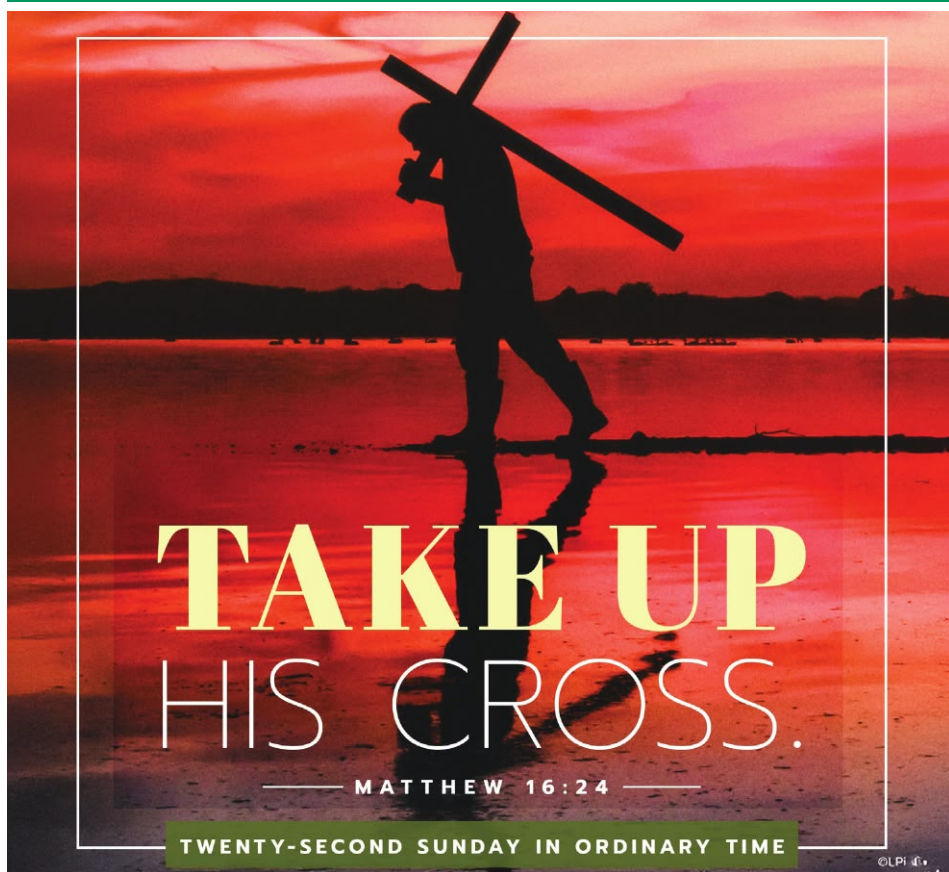

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the **kerygma** (kuh-rig-muh) with others. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News: Seven (7)) Practical steps: 1. Start with Prayer 2. **Build a connection:** Evangelization begins with relationship, finding out where my ONE is coming from—listen to his story. I'm not trying to "fix" him or his beliefs, but looking for what we have in common. I can't take someone to higher ground until we've found common ground—that builds trust; 3. Share your experience; 4. Use clear, simple language; 5. Introduce to community; 6. Encourage participation; 7. Be patient yet persistent. Ready for Step 3? . . .

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Participation through the communications media: Thanks to the remarkable development of the communications media, the word "participation" has taken on a broader meaning in recent decades. We all gladly acknowledge that the media have also opened up new possibilities for the celebration of the Eucharist. This requires a specific preparation and a keen sense of responsibility on the part of pastoral workers in the sector. When Mass is broadcast on television, it inevitably tends to set an example. Particular care should therefore be taken to ensure that, in addition to taking place in suitable and well-appointed locations, the celebration respects the liturgical norms in force.

