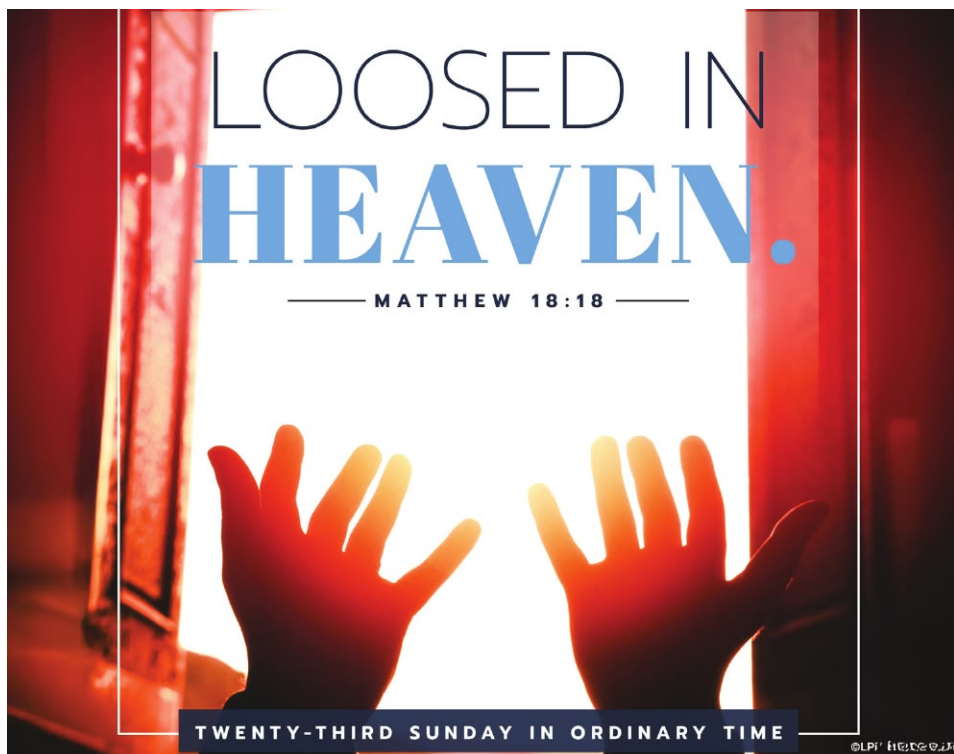

Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News: Seven (7)) Practical steps: 1. Start with Prayer; 2. Build a connection 3; **Share your experience:** How has your faith impacted our life? How have the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, deepened your relationship with Jesus? How has God worked in your life in tangible ways—give examples? Be open and vulnerable about your own journey.; 4. Use clear, simple language; 5. Introduce to community; 6. Encourage participation; 7. Be patient yet persistent. Ready for Step 4? . . .

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Participation through the communications media:

With regard to the value of taking part in Mass via the communications media, those who hear or view these broadcasts should be aware that, under normal circumstances, they do not fulfill the obligation of attending Mass. Visual images can represent reality, but they do not actually reproduce it. While it is most praiseworthy that the elderly and the sick participate in Sunday Mass through radio and television, the same cannot be said of those who think that such broadcasts dispense them from going to church and sharing in the eucharistic assembly in the living Church.

PRAY: Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, as we consider how we individuals participate in your Holy Mass, may we give you thanks and praise for opening an avenue of worship that enables those who cannot attend Mass in person, can participate in a different but wonderful way. But as we are thankful, give us "a keen sense of responsibility" that "under normal circumstances, they do not fulfill the obligation of attending Mass." Enlarge our hearts to be desire and "go to church and share in the eucharistic assembly in the living Church." Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to ME? Have I ever attended Mass by watching on one of the newer communications media? Has it been when, for some reason, I was unable to attend, or have I done it when it was only a matter of convenience? Can I see why my living presence is required "under normal circumstances" in order to participate in "the living Church"? I will be attentive to be sure I use the available media Mass attendance only when it is out of necessity. "Amen!"

