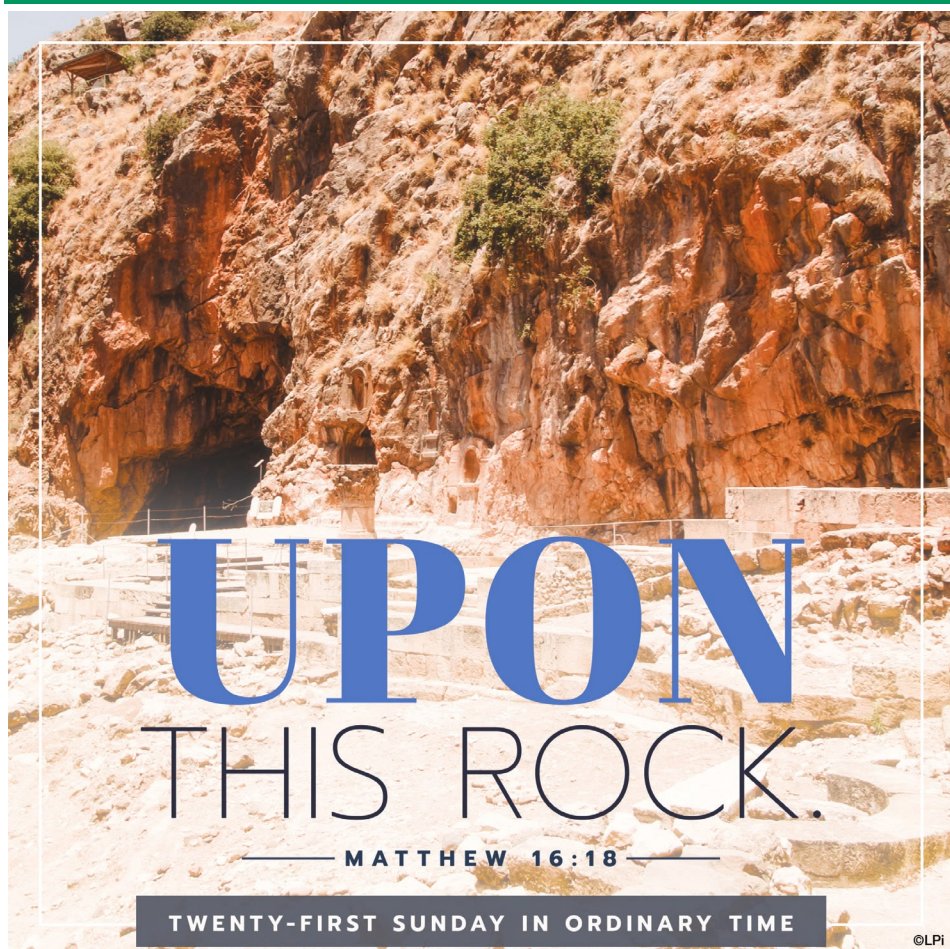

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the **kerygma** (kuh-rig-muh) with others. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News: Seven (7)) Practical steps: **1. Start with Prayer**—Pray for your ONE; ask the Holy Spirit to guide your conversations and to open their hearts to the message of the Gospel. Consider asking your ONE to pray with you. This invites God into the conversation, but also models a life of faith and trust in God; **2. Build a connection**; **3. Share your experience**; **4. Use clear, simple language**; **5. Introduce to community**; **6. Encourage participation**; **7. Be patient yet persistent.**

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an "active participation":...

Yet if remains true that, for the sake of their eternal salvation, individual non-Catholic Christians can be admitted to the Eucharist, the sacrament of Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick. But this is possible only in specific, exceptional situations and requires that certain precisely defined conditions be met. These are clearly indicated in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (174) and in its *Compendium* (175). Everyone is obliged to observe these norms faithfully.

PRAY: Throughout the week... Come Holy Spirit, create in me, and all those who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior, the desire to be one with each other as we are one in Christ in seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, so that we may all participate fully in the Holy Eucharist. Until that day, may we pray for understanding of and respect for this most holy and central teaching of the Church, and hope for the day when all disciples will be united in this belief. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever encountered, or do I know someone who wants to take Communion in the Catholic Church but is not "allowed"? Do I know how to answer them, or do I, myself, even consider this "unfair"? I will investigate further or talk to a priest or deacon who will help me to better understand this important teaching of the Church, so I can better pray for and explain to myself and others. And I will pray for the day when all Christians will be united in this belief, and will be able to receive the Eucharist with a united, "Amen!"

