Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the kerygma (kuh-rig-muh) with others. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News using seven (7)) practical steps: **1. Start with Prayer; 2. Build a connection; 3. Share your experience; 4. Use clear, simple language:** The kerygma is a simple message at its core—"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16). Focus on making the message accessible, avoiding complex theological language. It doesn't dilute it, but makes it so it can best be received in a person's heart. 5. Introduce to community; 6. Encourage participation; 7. Be patient yet persistent. Ready for Step 5? . . .

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Active participation by the sick: In thinking of those who cannot attend places of worship for reasons of health or advanced age, I wish to call the attention of the whole Church community to the pastoral importance of providing spiritual assistance to the sick, both those living at home and those in hospital. Their situation was often mentioned during the Synod of Bishops. These brothers and sisters of ours should have the opportunity to receive sacramental communion frequently. In this way they can strengthen their relationship with Christ, crucified and risen, and feel fully involved in the Church's life and mission by the offering of their sufferings in union with our Lord's sacrifice.

PRAY: Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, Give us hearts aflame for the sick and aged who "cannot attend the Mass at places of worship." Enlighten our hearts and minds to think of and to provide for ways for them to "receive sacramental communion frequently." Strengthen their relationship with Christ, and draw them fully into Church life and mission by "offering their sufferings in union with our Lord's sacrifice." Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I know anyone who cannot attend Mass at a church because of health or advanced age? Have I ever considered either arranging for them to receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist (by calling the office) or even taking it to them myself? Have I considered taking Communion to a nursing home or other group home? How would I do that? I will ask the office or someone who would know at Sacred Heart what is involved in doing that myself, and consider serving my brothers and sisters in that way, quite literally being the hands and feet of Jesus to them.

Seventy-Seven Times

by John Hannigan

In last week's Gospel Jesus taught how, out of loving kindness, we should approach a brother who sins against us, after carefully discerning the truth of the matter, and "tell him his fault" (Matt 18:15-20). "Charity demands fraternal correction" (CCC ¶1829) and invites us, shunning hypocrisy, to gently admonish one another as a Spiritual Act of Mercy. The lesson this week continues with the very next verse in Matthew's Gospel (18:21-35), and is even more important. We are required to forgive others generously, graciously, and repeatedly.

Peter asks Jesus, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Peter is being very magnanimous. Since the expectation in first-century Israel was to forgive three times, his offer to forgive more than twice that much was noble. Peter was likely shocked when Jesus said: "... not seven times but seventy-seven times." Some translations say "seventy times seven times." Jesus says we are to forgive 23 to 163 times more than anyone might expect. Translation: **forgive always.**

Jesus drives home this message with the powerful parable of the unforgiving servant. The king forgives a debtor "who owed him a huge amount." Modern translations cannot convey how "huge" a debt it was. He owed "ten thousand talents," each a weight of silver worth about 20 years wages for a day-laborer. "He had no way of paying it back" even if he, "along with his wife, his children, and all his property," was sold. Even so, the king granted the servant's plea for Mercy and forgave the entire debt. The man owed him nothing. Translation: **forgive everything.**

The second lesson dealt with the servant's pitiless refusal to forgive a mere pittance owed by another. We are called to follow the example of our king, of Jesus, who forgives every sin by his sacrifice. In the words of today's Psalm, "The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion." And our being forgiven is contingent upon our forgiving others. It is the only prerequisite for God's Mercy, as we pray in the words Jesus gave us: "Our Father . . . forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Translation: **forgive, even seventy times seven times, because our eternal lives depend on it.**

Archdiocesan Restructuring

AOD Restructuring Update

We are in the refinement stage of our archdiocesan restructuring process. We want to share several important updates about the continuing work

- **Feedback Analysis:** Over 40,000 parishioners participated in providing restructuring feedback. All feedback from listening sessions, surveys, emails, and calls is currently being reviewed and analyzed.
- **Model Refinement and Review:** This fall, the restructuring team—supported by priests, deacons, lay ministers, and parish staff—will refine draft models based on all the received input.
- **Decision Timeline:** Refined models will be shared with leaders and posted online for transparency later this Fall. Final models will be presented to Archbishop Weisenberger for his discernment and approval.
- **Effective Dates:** The final approved models will be announced the weekend of **April 17th–18th, 2027**, and will go into effect on **July 1st, 2027**.

This waiting period can be difficult. It is a time for **prayerful support** of the restructuring team and continued support of the work and activities of our parish. Parishioners are encouraged to stay connected through the official resources at restructuring.aod.org.

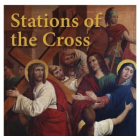