Tolerate, Judge, or Admonish?

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to point out our brother's sins: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault" (Matt 18:15-20), seemingly at odds with "Stop judging, that you may not be judged" (Matt 7:1-5). This passage is often quoted as a lesson in the virtues of "tolerance" and "niceness." "Judge not lest ye be judged" is used to quash criticism of immoral behavior. The world tells us it is intolerant and hateful to speak out against sin, for "love is love" and telling someone it is wrong to act and choose against God's Law is "not nice."

"Tolerance" and "niceness" are not virtues in the Catechism. Rather, it teaches we have an obligation out of Love, the highest virtue, to point out the sins of our brothers: "Charity demands . . . fraternal correction" (CCC ¶ 1829). Scripture teaches us to "admonish" one another (e.g., Rom 15:14; Col 3:16; 1Thess 5:14; 2Thess 3:13-15). This does not mean to criticize or "throw stones." "Admonish" means "to remind, encourage, or warn." Remember, "admonish the sinner" is a Spiritual Act of Mercy. It is a loving kindness to help "others find their way and correct their mistakes." The obligation "to guide others towards the path of salvation" is not a license to condemn anyone at any time in any way. Neither is "judge not" an absolute prohibition. Scripture teaches us **how** fraternal correction should be done.

First, Jesus warns against hypocrisy. Since we all sin, "as you judge, so will you be judged . . . Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite, remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye" (Matt 7:1-5). Jesus said "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone" (John 8:7). Then know the truth, "that every fact may be established," not "judging by appearances, but justly" (John 7:24). Also, we "should correct . . . in a gentle spirit" (Gal 6:1) and keep a brother's "fault between you and him alone" (Matt 18:15), private and personal. There may be a time when a fault should be told to "the Church" (Matt 18:17), but unnecessarily revealing a person's faults can be the sin of detraction. Finally, when we are admonished by our friends, we must "respect" and "show esteem for them with love" (1Thess 5:12-14).

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A few summers ago, my family had a big reunion. It included my parents, my four siblings, and all their many children. One of my favorite moments was simply watching my parents' contented faces as they took in all of us together, laughing, sharing food, singing, telling stories. They loved seeing their children happily together with each other.

That is something like the heart of God we see in today's Gospel message about Christian reconciliation. These verses come right after Jesus' parable of the lost sheep. He is not giving the disciples a cold formula for dealing with conflict. He is revealing the Father's longing for children who love and reconcile with each other. His heart aches when his children are divided and isolated.

So when Jesus says, "Go and tell your brother his fault," He is not deputizing us as morality police. He is inviting us into his mission of reconciliation. When he adds, "If he listens to you, you have won over your brother," we glimpse the real goal. Not winning arguments, but reuniting a divided family.

These days, we often think religion is just between God and me. But the Father's dream is about a lively family, one in which His children forgive, gather, and rejoice together.

Lord Jesus, give me the courage to seek reconciliation where it is needed. Make my heart resemble the Father's heart, longing and working for unity among His children. Amen.

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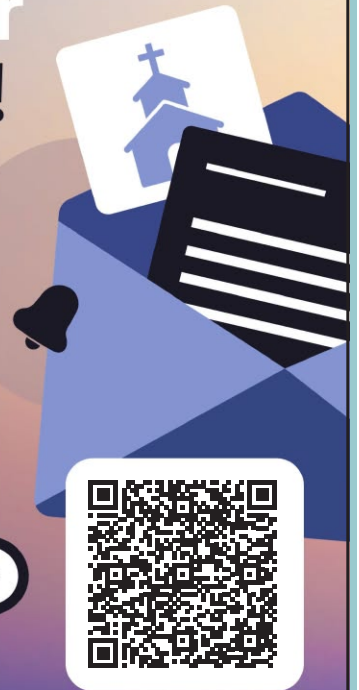
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