PRAY: Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, as we consider how we individuals participate in your Holy Mass, may we give you thanks and praise for opening an avenue of worship that enables those who cannot attend Mass in person, can participate in a different but wonderful way. But as we are thankful, give us "a keen sense of responsibility" to assure that the location and liturgical norms are met with respect during the broadcast celebration. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever attended Mass by watching on one of the newer communications media? Have I given the celebration the same respect as I would if attending Mass in person? Or have I been more distracted by what might going on around me? Did the "pastoral workers" involved in the presentation give the care necessary to "ensure that the "location and liturgical norms" were respected during the celebration? I will be sure to pay attention if or when I participate in this way again, that I am fully engaged and attentive, participating fully in the entire beauty of the Mass celebrated on the media platform. "Amen!"

Opportunities for the New School Year

For decades, teaching was a substantial part of my career. Now I am now retired yet each year as summer wanes and that first cool afternoon arrives, I still find myself thinking about the school year ahead and preparations for classes.

I don't miss grading exams or the occasional annoying student. I do miss those students who were well disciplined and eager to get more out of their effort than an "A." My habit of preparing for a new school year is deeply engrained.

September is a wonderful time for new beginnings for families with children. Parents and grandparents seek to reset priorities (and bedtimes). Kids are preparing in their own ways to meet new teachers and classmates, find their way around new schools, and learn more difficult lessons. Beside the studies, extracurricular activities are also starting anew with children getting into the swing of things with soccer practice, gymnastics, piano lessons, and more.

Parishes are restarting programs for people of all ages. Families who may have been away on vacation are back into the habit of participating together in Mass every weekend at their own parish. Faith formation classes for children, youth groups for teens, and Bible studies for women and men start soon. Courses (often for free) are offered by Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit or at host parishes in Oakland county. I get to keep active in teaching by guiding people who are exploring becoming Catholic in the *Order of Christian Initiation of Adults*. OCIA, which is also for baptized Catholics who were not Confirmed, begins Tuesday September 22nd. Call the parish or me for information about OCIA - 248-703-9148.

There are also many "extracurricular activities" in the parishes you might consider. For example, you can become more involved in Liturgies by serving as a Lector or an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist. Maybe this Fall is when you'll finally join the Choir! The Knights of Columbus and the St. Vincent de Paul Conference are always ready to welcome new members aiming to serve others.

Yes, September is a harbinger of Fall and school, and of opportunities to study, learn, serve and grow in your Faith. What will you do new this Fall? What will you put effort into and realize the reward?

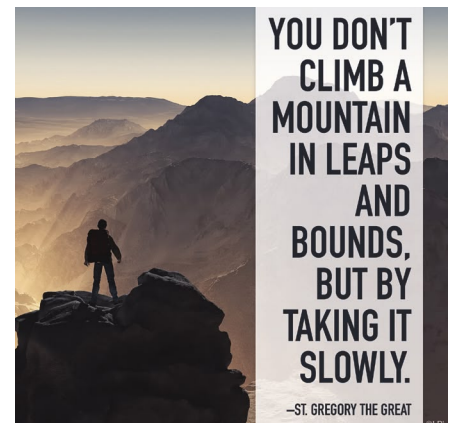

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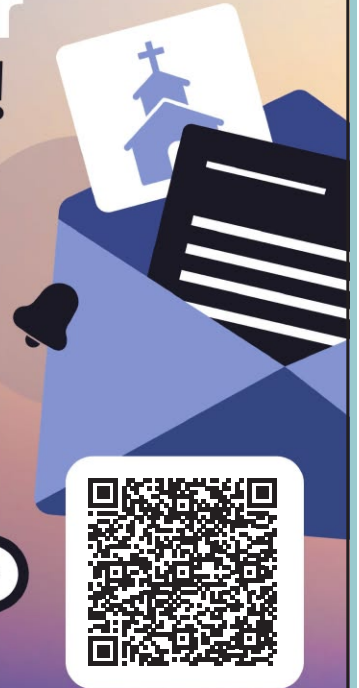
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
