Open our eyes to see and our hearts to hear how God speaks more clearly to us as the Eucharistic celebration is adapted appropriately for every culture where it is found, including our own. Come Holy Spirit to show us the way. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever attended a Mass celebrated in another culture than my own? Can I see how it is both consistent with the one I usually celebrate, yet is different and appropriate for the culture in which it is being celebrated? How amazing is it that I can attend Mass anywhere in the world, in any language, and in any culture, and yet still receive my LORD in the Eucharist and worship Him in the Mass, knowing that God is there in all these "concrete situations"? I will thank God for His holy and gracious provision.

God in America's Founding

You may have heard that "In God We Trust" was added to our currency and "under God" was added to the Pledge of Allegiance only in the 1950's in reaction to the Cold War. In fact, "In God We Trust" was first used in 1864 and our nation's dedication to God goes back to its very beginning. This weekend we celebrate the 250th anniversary of America's founding. The *Declaration of Independence* is more than a bold political statement. It is of great moment, with deep philosophical roots regarding God, authority, created human nature, and moral responsibility among nations. Consider the four mentions of God in the *Declaration* (some comments below are paraphrased from commentator Carolyn Kraft):

"... the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God"

This is an appeal to authority above any earthly king or parliament, claiming that God alone is the ultimate authority justifying the Founders' actions.

"All Men are created equal ... endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights"

This is the heart of the document. Our Rights come from God, not any man or government. Therefore, Rights cannot be taken away by man or government. This also recognized that we have autonomy outside of the state, not vested in a king's authority.

"... appealing to the Supreme Judge of the World for the Rectitude of our Intentions."

This declares the Signers believed they acted rightly and hold themselves to a higher judgement standard than a king's. This acknowledges objective morality, an accountability based on natural and rational law.

"with a firm Reliance on the Protection of divine Providence"

This part is a prayer. As a "deist," Thomas Jefferson did not believe a providential God intervened in creation, but all the Signers agreed Rights are "pre-political," existing in human nature before any government was formed. Even for citizens who may not be religious or believe in any God, the arguments hold. The Signers' declaration is not that God exists, but that our Rights exist independently of the state, grounded in human nature, which man did not invent.

From these founding principles, our young nation derived courage to fight for independence, wisdom to enshrine the Bill of Rights in our *Constitution*, and enough humility to devise a government that protects its citizens from our worst impulses.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

This weekend, our nation celebrates the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Unlike most nations, the United States was not founded primarily on a shared ethnicity, language, or culture. Instead, our founders built a political community out of diverse peoples united by a shared vision of liberty. That vision echoes something deep in the Christian mystery revealed in today's Gospel.

Jesus returns to his hometown. The people see only what is familiar: the carpenter, the son of Mary, one of their own. As Mark tells us, **"They took offense at him. Jesus said, 'A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house.'"** Their narrow vision blinds them. Jesus has come to inaugurate a new communion that transcends geography, bloodlines, and culture. He has come to unite all people in himself.

At its best, America's national unity reflects this possibility, which fully subsists only in the Catholic Church. Our unity is not based on ancestry or tribe, but on a shared commitment to higher ideals. For this reason, we can love our country with gratitude while situating patriotism within the broader horizon of faith.

Rooted in Christ, we are less vulnerable to the unholy tribalism that threatens civic life and faith. This weekend, let us thank God for our nation and pray that we also live as *citizens of Heaven in Jesus Christ*.

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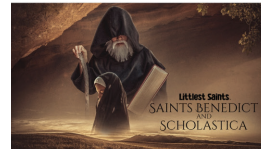