"Curiouser and Curiouser" by John Hannigan

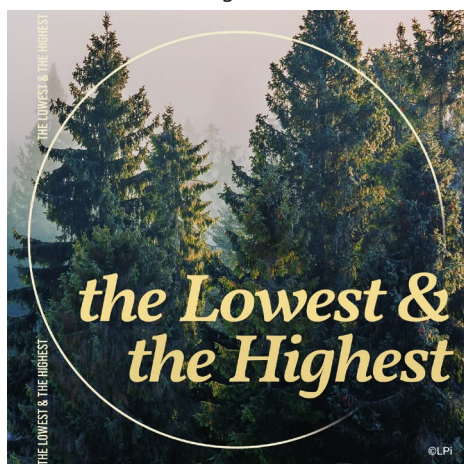
On a recent long drive we enjoyed an audio book of *Alice in Wonderland* which we'd not read in decades. In Lewis Carroll's 1865 novel, inquisitive Alice is much more thoughtful than in the quaint 1951 Disney musical cartoon and nothing at all like the sword-wielding warrior in the 2010 Johnny Depp movie. Rather, the original Alice is a delightfully curious young girl, wondering at all the strange things and persons she meets. Wide-eyed, she muses about the *meaning* of her weird experiences after following the White Rabbit. Today, the phrases "follow the white rabbit" and going "down the rabbit hole" have come to mean going deeply into some path of discovery. Outside of fanciful "Wonderland," anybody can be confused by the apparent absurdity and nonsense of much of what happens in "real" life. One *should* wonder what is real and what matters most. One ought to strive to make sense of things, just like Alice.

Curiosity is a fundamental human quality. Wonder is a great gift that combines curiosity with the awe we experience before the beauty and mystery revealed in Creation and in our own Nature. Alice embodies this as she seeks to discover who she is. She talks to herself, questions the people and creatures she meets, and examines her thoughts. She asks probing questions like: "Am I the same person I was when I woke up this morning?" and "How am I to get where I am going?"

All of us wonder about things like this to some degree. Are you or someone you know asking themselves, "Where am I going?" or "How can I be really happy?" Or even "Who am I?" and "What's the meaning of it all?" Ultimate answers are to be found in Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Some of the greatest wonders and mysteries in all Creation are found in the Catholic Church. "Falling down the rabbit hole" of personal discovery may just mean delving deeply into an exploration of Catholicism.

Are you or someone you know curious to learn more? Maybe wondering about joining the Church? It's not following a White Rabbit but, like Alice, thoughtful conversations and asking questions is a good start. So, you and someone you know who may also be wondering, are invited to be curious, to take a step toward discovering the beauty and mystery of the Faith through conversation and questioning. GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The first time I stood inside St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, its majesty overwhelmed me. The sheer beauty of Michelangelo's dome seemed to lift my soul right out of my body. Later, I joined the Scavi tour that winds below the basilica, down into the ancient pagan cemetery where Peter was buried. There, in the dim light and narrow passageways, I found myself looking at the bones of a murdered Jewish fisherman, his feet cut off so his crucified body could be taken down more easily.

What a paradox. Above me, the most glorious church ever built. Beneath me, the remains of a backwater fisherman. But this man dared to answer Jesus' question, "**Who do you say that I am?**" And crowning that immense dome above his tomb are the words from today's Gospel, "**You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.**"

Within you and me is the drama of the lowest and the highest. Every time we confess Christ, humbly, imperfectly, maybe even trembling, we enter that same mystery. The dust of our humanity, touched by the splendor of heaven. God's presence and our dry bones together. Humility and glory. May our lives embrace both the lowest and the highest, like that great basilica, as we profess Jesus.

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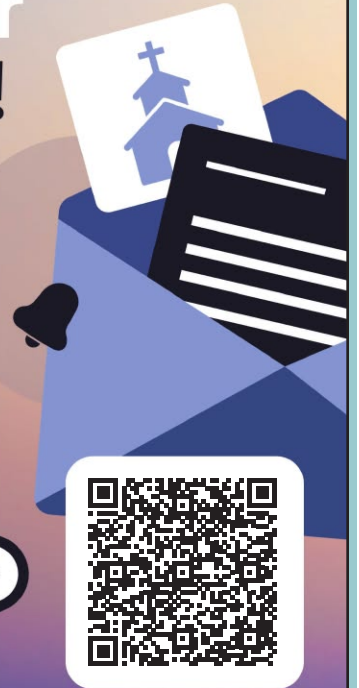
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
