truth, to know Jesus who is Truth and to accept him as Lord. By the Spirit's gifts of wisdom, knowledge and understanding we may discern God's will for us, trust in him, and chose to act rightly in a world that far too often questions reality and denies truth. Pray for the Holy Spirit to grant us the courage to participate in the Church's mission, to embolden us to spread the Gospel by living our lives in truth and love.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDER- STANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.'" (John 20:22-23)



For those of us who go to confession regularly, there is often a familiar frustration: "Why do I keep confessing the same sins?" It can feel like a loop, cleansed but unchanged.

Pentecost reveals a hopeful perspective. When the Risen Jesus breathes on his ashamed and fearful disciples and gives them the Holy Spirit, he echoes Genesis, when God breathes life into Adam. This is not just primarily the removal of guilt, but new creation.

In confession, we receive more than forgiveness. We receive a fresh outpouring, the breath of the Spirit, and a renewed mission. Jesus does not say to us, "You're forgiven, now go back to your old life." He says, so to speak, **"As the Father has sent me, so I send you."** (John 20:21)

That is why penance is not just saying a few prayers. It is reorientation. It is the Spirit summoning us to live differently: with mercy and healing.

Just as Adam was sent into the world, and the Apostles were sent out after Pentecost, so too we are sent from the confessional — not just clean, but consecrated.

Pentecost Challenge: After your next confession, ask the Holy Spirit for one way you can participate in Christ's healing will for you. Then take one small, concrete step, and do not look back.

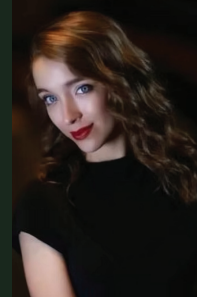

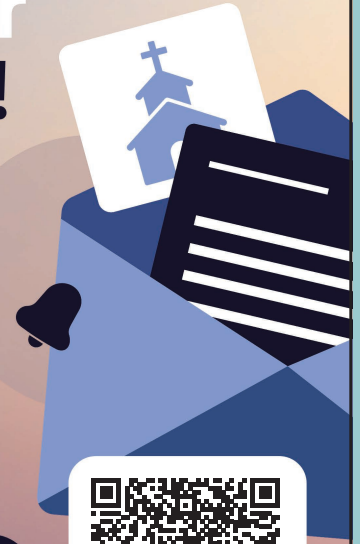
