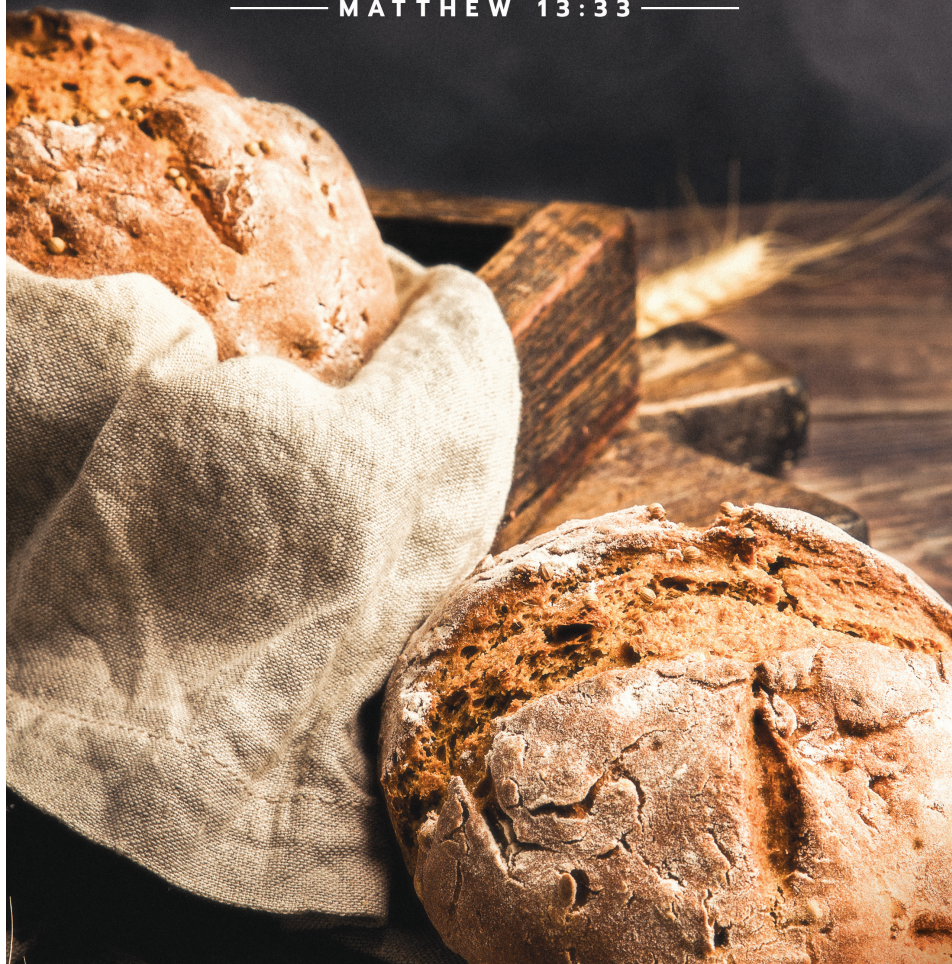

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an "active participation":

This inner disposition [not approaching the eucharistic liturgy superficially] can be fostered, for example, by recollection and silence for at least a few moments before the beginning of the liturgy, by fasting, and when necessary, by sacramental confession. A heart reconciled to God makes genuine participation possible. The faithful need to be reminded that there can be no *actuosa participatio* in the sacred mysteries without an accompanying effort to participate actively in the life of the Church as a whole, including a missionary commitment to bring Christ's love into the life of society

Sacramentum Caritatis 55

PRAY: *Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, help us to seek "active participation" by reconciling with You, if necessary, before we go. Give us a desire to reconcile our hearts to You, making "genuine participation" in the Mass possible. Enkindle in me a desire, strength and persistence to attain an appropriate inner disposition as I prepare to attend Mass, and the desire to commit to "bringing Christ's love into the life of society." Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I examine my life before attending Mass, perhaps seeking the Sacrament of Reconciliation if needed? Do I arrive early to allow time for reflection on my life? Am I careful to fast for a time, at least an hour, as part of my preparation? Or do I scoot into the pew at the last minute (or even late!), still needing to get settled? Do I "participate actively" in the life of the Church as a whole as a committed missionary? I will be more intentional about preparing myself for Mass by examining my life, and arriving early enough to pray before Mass begins. I will pray for the desire and will to be more intentional about bringing "Christ's love into the life" in which I live. Lord, make it so in me.

