LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an "active participation": In their consideration of the *actuosa participatio* of the faithful in the liturgy, the Synod Fathers also discussed the personal conditions required for fruitful participation on the part of individuals. One of these is certainly the spirit of constant conversion which must mark the lives of all the faithful. Active participation in the eucharistic liturgy can hardly be expected if one approaches it superficially, without an examination of his or her life. This inner disposition can be fostered, for example, by recollection and silence for at least a few moments before the beginning of the litany, by fasting, and when necessary, by sacramental confession.

Sacramentum Caritatis 55

PRAY: *Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, help us to seek "active participation" by maintaining a "spirit of constant conversion." Enkindle in me a desire, strength and persistence to attain an appropriate inner disposition as I prepare to attend Mass. Protect me from superficiality in this preparation. Amen!*

ASK & ACT: Do I approach Mass with the "spirit of constant conversion" or do I approach it "superficially," without an examination of my life? Do I examine my life before attending Mass? Do I arrive early to allow time for this? Am I careful to fast for a time, at least an hour, as part of my preparation? Or do I scoot into the pew at the last minute (or even late!!), still needing to get settled and ready to join in. I will be more intentional about preparing myself for Mass by examining my life, arriving early enough to pray before Mass begins, and perhaps even seeking the Sacrament of Reconciliation as part of that preparation. Lord, make it so in me.

We tend gardens at our home, hoping for lush flowers, fragrant herbs, and fresh tomatoes. But we suffer with poor soil. Dig a mere inch or two anywhere and we hit clumps of dense, unyielding clay. Many areas are choked with stones. We do our best, a little at a time, to remove all that and enrich the beds with topsoil and compost, aiming for healthy loam where well-watered seeds take root with vigor.

Today's readings use the beautiful metaphor of planting and tending crops to convey how we might respond to the truth, beauty and power of the Word of God. Isaiah (55:11) tells how God created a "fertile and fruitful" world by the Word "that goes forth from [his] mouth" to do his "will, achieving the end for which [he] sent it." That "end," God's will, is our eternal salvation accomplished by him through our participation in the life of Christ.

Today's Psalm (65:10-14) is a hymn of praise and thanksgiving for all God provides for a fruitful harvest: enriched land cleared of clods and softened with showers. Our response acknowledges that the "seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest" (Luke 8:8). In Jesus' parable of the Sower (Matt 13:1-23), the seed is the word of God, Christ is the Sower. But broadcast seed does not always land on "good ground." Where seed lands represents how we may respond to or be distracted from the Word of God.

We are called to be rich soil, receptive to the seed, eager to hear the "word of the kingdom." Jesus meant parables to help us understand "with our hearts" what he wants for us: conversion and healing, protection from the evil one, relief from anxiety. We enrich the figurative soil by listening attentively to readings at Mass and developing a habit of reading Scripture each day. We might remove clay and stones through *lectio divina*, the practice of reading the Bible in prayerful conversation with God, learning to hear him speaking to us personally. We may join a Bible study with others in the parish.

Unleash the Gospel reminds us that "since all Scripture speaks of Christ, immersing ourselves in the Word is a way to deepen our initial encounter and grow in our relationship with him." By reading and praying with Scripture, a little each day, we help the Word, Jesus himself, take root in our hearts with vigor, enriching our lives, and bearing multi-fold yields of beautiful spiritual fruit.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS THE GARDENER AND THE SOIL

I began writing this piece by googling "how do you make soil fertile?" which should tell you everything you need to know about my own abilities as a gardener.

I remember seeing a packet of seeds in the store one summer as a child and convincing my mother to buy them. They were delphiniums, which bloom into a beautiful cone shape if you know what you're doing. Alas, I didn't. I chose for my garden a particularly dry spot of earth right next to my backyard playset, scattered the seeds, congratulated myself, and went on my merry way. I returned occasionally to water the area, but only when I remembered to.

Nothing grew, not even a little sprout. I was more than heartbroken — my faith was shaken. I had planted these seeds! I had watered them! (A little.) There was sunlight! All my childhood books and rhymes said this was all you needed. Was it all a lie?

Of course it wasn't a lie. Seeds need soil, sunlight, water, and oxygen — good soil, adequate sunlight for whatever the plant is, and consistent water. So what seeds need more than anything is a gardener. (At least, delphiniums do.)

When I hear the parable of the rich soil and the rocky ground in the Gospel of Matthew, I often miss the point. I think Jesus is trying to give me a message about how I should be. "Be better." That's what I think he's telling me.

I forget that I am only the soil. I cannot enrich myself; all my efforts to do so will come to nothing. What he is telling me is to ask the gardener: "Make me what I need to be." ©LPi

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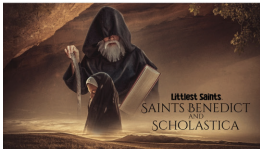

OUR FIVE UNBORN CHILDREN OF GOD

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self-serve storage locker, were said to be 5 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

"It was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place of the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

"Through the courtesy of A. J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."

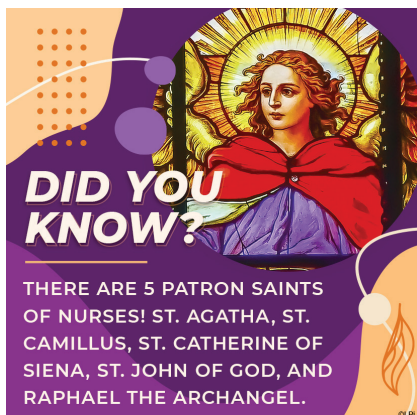

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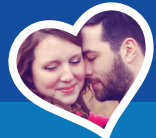


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