Divine Providence

During this 250th anniversary of our nation's founding, it is worth recalling how **Divine Providence** was invoked often at that time, in the **Declaration of Independence**, the **Treaty of Paris** (1783), and the words of George Washington and other Founders. They believed God oversaw their efforts toward liberty. There is no doubt which God they meant for the **Treaty of Paris** begins: **"In the Name of the most Holy & undivided Trinity"!**

From Latin **providentia** for "foresight" or to "look ahead," when capitalized "Providence" means God, the beneficent caretaker of creation. For America's Founders, Providence represented their trust that their actions were right and just in God's eyes, and their firm will that they and their posterity keep that in mind and always act accordingly.

In the Catholic understanding, too, Providence means the **"dispositions by which God guides his creation toward its perfection yet to be attained; the protection and governance of God over all creation"** (CCC ¶ 302ff). All creation is a work in progress, and we are on a journey toward that for which God created us, the Beatific Vision, **"an ultimate perfection yet to be attained."**

The Church teaches Scripture witnesses to God's attentive care and protective concern for our ultimate well-being. This may easily escape our awareness in the midst of daily concerns, ills and plans. **"Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will be established"** (Proverbs 19:21). The Catechism reminds us God is master of his plan and he invites us to know and participate in it (¶1306). Out of infinite love and goodness, God grants us not only our existence but also the dignity of freedom to act, entrusting us with responsibilities to co-operate in accomplishing God's plan. **"Even though we may be unconscious collaborators with God's will, we can enter deliberately into the divine plan by our actions, prayers and sufferings as God's co-workers for his kingdom"** (¶1307).

America is not perfect. We see how the Founders' understood that in **The Great Seal of the United States** on the back of the one-dollar bill. God's Eye sits atop an **unfinished** pyramid, a **"perfection yet to be attained."** The Founders knew the success of the "American experiment" in self-governance requires a religious, moral people who rely constantly on God's Divine Providence.

1st Reading Question

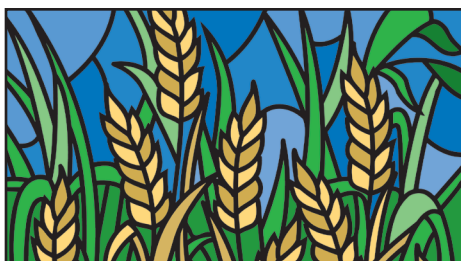
Wisdom speaks of God's power in terms of kindness, leniency, and mercy. What words would you use to describe God?

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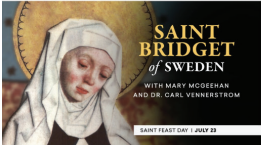

OUR FIVE UNBORN CHILDREN OF GOD

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self-serve storage locker, were said to be 5 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

"It was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place of the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

"Through the courtesy of A. J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."

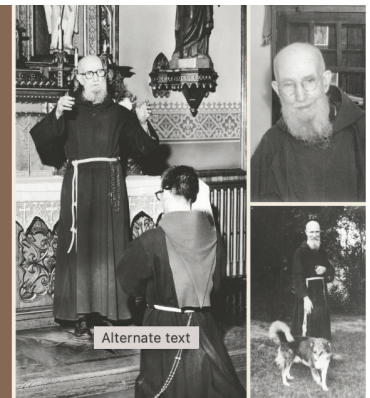

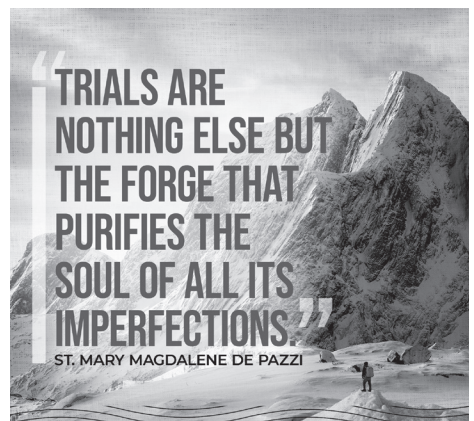
